Good evening all. Thanks again for spending your evening supporting the team. Words can't express how grateful we are for all of the support we've received, and it makes such a difference to the boys.



## Mutton's Musings



#### Round up from the Combined Counties League

First, a word on Eastbourne Borough, our recent FA Cup conquerors. They face a tough tie this Saturday away at Sholing FC, and their fans face an even tougher trip—82 miles down the A27. Anyone who knows that road will sympathise: set off Friday afternoon for a 3pm Saturday kick-off and, with the endless roadworks and roundabouts, you might just make it by Sunday! Best of luck to them for both the journey and the match.

Last weekend many of our division's clubs were in FA Vase action, though six had already departed earlier. More followed them out: Camberley Town, Chipstead, Corinthian Casuals, Eversley & California and Sutton Common Rovers. The Casuals' defeat was a real upset, going down away to Sutton Athletic in front of just 50 spectators. Through to the next round, however, went Abbey Rangers, Balham and Tooting & Mitcham. The draw will be announced shortly.

Back to league matters. The table is beginning to take shape, though we remain the division's least active side with only six matches played, while others have already reached ten. Cobham, after their win against us on Tuesday, now sit top on 18 points from seven games. Two points back are Abbey Rangers, with Corinthian Casuals in third on 15 after a last-gasp winner over Sheerwater. Redhill and Fleet Town round out the playoff places on 14 points. Behind them lie 12 teams, all within six points of the chasing pack—including ourselves. Guildford City prop up the table on four points from ten matches.

One midweek fixture promises to shake things up: Balham host Fleet Town on Wednesday. A Fleet win would lift them to second on 17 points, though Balham may have other ideas.

Looking at last weekend's results, the highest drama came at Thatcham Town, who lost 6-2 at home to Knaphill. Abbey Rangers staged a fine comeback, overturning a 2-0 deficit after just 29 minutes to win 3-2, their winner arriving in the 67th minute before a crowd of only 56. Chipstead enjoyed a comfortable 3-0 victory over Guildford City, with our former striker Carl Oblitey scoring twice. He now leads the division's scoring charts. Tadley Calleva, like ourselves with games in hand, nearly snatched an away win at Camberley Town, only to be denied by an injury-time penalty that made it 2-2. Still, the draw lifted them out of the relegation places with six points.

Finally, I like to cast an eye further afield for notable results, and one certainly stood out in the FA Vase. Barnoldswick Town thrashed Sunderland West End 10-1. Barnoldswick compete in the North West Counties Premier Division, playing their football at the memorably named Silentnight Stadium. One wonders whether Sunderland West End managed a restful night after that drubbing!

## Welcome to Chipstead




Founded in 1906, Chipstead Football Club has been a cornerstone of the Surrey football community for over a century. The club's early years saw them compete in local leagues, achieving notable success by winning the Surrey Junior Cup in the 1897–98 season.

In 1962, the club joined the Surrey Intermediate League, where they played until joining the new Surrey Premier League in 1982. They were subsequently runners-up on three occasions and won the League Cup three times. In 1986, Chipstead moved up to the Combined Counties League, winning the league's Challenge Trophy in their first season. They went on to win the title in 1989–90 and were runners-up the following season, winning the Challenge Trophy again in 1990–91. The 1992–93 season saw them finish as runners-up and win the Premier Division Challenge Cup, with the Challenge Cup won again in 1994–95. They were league runners-up again the following season. After winning the league for a second time in 2006–07, the club were promoted to Division One South of the Isthmian League. As a result of league reorganisation, they were placed in the South Central Division in 2018.

The club's home ground, High Road, has witnessed countless memorable moments, including the installation of a 100-seat stand in 2004 to replace an old wooden stand. There is also covered standing for 150 installed behind one goal. The ground currently has a capacity of 2,000, of which 150 is seated and 200 covered.

Beyond the pitch, Chipstead FC boasts a thriving community presence, with over 20 youth teams and a women's team, the Chipstead Ladies. The club has been recognized multiple times for its community engagement, earning awards such as the London FA Charter Standard Community Club of the Year.

As Chipstead FC continues to grow, it remains dedicated to developing players and fostering a strong community spirit.

The standout event of the evening was the naming of 16-year-old Damian Čech, son of Premier League legend Petr, in goal. He replaced Faebian Witter, still recovering from concussion sustained in Saturday's FA Cup defeat. Both teams were also out of that competition, so neither wanted to exit two tournaments in four days.



Manager Max Johnson made several changes: Ethan-Nelson Roberts came into defence, pushing Emmanuel Limpo into midfield for the injured Niall Stillwell. Callum Wilson replaced suspended Toby Young, while Obasanjo Akinniranye and Kallum Peart made first starts. Andrew Herring also came in for the injured Brendan Murphy-McVey.

The game was even but disrupted by questionable refereeing. Two yellows were handed out in the first ten minutes, with two more before half-time. A forearm smash on Oba seemed red-worthy but wasn't given. Ashford's first corner came on 11 minutes and ended with a shot high over the bar. Limpo then beat three players before being fouled, but the free kick caused no danger. On 23 minutes Kionte cut in from the right, but his effort curled wide. Ashford's best first-half chance fell to Mark Bitmead, but he scuffed wide. Neither side looked likely to score, and it was 0-0 at the break.


