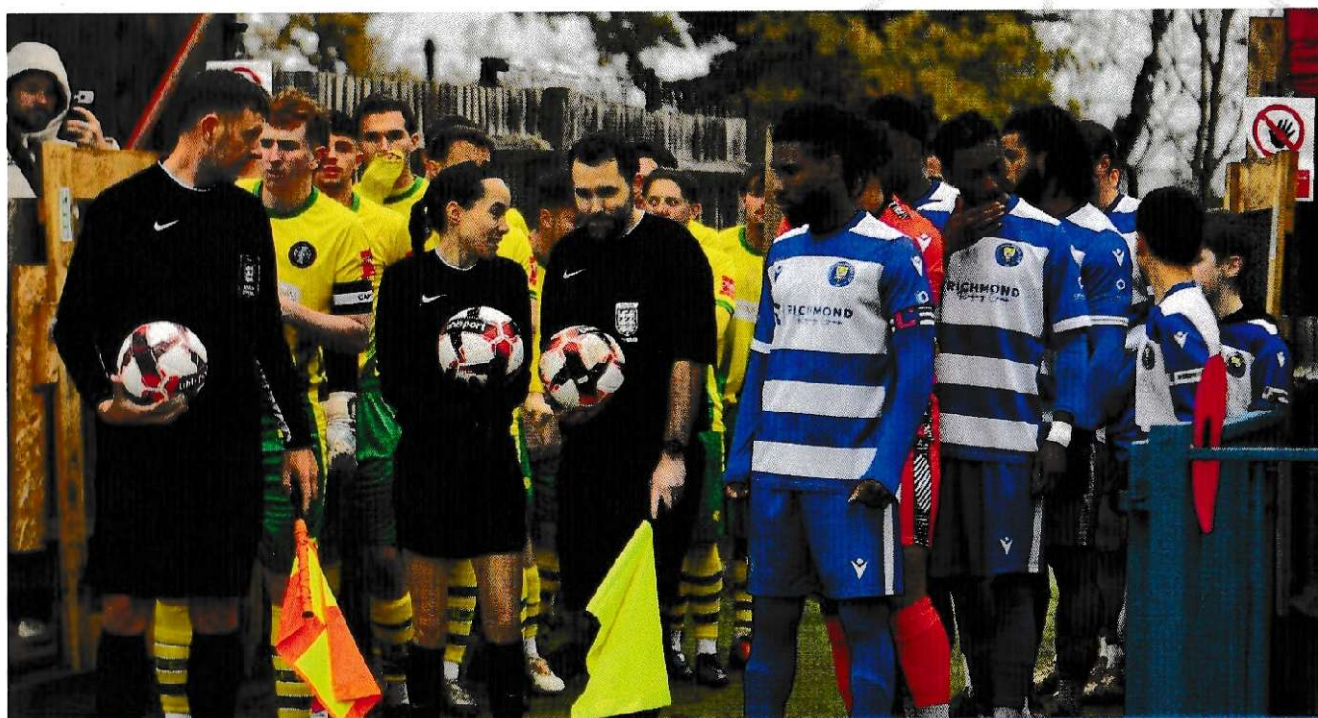

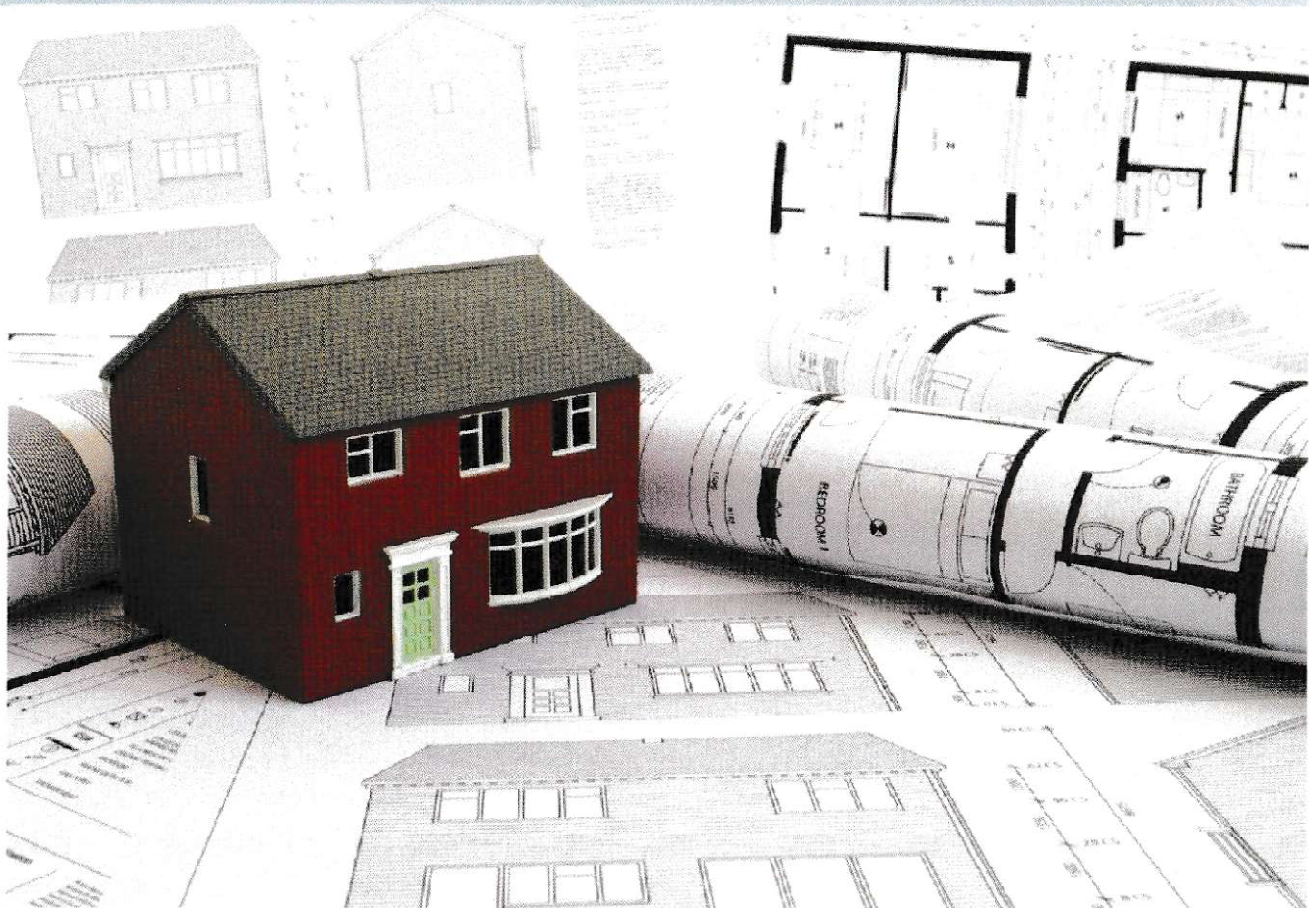

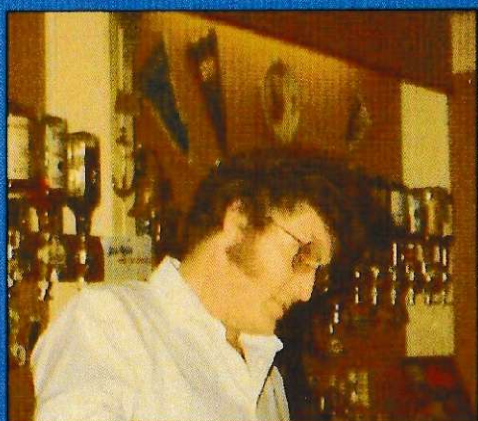

We welcome you back to Chalky Lane for our league fixture against Cobham FC in what seems like a while since our last home game with postponements and our last home game being abandoned as the second half was about to begin.

