# Camberley Town History



The Club was formed in 1895 at St Michael's Church in Yorktown and were called St Michael's Camberley and initially played friendlies. As St Michaels they won their first trophy within two seasons of formation, when in the 1897/98 season the Club reached the final of the Surrey Junior Cup where they beat Norwood & Selhurst 2-1 in the final. In 1900 St Michaels looked set to fold and Camberley & Yorktown was formed by members of the St Michaels committee to maintain a footballing presence in the town. Camberley & Yorktown initially competed in the East & West Surrey League and then the Ascot & District League, winning the league title in 1904/05, 1907/08, 1908/09 and 1909/10 as well as finishing runners up in 1903/04, 1905/06 and 1906/07. The Club went on to appear in three Surrey Junior Cup Finals. The first of which came in 1907/08 when Camberley & Yorktown took on Kingston at Woking and were beaten 2-0. The 1908/09 season saw Camberley reach their second final where they narrowly lost to Selhurst Park 1-0. The 1909/10 season saw victory at last as Camberley & Yorktown beat Sutton United 2-1 to win the trophy for the first time. The 1913/14 season saw Camberley & Yorktown make their first appearances in the FA Cup and Amateur Cup. On 13th September, Camberley & Yorktown played host to Sutton United and won 5-3 in their first FA Cup match. The first FA Amateur Cup game did not have as good a result as Camberley & Yorktown were soundly beaten 7-0 by the Royal Army Medical Corps. They went on to win the West Surrey title that season. After the Great War, Camberley & Yorktown decided to concentrate their efforts on the Aldershot Senior League. They started the 1919/20 season well scoring 26 goals in three pre-season friendlies which included a 15-0 record victory over a Royal Engineers side on 20th September, a record that still stands today. In 1922 the Club submitted an application to join the Surrey Senior League which was accepted and Camberley & Yorktown became founder members of the league. They celebrated this by moving into the present ground at Krooner Park. The 1930's saw unequalled success at Camberley & Yorktown as the side won the Surrey Senior League Championship three times in a row. Between 1930/31 and 1932/33 Camberley & Yorktown narrowly missed out on another piece of silverware when they lost 2-1 to Beddington Corner in the Surrey Senior League Charity Cup Final. The Club reached their 40th anniversary in 1935/36 and celebrated it by reaching the Surrey Senior Cup Final for the first time where they were beaten 3-1 by Wimbledon. Camberley & Yorktown followed up the following season with another appearance in the Surrey Senior League Charity Cup Final where they played Walton-on-Thames and lost 5-0. In the 1937/38 season they went one further, winning the Surrey Senior League Charity Cup with a 3-2 win over Hersham. Upon resumption Camberley & Yorktown dropped the Yorktown part of the name and became known as Camberley FC. In 1967 the two senior teams in the town, Camberley Wanderers and Camberley FC merged and became Camberley Town FC. The first success of the new Camberley Town came in the 1972/73 season when third place was achieved in the league and the League Charity Cup Final was reached. They lost 3-2 to Westfield in the final at Weybridge. In their bid to bring a higher grade of football to Camberley Town joined the Spartan League in 1973, the Athenian League in 1975 and then the Isthmian League in 1977. Promotion was achieved in 1979 along with victory in the final of the Surrey Senior Cup where Leatherhead were beaten 4-1 after extra time. Collapse followed and within three seasons Camberley found themselves back in the Athenian League. Camberley Town joined the expanded Isthmian League in 1985. Cup success followed. In 1986 the Club enjoyed their best run in the F.A. Vase reaching the quarter finals where they went out to eventual winners Halesowen Town. In the nineties cup success continued, winning the Aldershot Senior Cup two seasons running in 1996/97 and 1997/98. Also in 1997/98 Camberley Town reached the 4th Qualifying Round of the F.A. Cup equalling their best performance since the thirties and they missed out on promotion to Ryman Division 2 on the final day of the season after a run that saw them lose one and draw twice in a run of 26 matches. In 1998/99 Camberley went one better in the F.A. Cup, reaching the 1st Round Proper for the first time where they were knocked out by League Division 3 side Brentford. The 1999/2000 season saw John Robson and Hugh Doyle appointed as the new management team but Camberley struggled to pick up points in the league and finished in the bottom five. Camberley reached the final of the Aldershot Senior Cup where they lost on penalties after a 3-3 draw. Recent seasons have seen a number of managerial changes. With the disbanding of Ryman League Division 2 Camberley were placed in the Cherry Red Records Combined Counties League for the start of the 2006/07 season, and had a good first campaign, finishing 7th after being just below mid-table before Christmas. During the 2006/07 season, Ronnie Wilson took over from Ian Waldren as Chairman. Darren Barnard joined the Club as Director of Football. In 2007/08, Camberley finished 3rd in the Combined Counties League as well as reaching the last 16 of the FA Challenge Vase.

