

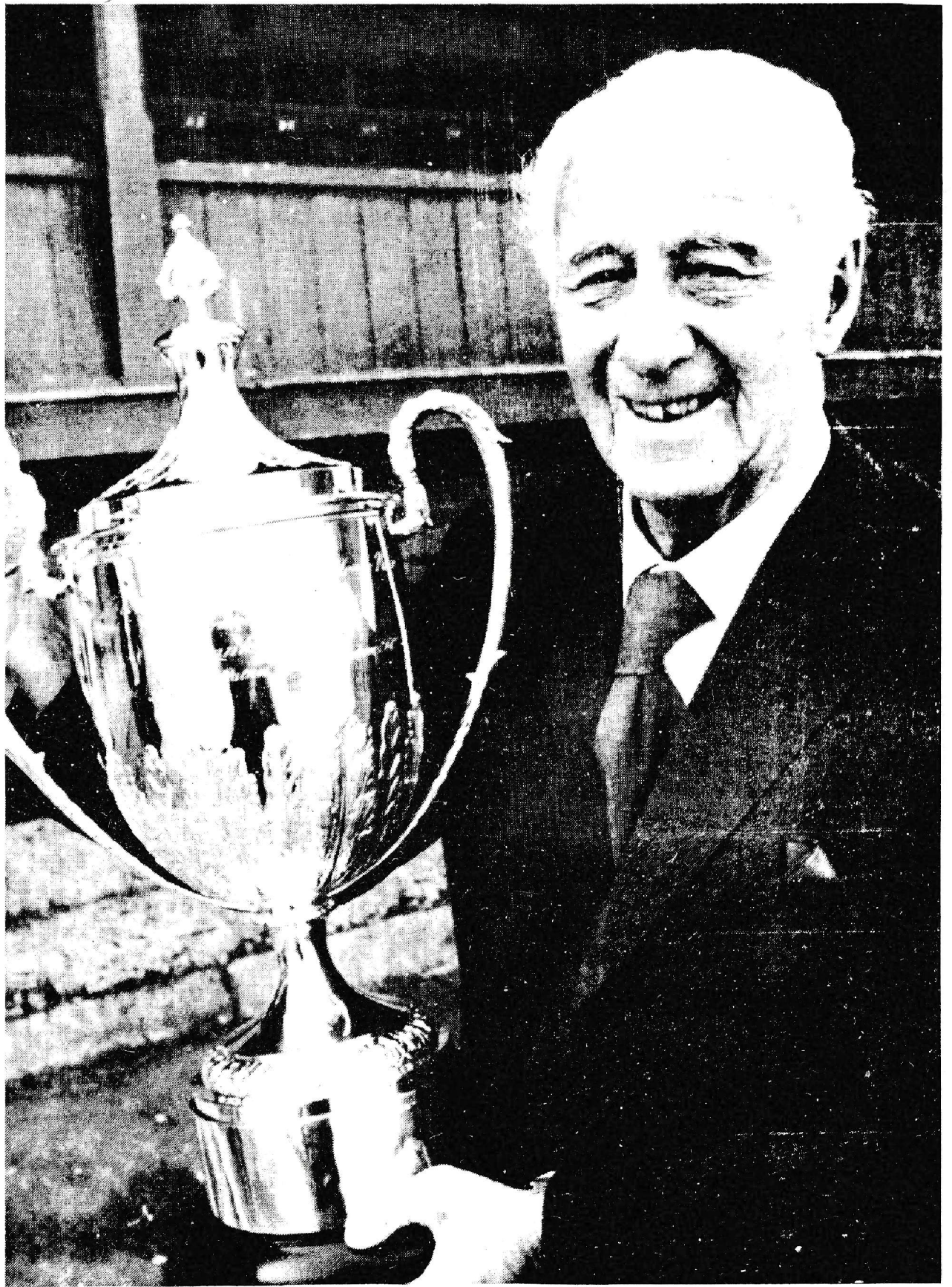

CHALLENGE VASE - THE FIRST SEASON

In anticipation of the abolition of amateur status, the Amateur Challenge Cup was contested for the final time in Season 1973/74. To say it has been replaced by the Challenge Vase is true to a certain extent, but one important fact must be borne in mind. The Challenge Trophy and Vase Competitions now pay no attention to a player's status - whether he be paid or not. About a hundred of the leading clubs formerly entering the Amateur Cup have this season, for the first time, competed in the Trophy and, indeed, a few professional clubs have played in the Vase Competition. The only criteria to be considered when allocating a Club to either Trophy or Vase are a Club's playing record and general facilities, with those rated highest playing in the Trophy, while the remainder enter the Vase. It can be seen that most Vase Clubs have far more chance of success in this new Competition than ever they had in the Amateur Cup.

Naturally, the Football Association had to find a Vase and the Council was most grateful to MR. FRANK ADAMS, a Life Vice-President of the F.A., for his generous offer to donate a trophy. Mr. Adams seen opposite, holding the Vase, was elected to the Football Association in 1947 and has served on many Committees, including the International and Challenge Cup. In a distinguished playing career with Wycombe Wanderers, which was interrupted by the First World War, Mr. Adams won honours with Club - he was Captain for five years - and County, and also went on overseas tours with Middlesex Wanderers. 1944 saw him, as Secretary of the Combined Services Committee, promoting football all over Europe as a boost to the morale of the troops.

Mr. Adams has continued to give unsparingly of his time and energy as an administrator and Wycombe Wanderers made him Patron after his purchase of the freehold of Loakes Park.

Mr. Adams' generosity has ensured that whichever team is victorious on April 19th, their Captain will carry off a trophy they will be loathe to return without a fierce struggle.

We would like to welcome the players, supporters and officials of Epsom and Ewell Football Club on the occasion of this second leg of the F.A. Vase Semi-Final. Last Saturday in front of a crowd of 1700, Epsom's best for over 10 years, we produced some fine football and were very unlucky not to be more than one goal ahead at half time, Alan Russell being the Daniels scorer. However, it was a different story after