We started off with a trip to Tooting and Mitcham to play on a pristine surface and although a slightly disjointed first half which saw us 2-0 down to a controversial penalty decision. Founded in 1922 as the London & District Combination Football League, and renamed the Combined Counties Football League in 1978, the 2024-25 Cherry Red Combined CCL season will be the 47th in the history of the league. The league consists of four divisions for the second time, with a new Division Two being added to the Premier North, the Premier South and Division One. Division Two is intended largely for reserve and U23 sides, although it is also open to first teams.

Welcome to Cobham



Founded on 5 November 1886, Cobham Football Club has a long and proud tradition as a village-side turned respected non-league institution. The club was born when a group of villagers associated with the local coffee tavern came together — with the local vicar offering to supply a football to get things started.

Early Years & Local Leagues

In its earliest decades, Cobham played in various local competitions around the village, reflecting its grassroots beginnings. The club's first major success came in the late 1920s, when it clinched the Division One title of the Kingston & District Football League in both the 1928–29 and 1929–30 seasons.

In the 1930s, Cobham progressed to the Surrey Intermediate (Central) League, where they lifted the League Cup twice: in 1933–34 and again in 1935–36. Their upward trajectory continued when, in the 1937–38 campaign, they gained entry into the Surrey Senior League — marking the club's first venture into truly senior non-league football.

War-Time & Post-War Challenges

With the outbreak of World War II, Cobham temporarily merged with the local Avorians Sports Club, forming "Cobham Avorians" to ensure football could continue during those difficult years.

After the war, the club settled at the village Recreation Ground. That changed in 1955–56, when Cobham relocated to what is now known as the Reg Madgwick Stadium on Anvil Lane (Leg O' Mutton Field). The road name inspired the club's nickname — "the Hammers."

Though the club had hoped for success, the decades that followed were often challenging. In the Surrey Senior League, Cobham endured a number of tough seasons, with finishing-bottom appearances recorded in several campaigns.

Stepping Into the Modern Non-League Era

In 1978, the Surrey Senior League was restructured into the newly formed Home Counties League; a year later, it was renamed the Combined Counties League (CCL), a competition in which Cobham has competed ever since.

During this era, the club experienced both highs and lows. The late 1990s marked a resurgence: in 1998–99, Cobham finished runners-up in the CCL, coming agonisingly close to the title on goal difference.

In 2001–02 the Hammers lifted silverware — winning the Combined Counties League Premier Division Challenge Cup with a victory over Bedfont in the final.

The Ground — Reg Madgwick Stadium

The Reg Madgwick Stadium remains the spiritual and physical heart of Cobham FC. Floodlights were installed in 1997–98 and inaugurated with a friendly against local side Woking F.C. The ground currently holds a capacity of roughly 2,000 supporters, and in 2004 the club added a main stand; in 2016 a further 100-seat stand was erected.

The stadium wasn't always named as such — the renaming honours Reg Madgwick, a long-serving former player, committee member and fundraiser, who sadly passed away in 1995; his ashes were scattered on the pitch in tribute. Interestingly, the club retained the “Hammers” nickname as a nod to the Anvil Lane/Anvil-forged imagery tied to their home.

Cobham's best runs in national competitions have been modest but notable. Their best in the FA Cup came on multiple occasions (2002–03, 2006–07, 2010–11, 2020–21, 2025–26) when they reached the First Qualifying Round. In the FA Vase, their finest show came in 2020–21 when they reached the Fifth Round.

Recent Times & Revival

After a difficult 2008–09 season, in which Cobham were relegated from the Premier Division to Division One, the club spent several seasons rebuilding. The turnaround came in 2017–18, when Cobham secured promotion back to the Premier Division as Division One runners-up — again on goal difference, showing the resilience and fighting spirit embedded in the club.

Most recently, in the 2024–25 season Cobham finished fourth in the Premier Division South, qualifying for the promotion play-offs. They reached the semi-final — beating Redhill on penalties — before falling narrowly 2–1 to the Jersey Bulls F.C. in the final.

Community & Youth Development

Cobham never lost sight of its roots as a community club. In 2015, under a new committee, the club expanded its junior structure: launching multiple junior teams and introducing an Under-23 side to provide a pathway for local talent. That expansion was part of a broader philosophy — giving footballing opportunity to local children and nurturing the next generation while retaining the club's community values.

