We leave it late

A late winner by Jamie Byatt secured the points for us away at Oakwood Football Club on Tuesday evening; the goal was nothing more than we deserved after dominating for most of the game.

We made one change from the side that played against Montpelier Villa last Saturday with Kane Charles replacing Matt Bishop in goal. We also had three new players on the bench from the Epsom and Ewell Colts team; more about those individuals later on.

We started well and opened the scoring in the third minute after Kofi Quartey was fouled around 20 yards out. Steve Springett, stepped up and put the ball into the top corner of the hapless Oakwood goalkeepers net; it was a perfect free-kick.

Chances kept coming to us with various close ones from Luke Miller, Ricardo Fernandez and Athan Smith-Joseph but none of these came to anything and then in one of Oakwood's only attacks in the 25th minute they were awarded a penalty after a trip in the penalty box and the score became 1-1.

This was disappointing, but no sooner were we behind but we were in front again when some great work from Luke Miller ended up with his shot going into the net after one or two slight deflections. We fully deserved to be in the lead. The rest of the first half contained further chances for us but all to no avail.

No changes in personnel for the second half and the flow of play continued in the same vein with us pushing Oakwood further and further back. We had numerous chances to increase our lead and then got caught by a 'sucker-punch' when Oakwood broke through our defence and made it 2-2 with 13 minutes left. After this setback, we continued to look for a winner, the game became slightly disjointed as Oakwood players kept going down with minor injuries as they tried to 'take the sting' out of the constant

pressure they were under. This pressure finally took its toll, but it required a fantastic pass from Athan Smith-Joseph to make the breakthrough when he found Jamie Byatt in the box and he converted the chance with his head - it was a great goal. The game went into injury time which the referee adjudged to be over six minutes and after a couple of free-kicks from Oakwood as they went searching for an equaliser he blew his final whistle.

What of our three substitutes? Two of them made their debuts and did not look out of place, so welcome Kieran Strank and Alex Bennett. Our third substitute was about to come on when the referee blew his whistle so George Butler will have to wait a little longer to make his debut.

We learnt that after the game we had gone to the top of the table; we need to continue in this vein of form if we are going to secure the only promotion slot available.

We move onto a very tough away game at Godalming Town on Saturday which is one of our shorter away games, so if you are at a loose end why not come and support the 'boys' as we try to keep first place on the table.

One last footnote about last night, which typifies what being part of a football club at our level is all about. Mark, the owner, chairman and manager at Oakwood was seen before the game-fixing the floodlights, giving his team talk, taking the gate money and finally, white lining the perimeter of the pitch - what would 'grass roots' football do without this type of volunteer - take a bow, Mark

Yes, it was a disappointing loss, but rather it be at this stage of the season with over a third of the season to play for. We go again to Oakwood on Tuesday 11th January when we hope to get back on track.

A disappointing defeat

This was always going to be a difficult game for us as we enter the last third of the season; a game against Godalming Town is always going to be hard. A healthy crowd of over 180 turned out to watch the game.

The least we deserved from this game was a draw, but unfortunately, we fell foul of a 93rd-minute winner from the home team and also an atrocious decision from one of the assistant officials which led to the Godalming second goal (more of that later).

The game was also marred by an incident midway in the second half when a home supporter was heard to racially abuse one of our players; there is no place in any level of football for that type of language. We await Godalming's reaction to this clear abuse of a player. The individual was asked to leave the ground but that is the least that should happen.

We had Matt Bishop back 'between the sticks' as Kane Charles had a setback with a hairline fracture of a finger and had to miss out. We welcomed back Brad Peters who gave a real solid performance on his return.

The pitch was not conducive to free-flowing football and the first half action reflected this. Both sides had chances to take the lead but the first half ended 0-0.

The second half started in the same vein and we took the lead after a great run and finish by Jamie Byatt. However, a few minutes later we were level when Godalming scored an equaliser. The scoring did not stop there and Godalming went further ahead, however, this was as a result of the aforementioned decision by one of the assistant referees who gave a throw into the home team when in fact it was an Epsom throw; this was corroborated by numerous Godalming supporters who were closer to the decision - truly shocking.

This setback was very difficult to get out of our player's minds but this they did and who else but Jamie Byatt was in hand to score our equaliser from a very acute angle with 3 minutes to go. at this point, most supporters would have accepted a draw, but it was not to be as Godalming scored a 93rd-minute winner.

Again a difficult result to stomach, but we have to look forward to the next few fixtures. A lot of our rivals have to play each other over the next few weeks which gives us a real chance to pick up further points to secure a place at the top of the table. We should not be too disheartened as there are plenty of games to go with 7 at home and only 4 away.

HOME GROUND: THE ROBERT ALBON MEMORIAL GROUND



The club was originally called Wigmore Athletic and were one of the founder members of Division Two of the Sussex County Football League for the 1952-53 season. The first season in the league brought instant success as they finished as Champions and gained promotion to Division one. The club then spent the next thirteen seasons in Division one during which time they won the league cup in the 1959-60 season. This period also saw the club make their debut in the FA Cup. At the end of the thirteen seasons in Division one the club was relegated to Division two but after two seasons were back in Division One. However the club was immediately relegated again, and had to wait until the end of the 1973-74 campaign to get back in the top Division, when they finished as Champions of Division two. The club competed in Division one for four seasons before being relegated to Division two where they stayed until the end of the 1987-88 Campaign.

