2. The Club reserves the right to prosecute or to eject, or cause to be ejected, any person who, within the club premises, is only considered by the club, it's employees or agents (hereafter called the club) to their discretion to be, or to have been in any of the following ways:
 - Entering the field of play. The field of play being within the railing surrounding the pitch.
 - Using obscene or abusive language or persistent foul language.
 - Being drunk or under the influence of drink or drugs to any degree.
 - Making vulgar gestures.
 - Making terms of abuse, racial or otherwise.
3. No bottles, metal cans, glasses, placards, banners or other similar articles are permitted and the Police or Club stewards have the right to search any spectator at any time and to confiscate any article which they consider could be a danger to other spectators.
4. No alcohol is to be consumed within the confines of the railings surrounding the ground. The ground being defined as the playing area and walkway around the pitch.
5. The climbing of floodlights, pylons, fences, stands or other buildings is strictly forbidden.
6. All vehicles are parked at the owner's risk.
7. Under 16's must be accompanied by an adult to be admitted to the ground.
8. No dogs allowed except guide dogs.

History



Formed in 1920 as the **Sussex County Football League**,^[1] started with just one league with 12 teams. By the end of the 1929–30 season, six of the original twelve teams remained, having played in every campaign since the competition began. The league saw regular changes in members between 1921 and 1928 and saw 23 clubs taking part. The league closed down during the Second World War and the league ran two competition sections in the 1945–46 season, an Eastern division with eight teams and a Western division with 9 teams. The winners of each competition played in a play-off for a champion. A normal single league practice resumed in 1946 with 14 clubs now playing.

A new division was created in 1952 when Division Two was instituted. Division One remained with 14 teams and Division Two with 12 teams. By 1958 the two leagues had 16 teams each. The [1962–63 season](#) was abandoned due to the atrocious [weather conditions](#), with some clubs playing over 20 games and others with only 13 or 14 games played, an emergency competition was played in a group stage style format with knock-out stages to the final. The 1970s saw the league membership decline.

In 1983 a third division was added for intermediate level teams looking for an easy entry into the football league pyramid system, also a 3 points for a win system was introduced. Divisions One and Two keeping with 16 teams each, Division Three started with 13 teams, increasing to 15 two seasons later. Some long term clubs experienced harder times and dropped into Division Two. A "Two Up Two Down" system of promotion and relegation was applied throughout the period but occasionally affected with departures from the league itself. Division One increased to 18 teams for the 1988–89 season and 20 teams for the 1993–94 season, along with Division One increasing to 18 teams in the same season. Division Three increased to 16 teams in 2000.

The league changed its name to the Southern Combination Football League for the start of the 2015–16 season,^[2] keeping the acronym **SCFL** also attracting teams just across the Sussex border in the event of [the Football Association](#) (FA) moving teams across leagues. Also at the same time renamed the divisions to Premier Division, Division One and Division Two. Division Two still keeping its intermediate status. Also, for the 2015–16 season the league added two U21s divisions, one in the East, and one in the West, these two leagues consisting of 7 teams each, which lasted until the end of the 2017–18 season and replaced by two Under–23 divisions (East and West), and three Under–18 divisions (East, Central and West)

A second abandonment was during the [2019–20](#) season when the coronavirus disease 2019 ([COVID-19](#)) pandemic halted all sporting events nationwide, an agreement between the leagues and the Football Association decided to end the season early and expunge all results, including no promotion or relegation between the leagues.^[3]

The league season was abandoned for the third time, after the FA Alliance and Leagues committees announced that the [2020–21](#) was curtailed, subject to ratification by The FA Council, with immediate effect.^[4]

The first team divisions – Premier, One and Two, sit at Steps 5 and 6, and level 11, formerly Step 7, of the [English football league system](#), below the lower divisions of the [Isthmian League](#) and the [Southern League](#). The reserve divisions are not part of the league system.

CHESSINGTON & HOOK UNITED



Formed as Chessington F.C. in 1921, the club entered the Kingston & District League and within two years were the Division 4 Champions. Further honours proved elusive through the divisions until 1961 winning the Premier Division.

By 1968, the club had moved to the Premier Division of the Middlesex League, which was their first taste of intermediate football. They ended that first season as Runners-up and were consequently admitted to the Surrey County Senior League – a major milestone in the club's history. Even more significantly, they became Division 1 Champions in the 1970-71 season. In 1972, the club joined the Home Counties League and continued to play in the League until the formation of the current Combined Counties League in 1978.

That season, the most successful in the club's history, when they brought home seven trophies!

Despite the successes of the late 70s, the

club's fortunes declined alarmingly in the early 80s. Relegation to the Surrey Premier League was quickly followed by further demotion to the Surrey Combination. Bankruptcy was a real possibility. The introduction of a new management team in 1986, led by Chairman Graham Ellis, (of Hook United & Hook Youth) saw a rebirth of the club and return to former glory under the banner 'Chessington & Hook United FC' & ex-skipper Eric Wicks as Manager & Graham's son Paul assistant. By 1994, they were back in the Surrey Premier League, by just one point to make a welcome return to Senior football in the Combined Counties League. Eric stands down due to work commitments, Paul takes the reins. Chessington played through to the League Cup Final in their first season versus Ash United at Woking, only to lose 6-1.

