


Founded in 1922 as the London & District Combination Football League, and renamed the Combined Counties Football League in 1978, the 2024–25 Cherry Red Combined CCL season will be the 47th in the history of the league. The league consists of four divisions for the second time, with a new Division Two being added to the Premier North, the Premier South and Division One. Division Two is intended largely for reserve and U23 sides, although it is also open to first teams.



Welcome to Badshot Lea



Founded in 1904, Badshot Lea Football Club began life as a village side based in the Surrey village of Badshot Lea. Records indicate that the club was formed following a meeting at the local village hall and initially played only friendly matches before formally affiliating to the Surrey County Football Association in 1907. From its modest origins the club gradually progressed: local leagues, Sunday fixtures, and a deepening community link.

Early decades

In the years through to the mid-20th century, Badshot Lea competed in the local junior and intermediate leagues. The club's first major successes came in the Surrey Intermediate League, where it won Division One in consecutive seasons, 1936-37 and 1937-38. These were formative years: establishing the club's competitive credentials, building a local following, and creating the culture that still underpins the club today.

A period of consolidation

For many years the club remained within the intermediate and local leagues, rooted in its community. It wasn't until 1978 that Badshot Lea achieved promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League Western and then progressed through the divisions over the following years. In 1986 the club reached the Surrey Premier League but, despite a strong points-total, the side was relegated after just one season—a reminder of how fiercely competitive non-league football can be.

During this era the club also achieved cup success: the Challenge Cup in 1987-88, the Invitation Cup in 1989-90, the Division Two title in 1992-93, and a second Challenge Cup win in 2000-01. (Though the league hierarchy remained modest, these accomplishments reflected a healthy, ambitious club.

Stepping up into senior football

The big leap for Badshot Lea came in 2002-03—when the club moved into senior football by joining the Hellenic League Division One East. This move was not without turmoil: the Football Association initially attempted to block the transfer, but the club's committee and the Hellenic League persevered and secured approval.

In 2005-06 Badshot Lea won the Supplementary Cup in the Hellenic League, and the following season (2006-07) they finished third and were promoted to the Hellenic Premier Division. After one season at that level, they were transferred to the Premier Division of the Combined Counties League in 2008-09.

Modern era: ground changes and promotion

At this point the club's long-absent ideal of a settled home began to crystallise. Until 2007 Badshot Lea played at the Badshot Lea Recreation Ground, but ground-grading rules forced them to leave. The following years saw a 'nomadic' existence: ground-shares with clubs such as Godalming Town FC, Ash United FC and Camberley Town FC.

In 2017-18 the club played at Camberley while their new ground was under construction at Westfield Lane in neighbouring Wrecclesham. In July 2019 Badshot Lea finally moved into their long-awaited home at Westfield Lane and hosted a friendly against Aldershot Town FC to mark the occasion.

On the pitch, the club continued to climb the non-league ladder. In the 2022-23 season Badshot Lea were runners-up in the Combined Counties Premier Division South and were promoted to the Isthmian League South Central Division as one of the highest-ranked runners-up across the Step 5 divisions.

Club ethos and community

Throughout its history Badshot Lea has remained a community-based club, grounded in the village ethos of Badshot Lea and the surrounding area. The expansion of youth teams and a colts' section in the late 1990s underpins its commitment to nurturing local talent. The move to Westfield Lane provided a stable base for the first team, but also a platform for broader club growth: youth, ladies & girls' sides, facilities and community engagement.

Looking ahead


As Badshot Lea enters its 120th year (1904-2024) the club stands at an exciting juncture: settled at Westfield Lane, competing at higher levels of non-league football, and still valuing its grassroots roots. Whether it's cup runs, league promotion battles or the development of young players through the ranks, the club's ambition remains bright.

Supporters walking through the turnstiles today might reflect on how far the club has travelled—from village friendly matches more than a century ago to Step 4 league football, a modern home ground and big-match aspirations. But the spirit remains the same: local lads, local supporters, a shared goal of sporting excellence.

For the fifth time in recent weeks, we failed to close out a game we should have won comfortably. A 1-1 draw meant another two points dropped, and by our count that's seven points thrown away since early October after leading for most of those matches.



More changes were needed thanks to yet more suspensions and injuries—an issue we urgently need to get on top of if we want a settled, confident side. Ben Grummitt kept his place in goal with Faebian still injured. Connor McShane replaced the suspended Luis Oliveira, and Ethan Nelson-Roberts came in for Saturday's man of the match, Harry Murphy. In midfield, Ryley Merritt started for Brendan Murphy-McVey, while Jason Vincent returned in place of Obasanjo Akinniranye. It was a boost to see Ethan Brazier back on the bench after a long spell out.