The Legacy of Cobham FC

From humble beginnings in a village coffee tavern to its present-day status in the non-league pyramid, Cobham F.C. is a testament to community, continuity and resilience. The Hammers have weathered difficult seasons, relocated grounds, even merged temporarily through wartime — yet always returned, always endured. Today, at the Reg Madgwick Stadium — and through its thriving junior and youth setup — Cobham remains not just a football club, but a community institution. A place where the love of the game endures, and where generations of Cobham villagers and visitors alike come together under the red and black, energised by the same spirit that sparked those first matches way back in 1886.

Player to Watch — Derick Hayford

When the referee's whistle blows at the Cobham F.C. match today, all eyes will be on attacking-midfielder Derick Hayford — a creative spark with a knack for scoring when it matters. Comfortable operating between the lines, he combines technical skill with composure in front of goal and remains a constant threat to any defence.

Why Hayford stands out:

- In August 2024, he produced a powerful 25-yard strike to earn Cobham a narrow but deserved 1–0 victory away at a strong side in Guildford City F.C. — a performance widely praised as decisive.
- He never shies away from a big moment. In the 2025 Cup Final for the Combined Counties League Premier Cup, it was Hayford who headed Cobham further ahead, helping secure the club's first silverware in over two decades.
- His scoring ability is matched by his consistency: match-reports this season show him repeatedly finding the net — including a composed finish to wrap up a 2–0 away win for the Hammers in September 2025.

But it's not just about the goals.

Hayford's work rate off the ball, his movement between opposition lines and his willingness to take on defenders make him a dual threat: an attacking midfielder who both creates and finishes. He links well with the forwards, drops deep to help circulation, and has the vision to unlock defences with through balls or late runs into the box.

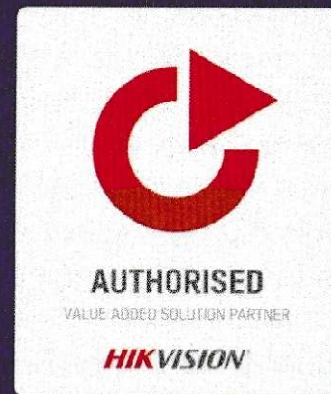
In short: Hayford possesses the kind of versatility every team dreams of — an engine in midfield, a goal threat at the edge of the penalty area, and a player who rises to big occasions. As Cobham strive for promotion this season, Derick Hayford's form could be the difference-maker. If he's on his day, opponents will know — and fans will see.

Round up from the Combined Counties League

As I mentioned in my last Musings most teams were approaching or had approached and exceeded the halfway point in our season. There are still a few teams after yesterday's round of matches who are still to reach that point (Alton, Fleet and Redhill). We are of course getting to the stage in the season where fixtures will be subject to inclement weather and the inevitable postponements; this was the main reason for the league administrators to try and 'front load' the fixtures to the better weather at the start of the season – only time will tell if this pays off.

Back to the action that did take place last Saturday and the pick of the fixtures were the top two teams meeting at the Reg Madgwick Stadium where Cobham took on in form Tooting and Mitcham; Cobham ran out 2-0 winners to extend their league at the top of the table 13 points with two games in hand. This was Cobham's first double of the season having thrashed Tooting at Imperial Fields back on the 5th August 4-0. Our contact who was at the game informed me that it was not a great game, but Cobham deserved to win. The Tooting defeat gave Knaphill the opportunity to grab second spot with a good 2-0 win at home to Horley Town. Abbey Rangers bounced back from their defeat to us last Tuesday evening with a 2-1 victory away at Camberley Town courtesy of a 91st minute goal. Redhill make up the play off quartet having not played and do have at least 2 games in hand over their play-off rivals. Corinthian Casuals were in the play-off spots until they succumbed to a 81st minute equaliser against Badshot Lea.

Turning to the bottom of the table, of the six teams in that area, 3 of the teams all lost and 3 did not play due to postponements or fixtures not available to the FA Vase taking place last Saturday. Therefore, Guildford remain bottom on 9 points with Thatcham Town in 19th place on 17 points.

