Frimley Green FC History



The club was founded in 1919 and currently play at Frimley Green Recreation Ground. The present clubhouse was erected in 1972 when 'The Green' played in the London Spartan League and used a pitch on the lower part of the park with the changing rooms where the car park now is. A few years later a new pitch was laid adjacent to the clubhouse and changing rooms were added. The Reserve Team joined the

Combined Counties League in 1979 and at the start of the 1981/82 season the First Team switched across and Floodlights were installed for the first time. The Club competed in the League for a period of 15 years, during which time they won the Dan Air Elite Cup and the Reserves won the Division One Challenge Cup. Due to the financial situation in 1994 the club voluntarily dropped down into junior football. They were Runners-up in the Surrey Intermediate League (Western) in their first season but were denied promotion into the Surrey Premier League. The next four seasons saw a period of rebuilding and repaying debts and the club were finally accepted into the Surrey Premier League in 1999, after finishing Runners-up and winning the League Cup. Off the field new Floodlights were installed and a Boardroom created within the Clubhouse. A three year spell followed, in the renamed Surrey Senior League, which saw the club finish fourth, sixth and Runners –up and attain promotion back into the Combined Counties League where they have played since. Season 2004-05 was the most successful to date, in the Combined Counties League, with the club finishing in 15th Place and amassing 58 points. Season 2005-06 was very disappointing on the playing front but we managed to avoid finishing in a relegation position, however, despite substantial ground improvements we were demoted on 'ground grading', to make way for 7 clubs from the old Ryman Division two. In the next 4 seasons in Division One we had mixed fortunes, finishing 6th at the end of season 2007/08 but then in season 2008/09 finished 3rd from bottom but had our most successful season ever in the FA Vase, reaching the third round and won an FA Cup match for the first time. In season 2009/10 we managed to finish high enough up the table to retain our place in the FA Cup place but 2010/11 was a poor season and 2011/12 saw the appointment of Paul Miles and Ian Maynard mid season and they built a team to challenge for promotion in 2012/13. We did better than expected and won the title and 3 FA Vase games along the way, beating 2 level 5 opponents.

League Match Report

Epsom & Ewell 2-2 Raynes Park Vale

Combined Counties League Premier Division – Tuesday 15 October 2013

While the rest of the Nation were Pole dancing to the Brazilian Samba beat on the Road to Rio, watching England's win against Poland at Wembley, 41 Non Leaguers saw Raynes Park come up the Vale to the High Road to contest local bragging rights in a 2nd versus 4th derby encounter.

On a cool autumnal evening, with a hint of mist blending with a neighbour's bonfire, it made for a spooky atmosphere, more akin to the approaching Halloween Night. The Salts made the early running with efforts from Kyle Hough, Jamie Hatfield, and Nathan Ayling all having chances to open the scoring in the first 10 minutes. While the Vale were restricted to a couple of efforts which Kieran Campbell had no problem dealing with.

On 14 minutes, a long through ball saw Mark Jarman power forward, outstripping the opposition's defence, leaving them in his wake, and he latched on to the ball, drilling home an unstoppable shot from the edge of the area giving the 'keeper no chance, putting the Salts into a 1-0 lead.

While the Vale kept coming forward, the Salts had two more efforts to score through Jarmo and then Karl Douglin, whose shot went wide for a throw in. However, the Vale equalised on 38 minutes when the Salts defence could not clear the ball from the area, despite several attempts, and up stepped Ato Okai to blast home the loose ball from 15 yards for 1-1.

The Salts did create a few more attacks but the half petered out.

Five minutes into the second half, Jarmo gave the Salts the lead again. Kyle Hough shook off his marker along the byline on the right and crossed into a crowded goalmouth. In the following scramble, Jarmo poked the ball home under pressure for 2-1.

Karl Douglin, Kyle Hough, and Alex McGregor then all had chances to increase our lead but without success. The Vale were restricted to long range efforts without threat, apart from a mix up in the 70th minute, when Campbell and Hatfield got in a tangle, and Campbell retrieved the ball.

With just 3 minutes left, when, Hough drilled a superb left footed effort which beat their man-mountain of a 'keeper. I was about to celebrate a goal with my best Brazilian shout of "Ggggggoooooaaaaaalllllll", when the ball smashed the foot of the right hand post and went out of play for a goal kick, instead of landing in the 'old onion bag'.