## League Match Report

### Horley Town 1-3 Epsom & Ewell

Combined Counties League Premier Division – Saturday 15 March 2014

Epsom & Ewell beat Horley on a warm summery afternoon at the New Defence to maintain their chase of leaders South Park. Facing ex-Epsom striker Kyle Hough playing up front alongside ex-Epsom Youth Player Ashley Nadesan, Epsom & Ewell had to work hard to break down a determined Horley Town side fighting for their lives at the bottom of the table. The game started with a flurry of shots over the bar, firstly from Sam Robinson in the 4th minute and then Alex McGregor in the 6th and then Karl Douglin going the closest of the trio in the 8th minute, when the ball fell to him on the edge of the box following a corner. In the early exchanges, Horley had only one clear chance when Kyle Hough strode clear of his stumbling marker and shot wide. The centre half pairing of Alex McKay and George Murphy seemed determined to stop their former teammate from scoring. The middle spell of the first half was marked by a number of stoppages and injuries such as the one which saw Ali Dewar subbed by Sam Currie. As the half wore on, the Salts showed glimpses of their slick passing style but few clear shots on goal resulted. In the 33rd minute, Alex McGregor broke down the by-line, cut it back to Carlton Murray-Price who attempted to weave his way through a crowded box and was blocked out. A couple of minutes later, Epsom were ahead. From a free kick, Alex McGregor crossed deep into the box and Mark Jarman followed it in close to the keeper to squeeze it home for his 70th goal in Epsom colours. By the 43rd minute, the lead was extended. Sam Robinson, having a strong game in the heart of midfield, played an excellent through ball for Carlton Murray-Price to collect his fourth goal in three games for Epsom.

**Half-Time:** Horley Town 0-2 Epsom & Ewell

Horley's best chance of the half came just after the restart when Kyle Hough was through one on one and Kieran Campbell made an excellent point blank save; following this, there was quite a long quiet spell in the game as Epsom looked to be hanging on to 2-0 with comfort and Horley not creating much. We had a similar spell to this at 2-0 up versus Colliers Wood United last week and managed to extend the lead. The comeback goal, that the pessimist in me always fears, arrived this week on 70 minutes when Horley centre half Tom Winsor poked home from close range at the far post as Epsom struggled to clear a corner. This provoked an increase in tempo from Epsom and the substitution of James Cottee coming on for Alex McGregor paid off almost immediately. Sam Robinson's low, skidding free kick was parried by the Horley keeper and Cottee tapped home the rebound on 77 minutes. The remaining time was seen out with few alarms. The ghost in the room was South Park. With the South Park manager's son James playing for Horley the Epsom supporters were checking regularly how the league leaders were getting on at Wembley. The slip up from South Park, that Epsom will need to win the league, did not arrive today but Epsom can only keep winning to keep up the chase.

# Cup Match Report

## Wembley 2-0 Epsom & Ewell

Cherry Red Records Premier Challenge Cup 4th Round – Tuesday 18 March 2014

Epsom & Ewell's defence of the Combined Counties League Cup came to a disappointing end with a 2-0 defeat at Vale Farm, Wembley on Tuesday evening. Supporters used to joke about a 'North West London triangle', where results and performances would disappear but this talk has faded as our record at Wembley in recent seasons has improved. Their win at Chipstead and the hard fought win we had there in December were warning signs that this could be a tricky tie. It certainly proved so. Epsom started the game quite slowly and the best early chance fell to Wembley's Luke Davis, whose shot was saved by Kieran Campbell in the 8th minute. A minute later they were ahead. Kieran Campbell's attempted clearance was intercepted by Luke Davis who set up Joe Wright to open the scoring. Epsom & Ewell were struggling to get their usual passing game together and kept giving possession away. On 15 minutes, Mark Jarman had a shot well saved by Griguli Zulmatashiuli in the Wembley goal.

As the first half wore on, the Salts will be disappointed at how few clear cut chances they were able to create, due to the keen defending and the closing down of midfield by the Wembley team. On 40 minutes, Epsom's task of rescuing something from the game became an even stiffer one when Wembley doubled their lead. Yassine Fehmi-Gill's long pass found Joe Wright who forced his shot home from a wide angle on the right-hand side of the box.

**Half-Time:** Wembley 2-0 Epsom & Ewell

Manager Lyndon Buckwell was clearly looking for a response from the team after half-time. However, the team's cause wasn't helped by substitutions for injuries during the second half, the first of which was in 50th minute, when Mark Jarman had to come off with an arm problem to be replaced by Alex McGregor. Whilst the Salts had spells of passing and pressure in the second half, all too often a possible final pass went astray and not enough clear cut chances were created. Wembley continued to make chances through the second half, adapting to the windy conditions better and well deserved their win. Epsom & Ewell's night got worse when James Cottee limped off in the 69th minute. George Murphy also came off in the 82nd minute. Wembley kept up their pressure to the end of the game and now face in form Spelthorne Sports in the Semi-Final. Epsom will now only face them in one Semi-Final instead of two, as they are our next opponents in the Southern Combination Cup.

## League Match Report

### Epsom & Ewell 3-0 Ash United

Combined Counties League Premier Division – Saturday 22 March 2014

Having lost their defence of the League Cup in midweek with a 2-0 loss at Wembley, there was still a slim chance of a league and Southern Combination Cup double. So a 3-0 win which could have been more will leave everyone at the club in good spirits for next week's trip to in-form Bedfont Sports.