As I mentioned above it was the next round of the FA Vase last Saturday and our divisions only representative Fleet Town had to travel to Rotherhithe in South East London near the River Thames and lost to their hosts on penalties 8-7 having drawn the game at 2-2 with two goals late in the second half in front of nearly 270 spectators. Our victors in the previous round (Eastbourne United) had to travel to Whitstable Town on the Kent Coast and lost 3-0 in front of over 620 spectators.

I mentioned in earlier Musings that I would follow the FA Cup journey of the teams who we might have encountered on our journey (wishful thinking!!) - our victors Eastbourne Borough were knocked out in the next round by Boreham Wood who then went onto defeat League Two, Crawley Town comprehensively 3-0 and were rewarded with another home tie against Newport County – publishing deadlines prevent me from that result so it will have to wait until I write again.

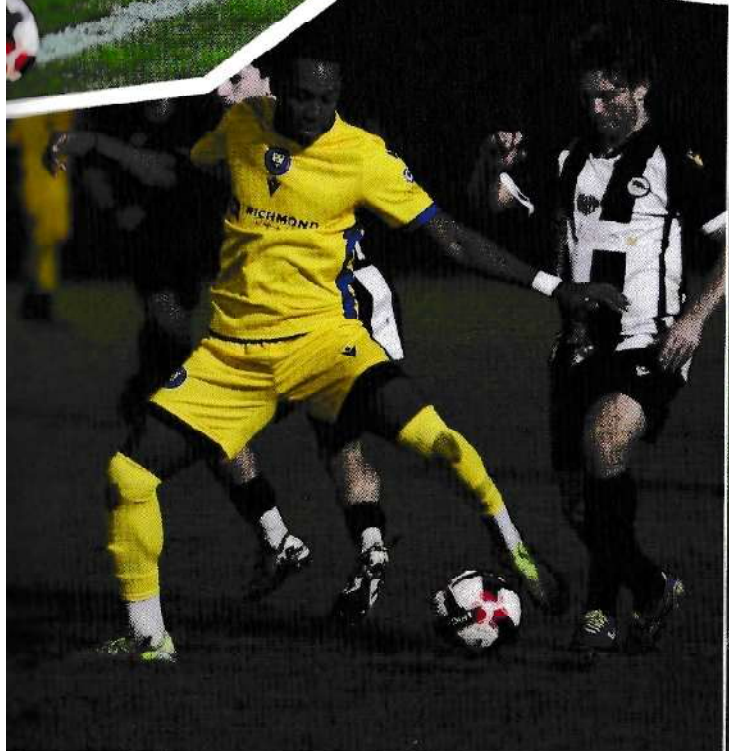

A perfect away performance. We took on high-flying Abbey Rangers at a wet and windswept Addlestone Moor on Tuesday 2nd December. The match was in doubt until the late-arriving referee inspected the pitch just half an hour before kick-off. Ground Regulations 2025-26



Spectator Code of Conduct

All spectators attending home matches are required to read and comply with this Code of Conduct, and to respect the same principles when attending our away fixtures at other clubs. The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate or necessary at their sole discretion. Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and, in extreme cases, heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

Entering and Leaving the Ground

If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late at night, and do not litter the area. Do not attempt to bring flares, fireworks or any other dangerous items into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and confiscate any prohibited items found. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. Do not attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground, or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

Within the Ground

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Do not obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Do not stand in seating areas or block access gangways or steps. Do not behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and do not bring the Club into disrepute.

The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban: being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving antisocially; threatening behaviour; use of obscene or abusive language; persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures; racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment; fighting; entering the field of play before, during or after the game; throwing any missile or object onto the field of play; and setting off any flare or firework.

Strictly Forbidden

The following are strictly forbidden and may result in immediate eviction and a ban for repeat offenders: the consumption of alcohol in bottles, cans or glasses in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground; climbing onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure; obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes; playing ball games in areas populated by ground visitors; only service animals are permitted at Chalky Lane and must be kept on a leash. Vehicles must ensure they do not block emergency vehicle access.

The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of the offence and solely at the discretion of the Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through the Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