In the last minute, Douglin bamboozled a defender, broke free and unleashed a shot just over the bar. However, deep into injury time, Vale Sub Simon Moore stole in to poke home an equaliser to make it 2-2, ensuring that Raynes Park take a point from the High Road back down to the Vale.

Steve Dyke – Groundhopping Tales in ...

The Dyke family are now two months back from our annual venture north and the old man has tales of obscure non-league grounds visited and the daring do associated in getting there. The holiday was a week and a half and football passes were obtained for Tuesday night, Saturday and the following Tuesday night.

The Tuesday and Saturday had gone well. The first Tuesday saw me achieve my long desired quest of going to a ground that Nigel Pond hasn't been to! I really thought I'd done it two years ago at Bacup Borough but was foiled, similarly with Curzon Ashton and Bamber Bridge last year! My quest was finally achieved at Northern Counties League East League (NCEL) Liversedge AFC, who hosted Retford United and lost 0-3. Liversedge is one of three small towns known as the Yorkshire Woollen District and the triangle of Liversedge, Cleckheaton and Heckmondwike are probably the most Northern sounding towns of all.

Retford were good with a winger called Reece Thompson who ran the game, expect to see them high in their league and in the latter stages of the FA Vase. The Saturday saw me down the road at Brighouse Town. Brighouse did well in the Vase themselves last year going out away at Newport Isle of Wight having had a lot of local business support and sponsorship for the coach and a night in a Southampton hotel.

This was FA Cup Saturday and being able to keep in touch with events at Whyteleafe from Paul Marshall, I was able to report back that Brighouse overcame Northern League Division One 'Yugoslav nostalgia outfit' Seaham Red Star 3-1. I had the taste for the local non-league action and wanted more.

I scoured the Non-League Paper and the West Yorkshire A-Z I had purchased. I had my eye on a couple of FA Cup replays in the area at either picturesque Barnoldswick Town or brewery dominated Tadcaster Albion or more locally a trip to Thackley who had started well in the NCEL. The ground of the 'Denny-boys' looked well situated in a curve of the Aire Valley North of Bradford in woods a short walk from the Emmerdale Village of Esholt. I was mulling over my options on the Tuesday morning in Halifax town centre when disaster struck. OK, I'm overstating let's call it a setback. The car started smelling quite 'clutchy' and behaving erratically. There was a garage opposite where we could park and he said he could do it overnight.

We proceeded to the fountains and pool in Bradford city centre by public transport using one of the great bargains this country has to offer a day pass for all trains and buses in West Yorkshire for £11.00 for 2 adults 2 children, not each all of us! Incidentally when I retire I must write the book I've had in my head "Great bus Journeys of Britain" as the 576 from Halifax to Bradford has spectacular scenery if you like that kind of thing.

I had the pass I'm going to use it, I thought and whilst farther flung options were now out it was between Thackley, Brighouse (again) or Northern Premier League Farsley AFC. A raft of bus timetable leaflets were secured and as Sam and Joseph splashed I checked if football was possible.

Whilst the bus pass was cheap the flipside of it was that bus services in West Yorkshire become a bit sparser in the evening, Thackley was out, Brighouse a five mile walk so only Farsley remained by a thin combination of bus and train. The last bus to anywhere near where were staying, left Bradford Interchange at 22.00 so I'd not have to hang around on the way back.

Farsley AFC is situated to the west of Leeds and could be reached of the No 72 bus running as the absurdly marketed 'Hyperlink' between Leeds and Bradford. We had seen one of the buses in Leeds a few days previous and my six year old Joseph took great delight in calling it a 'trus' as it looked like a tram but it was a bus.

The game was an Evostick Division One North game against Merseyside outfit Prescott Cables. Prescott turned up late due to the M62 traffic so my arrangements at the end were under threat as I am very loath to leave a game before the end. As we proved in the game versus Bedfont Sports even something looking like a stinker of a 0-0 can have an exciting outcome.

As it turned out I really did enjoy the game. Prescott were comedy gold as they had a slightly potty committee man in full club blazer tracking the linesman shouting constantly at his own back four concentrate – and worse. The experienced centre half was one of those blokes you see sometimes in a team for whom everything is everyone else's fault. He was calling his colleagues all the names under the sun.