Town threatened early in the second half, but the turning point came on 50 minutes when Luis Oliveira was controversially sent off. He won the ball, but Ashford's bench protests influenced the referee. Down to 10 men for the second time in four days, The Salts nevertheless struck first. A move on the left ended with Herring firing home his first for the club after Adam Green's effort had been blocked.

Ashford equalised within 10 minutes, exploiting the extra man as substitute Armani Church finished a backpost cross. Johnson then made changes: Ayran Kugathas, returning from long-term injury, replaced Herring; Jack Torbett came on for Oba; and Luke Miller for Limpo. The referee later evened things up, sending off Ashford's James King for a second yellow after a foul on Peart, leaving it 10 v 10.

Čech, tidy throughout, showed his confidence rushing out to clear a long ball. Chances came at both ends, with Ashford going closest late on when Danyaal Iqbal's stoppage-time free kick shaved the bar.

Green, Wilson, and Dundas scored our first three. Čech then dived left to make his first save. Ayran bravely took the fourth, converting for 4-2. Čech sealed man-of-the-match honours with another stop to his right, sending us into the last 16.

Afterwards, Petr Čech praised the "hard-fought, even contest," clearly proud of his son. The joint assistant managers also praised the side's resilience, particularly in scoring first despite the red card. With injuries mounting and suspensions looming for Green and possibly Oliveira, a Saturday break comes at the right time.



## Match report v Cobham

We faced our landlords Cobham FC on Tuesday, though on this occasion we were the away side. A chilly evening greeted us, and once again our line-up looked very different, with injuries and suspensions continuing to bite hard. In fact, the number of first-team regulars watching from the stands could easily have made up over half our usual starting side.



The side was captained by Ethan Nelson-Roberts, who marked his 100<sup>th</sup> appearance in this match. Two new signings, Jake Brown and Jason Vincent, began on the bench but would both feature later. We knew the task was huge: Cobham sit top of the division and are among the favourites for promotion after narrowly missing out in last season's play-offs.

The first half played out much as expected, with us doing most of the defending against Cobham's dangerous attack. They pressed strongly, but we held firm. Our few ventures forward brought little reward, though there was one golden moment: Kallum Peart burst through on the left and found himself one-on-one with the keeper. Unfortunately, his scuffed finish made for a comfortable save, and the chance was gone. Half-time arrived with the game goalless, a testament to our defensive effort.

The restart, however, brought immediate disappointment. Barely into the second half, Cobham broke our resistance. A slick move took out three of our players, and the resulting curling strike flew into the top corner, leaving us 1-0 down.

But the game then took a dramatic twist. The same Cobham scorer saw red for a reckless, high challenge on Ethan Nelson-Roberts, who was making his 100th appearance for us. The tackle, more suited to an MMA cage than a football pitch, left Ethan needing hospital treatment for a head wound, and he was forced off. He didn't leave hospital until 3am following precautionary checks.

With Cobham reduced to ten men for over twenty minutes, a flicker of hope emerged. Could we snatch something against the odds? Sadly, that optimism was short-lived. With just seven minutes left, Cobham's leading marksman, Derek Hayford, pounced to double their lead and effectively seal the contest.

We did at least create one late chance. Substitute Jason Vincent rose well to meet a cross, only for the Cobham keeper to produce the save of the night, clawing the ball away spectacularly. Had that gone in, the final few minutes could have been very interesting.

In the end, though, the game finished 2-0 to Cobham, strengthening their grip at the top of the table. For us, it was another reminder of the challenges we face with a patched-up side. Still, there were positives in the resilience shown for long stretches, and the debuts of Brown and Vincent offered a glimpse of what lies ahead.

## Ground Regulations 2025-26



#### Spectator Code of Conduct

All spectators attending home matches are required to read and comply with this Code of Conduct, and to respect the same principles when attending our away fixtures at other clubs. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of this Code of Conduct, the rules and regulations of The Football Association and The Combined Counties League. The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate or necessary at their sole discretion. Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and, in extreme cases, heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

#### Entering and Leaving the Ground

If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately, do not block in others, and in particular do not block our neighbours' access to their houses. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late at night, and do not litter the area. Do not attempt to bring flares, fireworks or any other dangerous items into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and confiscate any prohibited items found. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. Do not attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground, or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

#### Within the Ground

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Do not obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Do not stand in seating areas or block access gangways or steps. Do not behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and do not bring the Club into disrepute.

The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban: being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving antisocially; threatening behaviour; use of obscene or abusive language; persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures; racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment; fighting; entering the field of play before, during or after the game; throwing any missile or object onto the field of play; and setting off any flare or firework.

#### Strictly Forbidden

The following are strictly forbidden and may result in immediate eviction and a ban for repeat offenders: the consumption of alcohol in bottles, cans or glasses in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground; climbing onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure; obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes; playing ball games in areas populated by ground visitors; allowing any animal to roam off the leash within the ground confines; and parking any vehicle that blocks emergency vehicle access.

The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of the offence and solely at the discretion of the Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through the Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