The swirling wind and rain didn't help, reflected in the season's lowest crowd of 68. We adjusted well early on. Jason Bloor earned a free kick after driving through tackles, but McShane fired over. On 10 minutes, Niall Stillwell fell awkwardly and dislocated his shoulder, requiring an ambulance—he'll likely be out for months. Brendan came on far earlier than planned.

We dominated the half. Ali Fofahan shot over from a half-chance, and Vincent was denied brilliantly by Selby after meeting Bloor's cross. Several dangerous corners came to nothing. Kionte took on a long-range effort instead of finding Nelson-Roberts in space. Finally, on 42 minutes, Fofahan was brought down in the box and buried the penalty low into the corner. We were good value for the lead and should have been two or three up.

Despite worsening rain, we stayed in control after the break. Merritt saw a good effort saved by the keeper's feet, and more corners went begging. Obasanjo and Tom Collins came on and helped create openings, but still the vital second goal wouldn't come.

Eversley grew in belief, knowing one chance might be enough—and it was. Their first real attack won a corner, and from the second delivery Ross Baker scored directly. We threw everything forward, made further changes, and created a flurry of late chances, but all were off target. Eversley went down to ten men late on, but it was too little, too late. The match finished 1–1.

That's now eight games without a win, and we sit 17th, uncomfortably close to the relegation zone with others holding games in hand.

The Salts finally earned their first league away win of the season with a breathless 4–3 victory at Sheerwater—a match that veered from confident control to near collapse before a dramatic late payoff.



Managerial changes brought renewed energy: Sami Nabbad returned in goal, new signing Tyler Robinson led the line, and Shane Dunne and Brendan Murphy-McVey restored balance in midfield. The Salts looked sharper and far more purposeful than in recent away outings.

It took just six minutes to make their mark. Robinson fed Jason Bloor, whose shot was parried, leaving Tom Collins to nod in the rebound for an ideal start. Murphy-McVey pressed relentlessly and Robinson's work-rate kept Sheerwater pinned back, though the striker was booked on 26 minutes for a late challenge. Collins and Ali Fofahan each went close before Sheerwater finally showed signs of life on 34 minutes, Ajibola dragging wide when well placed.

Epsom deservedly doubled their lead on 40 minutes in a moment equal parts design and mystery. Robinson won a corner, Collins swung it goalward, and the ball flew straight in—possibly via Nazareth or Aiwone, possibly via the keeper. However it crossed, the 2–0 lead was merited. A scrambled defensive scare and a yellow for Connor McShane closed the half. Ethan Brazier was introduced at the break to protect against a second booking.

Then chaos arrived. On 50 minutes Nazareth conceded an unnecessary free-kick, and Sheerwater took full advantage: Elliott York's header made it 2–1. Three minutes later, Nazareth lost the ball during one of his trademark runs, and Harvey Valter punished the mistake to level. Two goals lost in moments. Tempers flared soon after when Collins was pulled back without reward, sparking a tussle with Larkin; both were booked once calm returned. Changes followed as Epsom tried to steady themselves.

Their response came on 65 minutes. Fofahan laid the ball off to Murphy-McVey, who launched a looping effort from 25 yards that sailed over the keeper to restore the lead. More subs on 78 minutes preceded another wobble: on 85 minutes George Mackie lobbed Nabbad after confusion between the centre-halves and the advancing keeper. At 3–3, Epsom's away woes loomed again. But two minutes later Andrew Herring's forward ball ricocheted kindly into the path of Callum O'Keefe, just onside. He rounded the keeper and finished coolly to seal a dramatic 4–3 win.

A pulsating contest, but a deserved first away victory—earned through early dominance, resilience under pressure, and late composure when it mattered most.

The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban: being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving antisocially; threatening behaviour; use of obscene or abusive language; persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures; racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment; fighting; entering the field of play before, during or after the game; throwing any missile or object onto the field of play; and setting off any flare or firework.

Strictly Forbidden

The following are strictly forbidden and may result in immediate eviction and a ban for repeat offenders: the consumption of alcohol in bottles, cans or glasses in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground; climbing onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure; obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes; playing ball games in areas populated by ground visitors; only service animals are permitted at Chalky Lane and must be kept on a leash. Vehicles must ensure they do not block emergency vehicle access.

The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of the offence and solely at the discretion of the Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through the Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.


