Chessington & Hook United FC History



Chessington and Hook United Sports and Social Club have evolved from the original Chessington F.C., which was formed in 1921. A series of mergers over the years culminated with the coming together of Chessington United Football Club and Hook Youth/United in 1986.

This amalgamation brought together the Intermediate section of Chessington United based at Chalky Lane and the thriving Youth and junior sections of Hook Youth/United, which had been formed in 1986

and based at Lovelace Playing Fields.

The Clubs activities were to be centred on the facilities at Chalky Lane, which had been the home of Chessington United since the mid-sixties. They had taken out a lease on what was known as St Marys Recreation Ground, although at the time it was just an open space. Over the years the ground has been developed, almost entirely by voluntary effort, into the facility it is today.

Recently the Club has regained Senior status, with the Senior team playing in the F.A Cup and F.A.Vase. The strong Youth set up provides the opportunity for those aged between 5 and 18 to benefit from properly structured football.

In recent years the Club has been able to sponsor both Girls and Ladies football and has provided facilities for Archery and Ladies Netball.

The Club prides itself on the fact that it is maintained on a purely voluntary basis. All the Committee members, trainers, managers, ground staff and adult helpers give of their own time. Likewise the players receive no payment whatsoever from the Club. All players, from Youth to Seniors are required to pay a membership fee.

The aim of the Club over the years has always been to promote soccer through Youth with progression to Junior, Intermediate and Senior level as appropriate to the highest standard. Also, to foster and encourage other sporting activities for the local community consistent with the facilities available at the Club.

Since the establishment of Hook Youth in 1976 there has been a steady growth in the number of local youths who have become members of the Club. In the last few years there have been as many as 19 teams involving up to over 250 youngsters. The structure of the Club allows boys reaching the age of 18, or in some circumstances earlier, to have the opportunity to progress into the adult section of the Club.

League Match Report

Epsom & Ewell 1-0 Bedfont Sports

Combined Counties League Premier Division – Saturday 7 September 2013

Epsom and Ewell celebrated Non-League Day by going six points clear of the chasing pack at the top of the Combined Counties League Premier Division with a hard fought 1-0 win at the High Road against Bedfont Sports on Saturday 7 September. With a 100% start to the season, winning seven out of seven League games so far, 63 fans turned up to witness the Salts make it eight out of eight. With Nathan Ayling making his 100th appearance for the Club, the scene was set for the team to chase some more records. Having reached for the record books, Epsom had won nine out of nine League games at the start of the 1974/75 campaign at West Street and, last season, they had a twelve match consecutive winning sequence in the League from November to February. However, the Salts made it hard for themselves in the first half as they were dominated by a determined Bedfont Sports side, with Kieran Campbell having to make several fine saves when his goal was threatened. Elevating him to Man of the Match for the first half. The closest the Salts came to scoring in this half was a low curling shot on 39 minutes from Karl Doughlin as he drove forward. The shot going just wide with the 'keeper beaten. Two minutes later, Epsom counter attacked and Ben Hayward shot against the post, but had already been given offside.

Half-Time: Epsom & Ewell 0-0 Bedfont Sports

The Salts came out for the second half dictating the play and creating better chances to break the deadlock. On 50 minutes, Ben Hayward's header drew a great save from their 'keeper. Robbie Burns had some great opportunities to beat the 'keeper on several occasions, only to be thwarted by him when it looked far easier to score. Lyndon Buckwell made some inspired substitutions. Matt Smith came on and drove forward, creating some dangerous crosses, putting Bedfont's defence under so much pressure that they almost scored two own goals. With five minutes left on the clock, Kyle Hough's corner from the right was met in the six yard box by Alex McKay, who ghosted in through a ruck of players to plant a superb unstoppable header into the back of the net to the delight of the crowd behind the goal. In the last minute, Karl Doughlin had a great chance to double the advantage, when he was clear on goal, but the 'keeper made himself big while Doughlin tried to chip him, and the keeper caught the ball above his head. The better option appeared to have been to either slot it low past the 'keeper or round him. In time added on, one of the Bedfont Sports' defenders got his marching orders for a second yellow card.

League Cup Match Report

Horley Town 2-3 Epsom & Ewell

Combined Counties Premier Challenge Cup 1st Round – Tuesday 10 September 2013

Epsom & Ewell came through a tough League Cup tie at Horley thanks to Mark Jarman's 90th minute winner. It was a performance of some resilience in the end and whilst Epsom applied a lot of pressure on Horley for spells in the game, there were other parts where the team could not get their game together at all. All in all, manager Lyndon Buckwell will have been pleased to get through the tie without an extra half hour or penalties being needed. When the teams lined up, one interesting feature was the similarly named left backs on each side with Horley Town's Jordan Henry and Epsom & Ewell's Jordayne Henry being handed a full debut in place of Jamie Hatfield. The game started relatively quietly with few clear cut chances either way. Robbie Burns had a turn and shot wide in the 9th minute. One feature of the game was Horley 'keeper Craig McLeod punching the Epsom corners. The game came to life in the 22nd minute; Karl Doughlin received a pass on the edge of the box, sidestepped the Horley defender and scored with a curling shot to cap a spell of sustained Epsom pressure. Within two minutes, Horley were level. Horley's Ryan Brackpool was played in on the right-hand side and strode clear to fire a shot past Kieran Campbell. Horley are managed by Trevor Smith, who managed Epsom & Ewell's Youth team a couple of years ago and there were several familiar names in the Horley line up and they were keen opponents. In the latter stages of the first half, Epsom created a few chances which were not taken whilst Horley mainly raided on the break.

Half-Time: Horley Town 1-1 Epsom & Ewell

It was just after half-time when Brackpool chased a long ball through the Epsom defence, reached the bounce first to finish confidently for his and Horley's second goal. The Salts needed to regroup but had nearly a whole half to pull things back. The equaliser came on 58 minutes when a peach of a cross from Mark Jarman was flick headed into the corner of the net by Kyle Hough. After equalising, Epsom's play became really scrappy, struggling to get any rhythm or pattern in their passing whilst Horley looked at times more likely to be the next scorers. It was only in the latter stages that clear chances were made. On 87 minutes, sub Alex McGregor shot against the Horley bar and on the 90 minute mark, Nathan Ayling picked out Mark Jarman on the edge of the box and he sidestepped one defender before firing home. There was still a nervy five minutes of time added on to get through when a spell of Horley pressure was scrambled away for a corner. It was a relieved Epsom contingent that greeted the final whistle. In the next round, Epsom & Ewell travel to the Arena to play AFC Croydon Athletic.