the interval. A much improved performance by Epsom coupled with the terrible playing conditions enabled them to bring a first leg lead to Wothorpe Road today, with goals coming from Trevor Lee and Phil Walker. Well, that match is now history and all eyes are on today's encounter which will lead to a Wembley final appearance against Friar Lane Old Boys or Hoddesdon on April 19th.

Although Epsom have only the slenderest of first-leg leads it would be an injustice to them to take their challenge lightly. Their recent record of success is very impressive. Last season Epsom were winners of the Surrey Senior League Cup and runners up in the Senior League. This season they have lost only one match in a league programme which, like the Daniels, has been greatly affected by Cup matches. In total they have played 32 league and cup matches this season, registering only 4 defeats and one draw, and scoring 107 goals while conceding only 27. A formidable record.

Their team blends experience with youth. They are led by player-manager Pat O'Connell who on many occasions during his 16 years at Fulham played alongside former England Captain Johnny Haynes in the First Division. Centre-half Dave Worby was a member of Walton and Hersham's Amateur Cup Final squad of 1973 (the fore-runner of this competition). Twenty-year old Tommy Tuite is leading goalscorer with 39 goals, followed by John Eales (20 goals) and Trevor Lee with 15, including one against Stamford last week. All three have attracted league scouts as has Phil Walker who netted the winner for Epsom in the first leg.

In conclusion I would like to point out that the Daniels Social Club will open early today - at 5pm. Everybody is welcome - it is only a few minutes walk from the ground (17 All Saints Street) and well worth a visit. For those who may be making their first visit to Stamford, any Daniels supporter will only be too pleased to give you the necessary directions to the club.

In the event of the teams being level on aggregate score at the end of normal time an extra 30 minutes will be played. If at the end of extra time there is still no final outcome a decider will be played at a neutral venue.

Stamford Football Club would like to thank all fans for their loyal support this season. Their vocal backing and the abundance of red and white Daniels rosettes etc. around the ground (for which we owe a special thanks to Mr. John Rollings of Hardingham Sports) has given a great boost to the players. Keep it up for today's match.
