Welcome to Corinthian Casuals



Corinthian Casuals Football Club occupies a special place in the history of English and world football. Formed in 1939, the club is the direct descendant of two of the most influential amateur football institutions ever created: Corinthian Football Club and Casuals Football Club. While Corinthian Casuals may now compete within the modern non-league pyramid, its roots lie at the very heart of football's moral, cultural, and sporting development.

Corinthian FC, founded in 1882 by N. Lane Jackson, was created with a clear and idealistic purpose: to improve the England national team by bringing together the best amateur players of the age. At a time when football was becoming increasingly competitive and commercial, Corinthians stood firmly against professionalism. They famously refused to enter leagues or compete for trophies, believing football should be played purely for the love of the game and the honour of representing one's club and country.

This philosophy became known as the "Corinthian Spirit", a code of sportsmanship that prioritised fair play, humility, and respect for opponents and officials. Corinthians were renowned for acts that would be unthinkable today, including deliberately missing penalties awarded unfairly or allowing opponents to score if a goal was deemed unjust. Despite their refusal to compete for silverware, the club's quality was unquestionable; Corinthian FC regularly defeated top professional sides and supplied more England internationals than any other club of their era.

Their influence extended far beyond England. Corinthians toured extensively across Europe, Africa, and South America, spreading both footballing techniques and sporting values. Most famously, their 1910 tour of Brazil inspired the founding of Sport Club Corinthians Paulista, one of the largest and most successful clubs in world football. To this day, the Brazilian club honours its English namesake, creating a unique and enduring international bond.

Casuals FC, founded in 1883, shared Corinthian ideals but took a more pragmatic approach to competition. The club embraced structured football and played a key role in shaping the passing game that would become a hallmark of English football. Casuals were pioneers in adopting Saturday football and helped standardise fixtures at a time when the sport was still finding its organisational footing. Casuals FC enjoyed tangible success, most notably winning the FA Amateur Cup in 1905, defeating Clapton in the final. They also produced numerous international players and were widely respected within amateur football circles for their style of play and sporting conduct.

By the late 1930s, however, amateur football was facing decline. Changing social conditions, the growth of professionalism, and the looming threat of war made it increasingly difficult for amateur clubs to sustain fixtures and finances. For both Corinthian and Casuals, a merger offered survival and continuity. In 1939, the two clubs united to form Corinthian-Casuals FC, later simplified to Corinthian Casuals FC..

Welcome to Corinthian Casuals



Almost immediately after the merger, the outbreak of the Second World War halted competitive football, delaying the club's true beginning. When football resumed after the war, Corinthian Casuals joined the Isthmian League, which had become the leading competition for amateur clubs in southern England. The club's early post-war years were defined by rebuilding and adaptation as football evolved rapidly around them. A major milestone came in 1946, when Corinthian Casuals moved to King George's Field in Tolworth, a ground that has remained the club's home ever since. The move provided long-term stability and allowed the club to establish deep roots within the local community. King George's Field became more than just a stadium; it became a symbol of tradition, continuity, and belonging.

On the pitch, Corinthian Casuals experienced periods of success and challenge. The club won the Isthmian League Division Two title in 1953–54, earning promotion and reaffirming its competitive credentials. Over subsequent decades, the Casuals moved between divisions as the non-league structure expanded and reformed, adapting to changes that gradually eroded the distinction between amateur and professional football.

Despite these shifts, Corinthian Casuals remained committed to their heritage. The club retained the famous chocolate and pink colours, inherited from Corinthian FC, making them one of the most distinctive teams in English football. More importantly, they continued to uphold the values of respect, sportsmanship, and inclusivity that defined their predecessors.

The modern era brought renewed visibility. A standout moment came in the 2007–08 FA Cup, when Corinthian Casuals reached the First Round Proper for the first time in their history. Drawn away to Millwall, the Casuals played at The Den in front of a national audience, a landmark occasion that showcased the club's enduring relevance and spirit.

