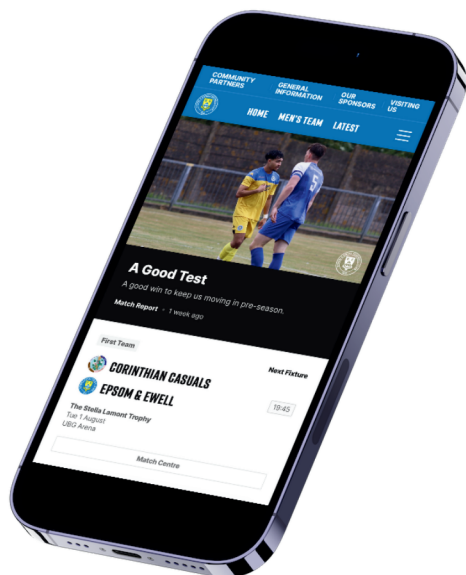

HOME GROUND: The New Defence



Horley Football Club was first affiliated to Surrey County FA in 1896. In 1903 another local club by the name of Gatwick Rovers was formed and the two clubs merged in 1908 with Horley retaining its name. Both these original clubs played in the same colours of red & black and it was not until 1912 that Horley adopted the colours of claret & blue that they still wear to this very day.

Intermediate football was tasted for the first time in season 1925/26 following an appearance in the Surrey County Junior Cup Final in 1923/24 and winning the Surrey County Junior Charity Cup in 1924/25. Following the Second World War, Horley was faced with the prospect of losing its home at "The Kings Head" ground and set about finding a new home. A local landowner by the name of Major A.L.N. Jennings became the Club's benefactor (and President) following his generous decision to give the club 10.7 acres of land in Smallfield Road. The land was held in trust for the people of Horley from 1947, in memory of those that died in the defence of their country, and the ground was appropriately named "The Defence".

Season 1950/51 saw Horley win the Surrey Intermediate League Eastern Section and seek election to the Surrey Senior League for season 1951/52. This excursion into Senior football was short lived as the Club found themselves back in Junior football by season 1954/55. Intermediate status was regained in 1956/57 season and in season 1957/58 they entered their first ever Youth team in the local Redhill & District League.

With the expansion of the village of Horley to a town the Club changed its name in 1974 to become Horley Town F.C. During this spell in senior football, Horley Town enjoyed their most successful period culminating in the winning of the Surrey Senior League title and Surrey Senior League Challenge Cup in 1976/77. The Club also reached the final of the Surrey Senior League Charity Cup in this season.

The club went on to compete in the London Spartan League and the Athenian League before returning to the Combined Counties League (formerly the Surrey Senior League).

The early 1980's saw the Club expand their interest in Youth football with the creation of Horley Town Minors. This relationship has grown over the years and is the reason why the Club has evolved into a well respected "community club" providing football for the people of Horley irrespective of age, sex or race.

In September 2003, Horley Town moved to their new ground, named "The New Defence" in deference to their old home, behind the New Leisure Centre. The Club has been in the Combined Counties League Premier Division since 2006 and, in addition to its Reserves and Youth teams, incorporates numerous successful junior football teams at all age levels.

2011/12 saw Horley Town FC do well in the FA Cup and finish in the top half of the CC League.

In 2014/15 the Club had a very successful season, finishing 6th under the management of ex-players Anthony Jupp and Chris Weller.

Club and League top goalscorer Ashley Nadesan scored 99 goals in two seasons before signing for League 1 Fleetwood Town. Ashley has since had a loan spell with Carlisle and returned to scoring goals for local side Crawley Town.

2015/16 was again another successful season for Town, but big changes came in the close season with Anthony Jupp and Chris Weller standing down and experienced ex Dorking boss Glynn Stephens stepping in as manager. More work was completed on the ground with a further 52 seats fitted to the stand behind the goal. 2017/18 saw the club get through to the fourth Round of the FA Vase.

For the 2019/20 season Anthony Jupp returned to his position as manager and the Club was moved to the Southern Combination League Premier Division but only for two seasons before being returned to the Combined Counties League Premier Division and finishing 7th.

In 2022 Martin Rapson (formerly U23 Manager) was appointed Manager for the 2022/23 season with Mitch Chatfield managing the U23

MATCH ACTION

Balham FC



Epsom & Ewell FC v Balham FC Combined Counties Premier South Saturday 16th March 2024

We made our way to The Mayfield Stadium, AFC Croydon's ground on Saturday 16th March to play Balham FC, who currently groundshare with The Rams. Having played fairly recently at the same ground against AFC Croydon we all knew that the pitch was never going to be conducive to free flowing attacking football. Therefore, the sparse crowd were not going to be richly entertained playing on that surface and it was probably safe to say that whoever scored first might go on to win the game (how true this would turn out to be).

We had to make various changes to the side that got us a valuable point away at Redhill the previous week. We were missing our central defensive partnership of last week in Reece Tierney and Callum Wilson and our main striker Carl Obiltey was out injured once again. In came from suspension Nick 'Tricky' Wilson and making his full debut Matt Macgillivray to take their places in centre defence and our goal scorer from last week in Zack Ingram-Wright led our forward line.

To say that the first half was unforgettable would be an understatement as both teams tried to play football on the aforementioned pitch and chances for each team were very few and far between. The half ended 0-0.

