Ash United History



Ash United Football Club was founded in 1911 and started playing their first competitive matches at Ash Common. Ash United soon became well established in the Surrey Intermediate League, winning every honour possible. After the Second World War Ash United restructured and in the 1947/48 seasons they had the most successful season in their short history, winning the League Championship and four-cup competitions. Ash United had to wait almost twenty years for their next successful campaign. During the 1966/67 seasons Ash United dominated the Surrey Intermediate Premier "A" League, winning the title with only two points being dropped out of a possible fifty two. As the points suggest, Ash United's

achievements included a long unbeaten record with 121 goals for and only 19 against. In 1968 Ash United won promotion to the Surrey Senior League, and in their first season they finished runners up, and also finished as runners-up in the cup. This successful start in the Surrey Senior League came to an abrupt end in 1971 when Ash United were forced to change grounds, this meant they lost their place in the Senior league and had to drop into the Aldershot League. Ash United managed to find a new permanent home with the co-operation of the local council at Shawfield Road, which remains their home to date. Having a permanent home meant that Ash United were re-admitted to the Surrey Senior League. During the late 1970's Ash United had several successful seasons, in the 1977/78 season Ash United won the Charity Cup defeating Dorking 2-1 in the final, the following season Ash United finish runners-up in the newly named Combined Counties League as well as reaching the finals of the Philips Football Floodlighting Competition. It took Ash United several years before they managed to win the Combined Counties League, which they eventually won in the 1981/82 seasons. Ash United also finished runners-up in the Concours Trophy and the George Allen Trophy during that year. The 1984/85 seasons saw Ash United getting through to the quarterfinals of the Surrey Senior Cup as well as being runners-up in the Concours Trophy again. During the 1985/86 season Ash United had a creditable run in the FA Vase, followed by a great league performance in 1986/87. Ash United won the League for the second time under the management of Chris Penny. Ash United produced their best run in the FA Vase in 1993/94 by reaching the second round only failing to go further by losing to Littlehampton in a replay. The 1996/1997 season saw improvements in the facilities at Shawfield Road, most notably was the installation of floodlights and further improvements to the changing rooms, dugouts, and fencing. The 1997/98 seasons was Ash United's best for several years, with new manager Jamie Horton brought together a squad of players that won the Challenge Cup and the Fair Play Trophy in his first season as player/manager. The team also created a new league and club record with 29 games unbeaten in league and cup, which included a run of 21 straight wins. The following season Jamie formed a side that took the League title by a massive 13 points. His team also won the Aldershot Senior Cup beating Fleet Town and reached the last 32 of the FA Vase before losing to the Holders & winners Tiverton Town in front of a record crowd at Shawfield Road. Jamie Horton had a second stint as manager during the 2001/2002. He then took Ash United to their highest points total for a season when they reached 100 but they only finished runners-up to AFC Wallingford. However they regained the Aldershot Senior Cup beating 3 RSME Regiment and also reached the last 32 of the FA Vase before losing to Tow Law Town. The 2004 to 2006 seasons saw ex-Aldershot Town player Stuart Udall take charge of the team. Great progress was made with Ash United finishing 3rd in the League. Season 2007/2008 saw Danny Rolfe take over the manager's position and although Danny's tenure as manager was only to last one season he carried on the good work achieved by his predecessors with a credible mid table finish. Paul (Bonzo) Bonner, ably assisted by ex-Ash United and AFC Wimbledon player Matt Everard have now taken over the first team manager's role. Paul has 18 years' service as a player with Ash United so it is only fitting that his time should now come as first team manager.

League Match Report

Hartley Wintney 4-4 Epsom & Ewell

Combined Counties League Premier Division – Thursday 6 March 2014

A busy week for the Salts continued with a rumbustious ding dong of a game in deepest Hampshire, with echoes of the crazy 5-5 at Chessington in November 2011. The game had nearly all of the features of our season in one 94 minute spell of action. Firstly, the slow start. Hartley had played well in the 4-2 defeat at Chipstead last month and they made several good chances in the first half hour, threatening from wide areas before taking the lead through Ian Jones tap in from a cross. After this, Epsom started to get a bit more together in the attacking third. Secondly, when the play does click, the team has the ability to score clusters of goals in a short spell of time. As we did versus Old Hamptonians, the most intense goal glut of the season arrived here before half-time. On 41 minutes, Nathan Ayling and Karl Douglin combined and Mark Jarman was released into the box and brought down. Alex McGregor stuck away the penalty. A minute later, Antony "Freddie" Myers spanked home a shot to give the Salts the lead and just before half-time Karl Douglin was played in to make it 3-1.

The second half showed the Salts on the front foot but with a certain defensive fragility. The warning signs of the crazy half that followed were there in the opening couple of minutes. Hartley keeper Craig Atkinson getting in a mix up with his defender as the ball got stuck in a boggy patch in front of the penalty box just after the restart. A couple of minutes later, Kieran Campbell made a superb save in a one on one situation up the other end. It seemed plain sailing until the 60th minute when Hartley's Shane Hollamby got through quite easily to finish from close range. All the while Epsom were on the front foot and creating a number of good chances that were missed whilst Hartley raided up the hill on the break. Things got worse on 68 minutes when Kieran Campbell's sliced clearance landed straight at the feet of Hartley's Ian Jones who had the easy task of finishing into the empty net for 3-3.