They finished third in the Premier division '04/05 and the season after, made the 4th round of the F.A. Vase, beaten 2-1 by finalists

Cammell Laird at home in front of some 500 supporters.

Work was carried out during the close season to bring the ground up to level five standard and they now possess a stand for 200 spectators and also erected a covered area behind one goal.

Season 2006/07 had Chessington languishing in the relegation zone but 15 matches unbeaten saw them finish a creditable 10th position. 2007/08 season saw us use a huge number of players who had us playing some good attacking football, but the weather caught us napping, & with only one match in eight weeks, finally finished the season once again mid-table.

2008/09 & saw the introduction of a new manager after Paul Norris decided to step down after 10 years. Enter Glynn Stephens as manager. Glynn had been reserve team manager at Ashford Town (Middx) after a glittering playing career amongst some of the top Ryman teams, but he took to it admirably & took the team to its second highest finish of 6th, since we entered this competition.

Four years later & sadly, Glynn found the going tough & halfway through the 2011/12 season, parted company with the Club. In for Glynn came once again.....Paul (Nogsy) Norris!!

Nogsy changed the team around in an effort to save the Club from relegation, but all in vain as we finished third from bottom, only Banstead Athletic & Mole Valley SCR were below us, but our fate was in the hands of a relegated Whyteleafe team who were bottom of Ryman South but decided not to come down to CCL but enter the Kent League leaving us free to continue our quest

for success in this League! 2013/14, Nogsy left the Club in October that year, leaving his assistant Andrew Ellis to take charge.

Andrew brought in ex CHUFC player Darren Woods to assist him but to no avail as we were relegated to Division One finishing bottom of the Premier Division after flirting with that position for the previous two years. Division One was probably a breath of fresh air & Darren & Andy took it on the chin &



set out to earn promotion back to the Premier Division but with 19 games to play, it seemed a bridge too far until a run of just two defeats & two draws & a dramatic final game of the season when, 1-3 down at HT v Alton Town & Worcester Park beating Banstead, it all seemed in vain until a strange twist of fortune as the lads scored four 2nd half goals & Banstead won at Worcester Park to send the mammoth crowd of over 350 delirious, that means we finish third in the table above Worcester Park & back in the Premier Division, unfortunately, we couldn't sustain our Premier Division status, once again, our pitch lets us down leaving us to play 16 games in 34 days, a bridge too far as we end up 2nd bottom to be relegated to Div One. Fifth in the following season meant we'd be once again playing Division One in 2017/18.

In the 2021/22 season Andrew Ellis was appointed as manager following the departure of Glen Nichols.

Epsom & Ewell F.C. Brief Club History 1918-2022



In the summer of 2016, our club visited France and played a friendly against our twin town Chantilly, which was where the England team had been based before their Euro 2016 campaign. The players were able to meet Roy Hodgson and Gary Neville and performed admirably as ambassadors for our town.

In 2016/17 we started the season with an incredible 9-2 win at newly-promoted Bedfont & despite trailing 2-0 at halftime and went on to repeat our fourthplace finish in the League. In addition, we reached the League Cup Final but were defeated 4-1 by Westfield at Windsor FC.

However, in the summer of 2017, we suffered a large player exodus with a substantial number joining local rivals Sutton Common Rovers. Glyn was unable to replace them with enough players of real quality and three-quarters of the season were spent at the foot of the table.

His resignation in January 2018 led to the club promoting our Coach Neil Grant into the Manager's role and although he managed to get us off the foot of the table, relegation was always likely and was confirmed in mid-April; not a great way to celebrate our Centenary! The attempts at bouncing straight back did not start particularly well and Grant departed in October.

He was replaced by Simon Funnell, who stepped up from his Assistant role and took us to the Division One League Cup Final at Meadowbank. Unfortunately, the new season of 2019/20 started poorly and Funnell resigned at Christmas.

His Assistant Sam Morgan was appointed to the role and with his new Assistant Tim Moffatt, they oversaw an undefeated league run that took us up to the abandonment of the season.

The 2020/21 season commenced with another ground move, this time to Leatherhead's Fetcham Grove ground, although another seasonal curtailment left us in seventh place and we remained at Step Six, being transferred to the Southern Combination for the new season.

In August 2021, Sam Morgan was relieved of his duties after a slow start to the season. Barry Gartell was placed in interim charge while the club searched for a new manager. Barry and his brother Clive managed to get a good run of form under their belts. Winning 4 and drawing 1.

Darren Anslow was appointed as our new manager in September 2021 and was immediately impressed with a comfortable 4-0 win against Mile Oak in the FA Vase 2nd Round Qualifying. 2022/23 season saw a complete change at the top with Ex Horley Town manager Anthony Jupp coming in manager alongside Ex Horley Town Manager and coach Matt Chapman as coach.

Meanwhile, the search continues for a new ground back in the Borough.....