At the end of the 1987-88 campaign Wigmore Athletic were relegated to Division Three of the Sussex County league. The club then changed its name to Worthing United when they amalgamated with local side Southdown FC. The newly named club took two seasons to escape from Division Three, when they gained promotion back to Division two as Champions. The club then spent the next fourteen seasons in Division two, with the final of these fourteen seeing the club gain promotion back into Division one as runners-up in the 2003-04 season. The club remained in Division one until the end of the 2008-09 campaign when they finished bottom of the division and found themselves back in Division two. They won promotion back to Division One in the 2010-11 season under manager Dominic Di Paola.

In January 2013 Worthing United appointed Paul Curtis as their manager. In November 2013 John Foley was appointed as his replacement. The season ended with relegation back to Division 2. This season Malcolm Gamlen, the club secretary for over 20 years, sadly passed away. June 2014 saw another managerial change with Nigel Geary replacing John Foley. In his first year at the helm, Geary guided the club back to the new 'Premier Division' formerly known as Division One, after winning the league and cup double.



On 22nd August 2015 the club was hit by tragedy when Matthew Grimstone and Jacob Schilt were lost in the Shoreham Air Disaster. The team did not play again until 6th September, when they faced East Preston in an FA Vase tie. The match was played in front of more than 1000 spectators and the Mavericks won the game 2-1 in dramatic fashion. The 2015-16 season finished with Geary's men in 14th position, the clubs joint highest

Ahead of the 2016-17 season, Matt Evans was appointed U21 manager and Geary remained as First Team Manager. As the season began, The Mavericks experienced mixed fortunes and in November 2016, Nigel Geary departed the club and was replaced by Simon Funnell. At the end of the season, having secured survival, Funnell departed the club. Matt Evans was promoted to First Team Manager for the 2017-18 season. The vastly experienced Bill Clifford took the Managers role for the U21 team. The season finished with relegation for the Mavericks and Steve Taylor resigned from his role as Chairman, moving to local rivals Lancing. Changes were afoot in the summer of 2018 with Bill Clifford being elected as Chairman, and the decision was made not to enter an U23 team for the 2018/19 season, although many of that team were now in the First Team plans. Matt Evans retained his role as First Team manager. The 2018/19 season was an eventful one. In September, after a concerning dip in form, manager Matt Evans left the club. Curtis Foster took over the reigns but after just one match in charge, he left the Mavericks to take over at Shoreham. Adam Kipling replaced him and remained in place until the conclusion of the season, with a bottom-placed finish ending a forgettable season.

A relegation reprieve saw the Mavericks retain their Division One status, and 2019/20 was seen as a fresh start with the appointment of Danny Wood as manager. The U23 Development Squad was reintroduced. It was a season of two halves. The Mavericks took time to gel but after struggling for form early on, the team rose up the table and into the top half - competing for a top ten finish. The season was brought to a premature end, with the season declared null and void after the outbreak of the COVID-19 virus across the globe.

The 2020/21 season is now upon us and gets underway in strange circumstances. The season is starting a month later than would have been the case, and with the condensing of fixtures, certain cup competitions have been withdrawn for the season.

BACK TO THE BOROUGH

UPDATE 28TH FEBRUARY 2022

We continue with our efforts to get The Salts (E.E.F.C.) back playing in the Borough of Epsom & Ewell.

The Borough Council are currently conducting a 'Call for Sites' exercise, to inform a new Land Availability Assessment (LAA).

The LAA process will consider all types of land use and replace the previous Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment (SHLAA). This is to update the previous call for sites exercise conducted in 2017, to ensure the evidence base to support the Local Plan is as robust as possible.

The LAA will form a key part of the Local Plan evidence base. It will assess whether the land is suitable, available and viable for certain land uses and timescales for delivery.

Due to the change in nature of the LAA, the Council require all sites to be resubmitted. Sites previously submitted through a 'Call for Sites' or included within the most recent Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment (SHLAA) 2017, will not automatically be carried forward into the new LAA.

With this in mind, and to prepare and lodge our application for inclusion, we have engaged the services of a consultant specialising in this field. Submissions have to be made to the Council by 27 March 2022.

We are currently in the process of collating all of the necessary information required by the consultant to be included in our submission. This includes information from our numerous partners in the submission, including but not comprehensive; Downs Netball Club, Alexandra United F.C., Stoneleigh Athletic F.C., Beechholme Belles F.C., Surrey Police F.C.

This is only one part of our strategy and we will provide further updates on the website and in our 'Match Day' programme when it is relevant.

As stated previously, the site we have identified to develop into our new home is the 'Hook Road Arena.'

We aim to have a fully inclusive Football, Netball and Sports Hub facility at the heart of the community for all to enjoy no matter what level of sport you play.

We will encourage those who live and work in and around the Borough to promote a healthier lifestyle & hopefully help with their mental well-being through participation in all sports and forms of socialising

We need all the help we can get to fulfil our 'Back to the Borough' endeavours.