Internationally, interest in the club has grown, particularly from Brazil. Supporters of Corinthians Paulista have made pilgrimages to Tolworth, and friendly matches, shared merchandise, and cultural exchanges have reinforced the unique global connection between the two clubs. Few teams in world football can claim such a legacy-driven international following.

Today, Corinthian Casuals FC competes within the English non-league system while maintaining strong community ties and a volunteer-driven ethos. The club continues to develop youth football, engage with local supporters, and act as a custodian of football history.

More than a results-driven institution, Corinthian Casuals is a living embodiment of football's original ideals. In an era dominated by money, media, and global brands, the club stands as a reminder that football's true power lies in integrity, respect, and shared passion. Corinthian Casuals FC does not merely remember history—it actively carries it forward, one match at a time.

Player to Watch: Andre Coker – Corinthian Casuals FC

Andre Coker is a player who embodies the energy, ambition, and attacking intent of Corinthian Casuals. A dynamic forward with pace to burn, Coker has become a constant threat to opposition defences and a focal point for the Casuals' attacking play. Whether operating through the middle or pulling wide to stretch the game, his direct style makes him one of the most exciting players to watch at King George's Field.

What immediately stands out about Coker is his speed and work rate. He presses defenders aggressively, closes down space quickly, and is always willing to chase lost causes—qualities that resonate strongly with the Corinthian Casuals ethos. His movement off the ball is intelligent and purposeful, allowing him to exploit gaps in defensive lines and create opportunities not just for himself, but for teammates arriving in support.

Technically, Coker combines his athleticism with a growing composure in front of goal. Comfortable running at defenders, he has the confidence to take players on one-v-one and the awareness to pick the right moment to shoot or pass. His ability to carry the ball at pace makes him particularly dangerous on the counter-attack, where a single turnover can quickly become a clear scoring chance.

Beyond individual attributes, Coker's attitude and mentality set him apart. He plays with visible determination and pride, embracing the responsibility that comes with leading the line. Even when chances are limited, his willingness to battle, hold the ball up, and link play gives Corinthian Casuals an outlet and helps drive the team forward during difficult spells.

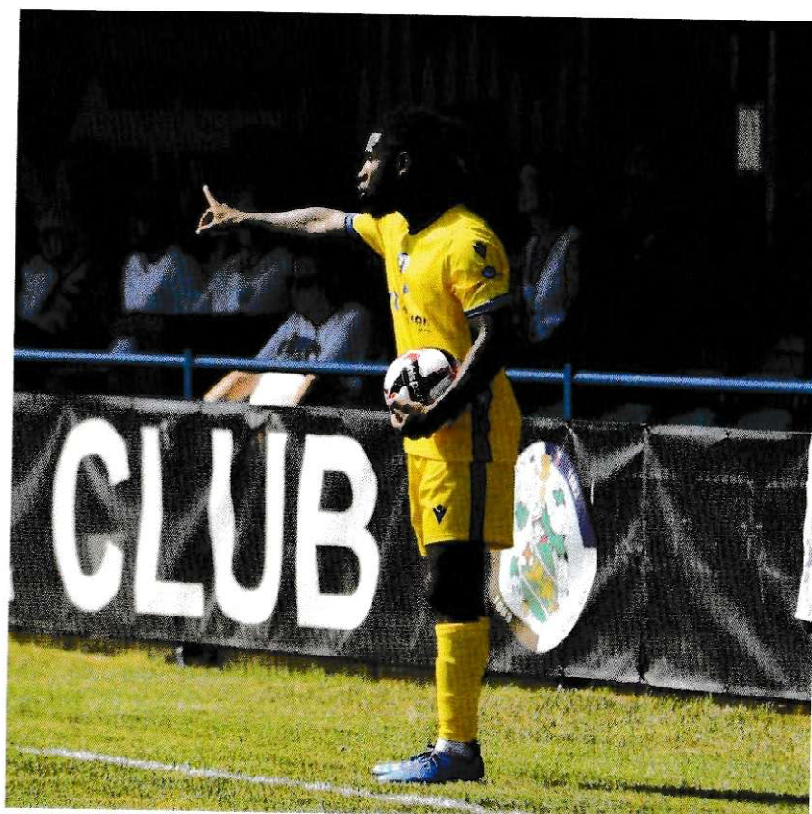

Five changes were made to Saturday's side, and once again constant disruption through injury and suspension may have played its part. Curiously, there were no yellow cards shown, which could suggest composure – or equally, a worrying lack of fight.

