FOCUS ON EPSOM & EWELL

Epsom & Ewell was founded in March 1918 as Epsom Juniors Cricket Club and played throughout the summer.

In the autumn, Epsom Juniors FC. came into being and played a handful of games from what is now known as Alexandra Recreation Ground.

Competitive football followed as we entered the Surrey Junior League in 1919, and became founder members of the Sutton & District League in 1920.

A change of name in July 1922 to Epsom Town heralded the start of a very successful era.

By now resident at the Horton Hospital Sports Ground, we were unfortunate to lose 2-1 after extra-time at Dorking's Pixham Lane ground to Caterham Mental Hospital in a replay of the Surrey Junior Cup Final.

However, we won three other trophies that season, the Leatherhead Hospital Shield, the Sutton Hospital Cup, and the Epsom Hospital Cup. In addition, we also won the Sutton

& District League, and under the forward thinking of their visionary chairman Hugh Bradley, took the step into Intermediate Football, where we won the Southern Suburban League without losing a match.

Senior football was granted as we were unanimously accepted into the Surrey Senior League for 1924-25, where we finished third and shortly after moved to West Street where they were for many years.

In 1960 we changed our name once again to Epsom & Ewell in an attempt to increase support across the whole of the Borough.

In 1993 a large chapter in our history ended as we left West Street and by 2012-13 we had played 1000 games as a nomadic club.

The club celebrated their centenary in 2018 and are now in their eighth season at High Road as the tenants of Chipstead. They are currently in the lower half of the CCL Division One table.

The search continues for Epsom & Ewell for their own ground.

FOLLOW THE TRACTOR Jersey Bulls - 25th January

The Ground: Jersey Bulls play at Springfield Stadium, a 1,700 multi-purpose facility in St Helier. The stadium is owned by the States of Jersey and is home to the Jersey FA and the Jersey official football team.

How To Get To The Ground: Note club officials have had their trip arranged by the home club and this is now closed. Other supporters will have to make their own way to the Channel Island at your expense.

It takes an hour to Jersey from most UK airports and costs between £50-£100 and 4.5 hours by ferry from Portsmouth and Poole.

Jersey Airport is about 10 minutes St Helier and the ferry docks close to the centre of St Helier.

All persons entering the ground must comply with the following **Ground Regulations**.

Failure to do so may result in being asked to leave the ground and a ban from attending any future events in the ground.

Admission and the right to remain within the ground is on condition that all persons refrain from the following acts:

1. Failure to comply with any legal directions given by a club official, steward or police officer.
2. Entering the field of play before, during or after the game.
3. Using obscene or abusive language.
4. Making racial or other forms of abuse.
5. Consuming alcohol in bottles, glasses, cans or any other container within the ground boundary. The taking of drugs or being under

the influence of drugs.

6. Climbing on any building, wall, fence or floodlights.
7. The use of horns, hooters or any musical instrument that will affect the enjoyment of others.
8. No animals permitted in the ground with the exception of guide dogs.
9. The throwing of any missile, object or projectile.

In addition all emergency exits, walkways and approaches to the ground must be kept clear at all times.

The club committee reserves the right to amend, add to or update these regulations as and when necessary.

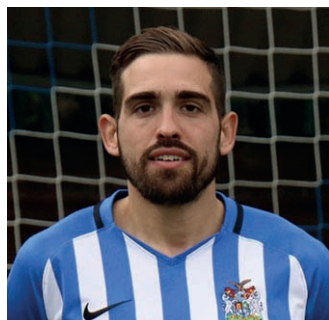

The managers probably won't thank us for saying it but it's always great to see non-league talent move up into the Football League.

Our columnist and BT Sport commentator Adam Virgo recently wrote that Taylor is the best midfielder in the National League. Perhaps Posh were reading.

The moves didn't stop there with Rob Atkinson joining Oxford United from Eastleigh. The young defender has impressed for the Spitfires this season having joined in the

summer from Basingstoke Town. It just goes to show how much talent there is throughout non-league football.

Of course, for the managers it's not great timing. They've lost important players at an important part of the season. It's not as straightforward as just going out and handpicking a replacement. It does, however, reflect well on them and their clubs. Non-league football thrives and survives on giving young footballers the opportunity to showcase their talent and the platform to push onto the League. Are there more footballers just waiting for their chance? You can be sure of it.

They certainly aren't the only non-league club to suffer at the hands of mindless thieves. It is soul destroying for the hard-working volunteers that put in all the hours they can to their club only to have to clear up the mess.

Unfortunately many non-league clubs and grounds are soft targets. Often tucked away and with alcohol and other stock, or the prospect of cash left inside – they are an appealing proposition. Clubs no doubt have insurance but the costs of additional security only add an extra burden.