The opening exchanges of the second half were in a similar vein to the first half with neither side really creating any clear cut chances. Then in the 66th minute our hosts took the lead after we did not clear our lines or close down the cross which left the opposition player with an empty net to side foot his pass into the goal to take the lead.

Did this spur us onto greater things?, well straight after their goal we were awarded a free kick on the edge of the penalty area by the referee who we must report had a poor game (this is not the first time we have said this about an official this season). Anyway, the penalty area since football began has always been 18 yards in depth and it includes the six yard box, so any neutral watching the official would expect the defensive wall to be lined up 2 yards outside the 6 yard box – the calculation is rather simple $18 - 10 = 8$ so 2 yards outside the 6 yard box.

The referee paced out the 10 yards twice and the defensive wall was probably only 6-7 yards back, what is hugely frustrating as a player and supporter is that the linesman could intervene and inform the referee that the wall needs to be moved back further, but once again we witness that the linesman at this level really have no real part to play in any football match apart from when the ball goes out of play to award a throw in. What of the free kick; Adam Green took it and made the opposition keeper make a sharp save as he turned it around for a corner; nothing came of the resulting corner. The referee was being assessed by a FA official it would be good to see what that person's account of that incident would have been, but we will never find out.

There really was not much to report between Balham's first goal and their second goal in the 85th minute which owed itself to a huge deflection off one of our defenders and gave our goalkeeper no chance in our goal. The only other incident of note in the closing stages was another clear elbow from an opposition player on one of our players, at least this time the referee did show a yellow card to the assailant, who of course protested his innocence to the official – another official who did not have the strength to show a red card. The game ended 2-0 to Balham.

Where does this leave us? It was not a good day for us as the 2 teams below us both won so have closed the gap on us. Sheerwater have the same amount of points as us but a far worse goal difference and have played the same amount of games as and bottom of the table Colliers Wood are 4 points behind us but with 3 games in hand. Our next game is on Saturday 23rd March against Horley Town and it will be the first of four consecutive games we have at home out of our last 5 remaining fixtures. A win and a committed performance by our team is a must.

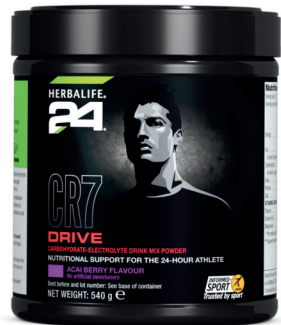

Epsom & Ewell FC v Redhill FC

Combined Counties Premier South

Saturday 9th March 2024

On Saturday 9th March we visited the home of Redhill Football Club (The Lobsters) for what looked on paper a tough match with our hosts vying for a play off position. Redhill had a very good recent record with only one defeat in their previous eight matches. We were coming into the game after our very impressive victory over mid-table Sandhurst Town the previous weekend.

As for our team, we welcomed back Faebian Witter in goal and on the bench we saw the returning Jerry Antwi after completing the required concussion protocols after an incident against Alton FC 14 days before. As for Redhill, they included various former Epsom players in their line up so there was bound to be a bit of familiarity between the two sides. This showed as our hosts were very aware of the attacking threat that Jaevon Dyer has and were keen to starve him of possession.

Redhill had bolstered their crowd by inviting several local schools to the game which should be applauded as they try to increase support from their local community. This is very similar to our own club who invite along various 'community partners' to our games whenever they are available.

We started the game in confident style and were certainly the better team in the opening exchanges. This included a shot that went just wide and a header that just went over the top of the cross bar. What is true is that in the first half chances were very few and far between for both sides and neither goalkeeper had a lot to do. The half ended 0-0.

As the second half began our hosts had come out with much more of an attacking intent and forced us back on several occasions, although we were not without carrying a threat to our higher placed opponents as a Carl Obiltey header rattled their crossbar. At our end, Redhill forced four consecutive corners and from the last one of those a Redhill player was unmarked and slotted the ball into the net from around 8 yards – 1-0 to Redhill on 57 minutes.

Our hosts were certainly on top in the next period of play and our goalkeeper kept us in the game with a very good low save.

We made a coupe of substitutions and one of those in Sirak Negassi had a good chance to level the scores but his shot went tamely wide. Then after a needless foul in the 85th minute by a Redhill player on the left wing, Adam Green put the resulting free kick into the box, it was headed on by Reece Tierney to an unmarked Thompson Adjemi who again headed the ball across the box to another unmarked Epsom player in Zack Ingram-Wright who was on hand to head the ball into an empty net for his first goal for the club. We have had a propensity this season to concede various late goals so the Epsom supporters amongst the crowd were probably in for a nail biting finish. When in fact the opposite was the case where we had a glorious chance to wrap up the three points after Negassi, Luke Miller and Carl Obiltey missed the chance to score our second goal and Redhill were able to clear the ball. That was the last chance of the game so it ended 1-1.

All in all a good point for us and we move onto to our next game against Balham FC next Saturday at the ground they share with AFC Croydon. Let's hope we can continue our good form and get something out of that game as well.

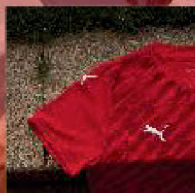

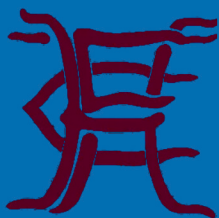