Then came the real moment of controversy in the game. Freddie Myers headed a high hanging cross goalwards. Craig Atkinson saved the ball quite far back on his line. The linesman on the dugouts side indicated the ball had crossed the line and awarded the goal in the 71st minute. I was not in a position to say whether the ball had crossed the line or not. What followed was a sustained display of ugly dissent from the Hartley team that lasted 2 or 3 minutes. The officials did not card anyone for this as they clearly didn't want to inflame the situation any more. So a lifeline for the Salts who really needed the win to revive fading title hopes. Even this was chucked away in the 84th minute when a series of missed challenges, as the ball went up the field, saw Ian Jones complete his hat-trick for 4-4. There was still time for a Hartley defender to receive his marching orders presumably for still chuntering on about the line decision 15 minutes before. The game finished with Epsom desperately pushing for a winner but no clear cut chance came. If we do not go up this season, games drawn like this from a winning position like this, one against Hanworth Villa and another against Raynes Park Vales, will be a big part of the reason why. For a neutral, the game was sensational and the Epsom team worked so hard on the night it's a pity their efforts weren't better rewarded.

Epsom & Ewell 4-0 Colliers Wood United

Combined Counties League Premier Division – Saturday 8 March 2014

They were singing and dancing on the streets of Epsom after this display of 'sunshine' football which mirrored the glorious weather conditions. It was a good all round team performance that was witnessed by 57 fans which included our matchday sponsors, families, some of the Reserves Team and a Lingfield fan. Having won 2-0 at Colliers Wood United in December, we completed the double over our 16th placed visitors. The match also saw new signing Carlton Murray-Price from Chipstead making his debut for the Club and Ross White, who had signed for the Club last month from Colliers Wood United, make an appearance after two seasons away. After six minutes, Epsom earned a corner on the right and Alex McGregor exchanged passes with Karl Douglin before he unleashed a fizzing right-footed drive which flew over the left-hand angle of the post, with the keeper well beaten. Kieran Campbell easily gathered a Wood corner on nine minutes before Epsom took the lead a minute later. A short corner on the left was played to Douglin, he fed Nathan Ayling on the edge of the six yard box and, with his back to goal, the tall defender exquisitely back-heeled the ball over the keeper into the far corner of the net for 1-0 to the delight of the home support behind the goal.

Both sides fashioned more chances before Epsom doubled the lead on 20 minutes. Mark 'Jarmo' Jarman was bearing down on goal, unmarked, and was about to round the keeper when he was upended. The ref only booked the keeper when everyone was expecting a red card as he was the last man. Dead ball specialist McGregor coolly dispatched the spot kick with such force that it beat the keeper with consummate ease and fairly bulged the onion bag for 2-0. On 21 minutes, Wood's most dangerous effort saw a cross from the right headed by Dan Harding towards goal and it appeared to be going in but instead went wide of the post. More efforts came and went before a great Epsom attack down the left saw Alex McKay's lovely header well saved on 29 minutes. Two more chances were cleared while Campbell comfortably made several saves from some Wood attacks. Their final ball usually letting them down, so Epsom went into the break with a handy lead.

Half-Time: Epsom & Ewell 2-0 Colliers Wood United

The second period saw more attacks by both sides before we trebled the lead on 68 minutes. Murray-Price muscled his way passed a defender, strode forwards and fed Ayling. The Epsom defender then coolly advanced on goal, rounded the keeper and slotted the ball into the empty net with a low left-footer for his second goal of the game and 3-0 to Epsom. A Murray-Price header went wide and a McGregor low shot was saved along with a Colliers Wood shot going wide before Epsom made it 4-0 on 75 minutes. McGregor's low, hard shot was parried by the keeper and Murray-Price was first to the loose ball, blasting it home into the empty net. More chances went begging from some set plays for both sides before Campbell had the last word with an easy catch from a shot in injury time. After this emphatic 4-0 win, the fans went off to the Club's Quiz Night at the Amato pub in Chalk Lane, Epsom in good heart. The four goal haul moved the First Team up one place to third in the league and it also set us up in good form for the visit to league leaders South Park on Tuesday.

League Match Report

South Park 0-2 Epsom & Ewell

Combined Counties League Premier Division – Tuesday 11 March 2014

Epsom & Ewell won the must-win game at South Park last night to keep their thin title hopes alive. The celebrations as the team came off the pitch at the end showed how much the result meant to the team and reinforced our status as the league leaders' bogey team. Epsom & Ewell started with a couple of changes. Sam Robinson re-joining the club after a couple of seasons away started in midfield and new striker Carlton Murray-Price retained his place after an impressive debut against Colliers Wood United on Saturday. The game started fairly quietly with the Epsom back line coping well with the early pressure from South Park. Mark Jarman and Carlton Murray-Price started to link up well as the half progressed and they set up Sam Robinson in the 12th minute for a long range shot that went over the bar. On 22 minutes, South Park's combative right back Jerry O'Sullivan was booked for a foul and was withdrawn at half-time.

Epsom were beginning to make some good moves in midfield as the half hour mark approached. The best of which saw Mark Jarman on the break hold the ball up and time his pass well to play in Carlton Murray-Price to open the scoring slotting past South Park keeper James Wastell.

Conceding the goal seemed to deflate South Park somewhat and the rest of the half saw Epsom on top creating a few good chances. Jamie Hatfield was prominent on his 250th appearance for the club with some good runs down the left.

Usually in these circumstances, Epsom would have been expecting to weather the South Park pressure in the opening minutes of the second half. 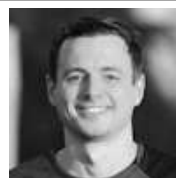

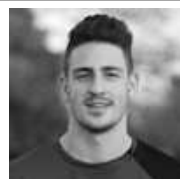