The game began reasonably enough with Tyler Robinson breaking through early on, but his finish flew high and wide. Oba and Luis Oliveira combined well down the right, but poor delivery into the box meant nothing came of it. At the other end, Ben Grummitt was forced off his line to clear, but on five minutes Badshot took the lead. Slick passing down the left ended with the ball being volleyed across goal and tapped in at the far post by Luis Hamblin. 0-1.

From that point we struggled to cope with Badshot's movement and pace out wide, while our own passing was rushed and inaccurate. Grummitt made further saves and Nelson-Roberts produced a last-ditch tackle, but Badshot doubled their lead when Hamblin picked up the ball in midfield and slipped Vangrove through to finish calmly. Four minutes later it was 3-0, a simple cross finding an unmarked No.10 with no pressure applied.

We went in at the break three down, having failed to seriously test Badshot keeper Roan Strong. The second half followed a similar pattern. Aiwone cleared one effort off the line, but a long ball soon led to a fourth when Vangrove was brought down in the box, Hamblin converting the penalty. Two minutes later Stan Jones turned smartly from a throw-in and fired in a fifth.

Substitutions made little impact, although Robinson forced Strong into our first save of the night. Badshot sat back and late on were awarded a second penalty, Ben Jordan sending Grummitt the wrong way to complete a miserable evening.

This was a sobering result that demands a response.

This was a far more attritional contest, but one we deservedly won with a second-half strike.

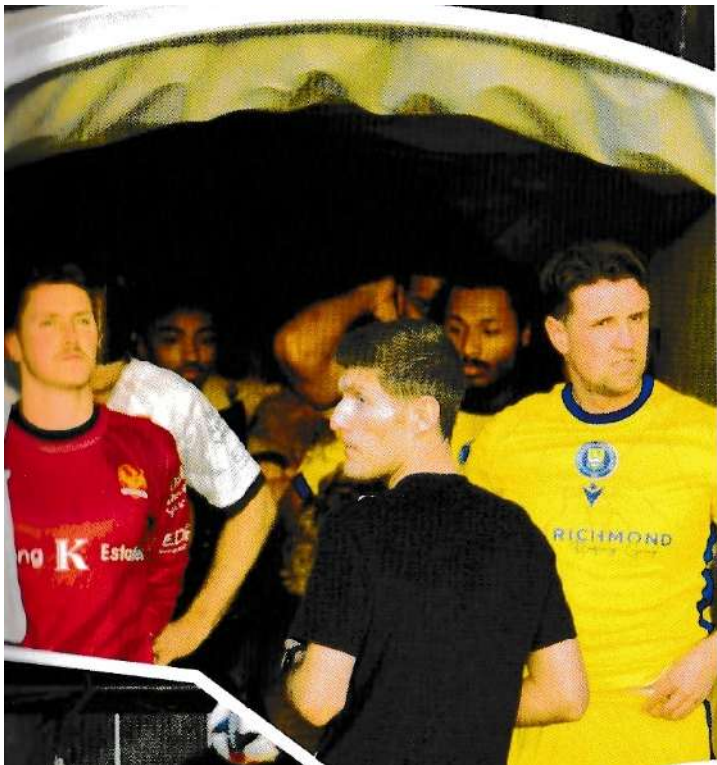

Jason Bloor was replaced by Karl Bailey on 50 minutes, and Obasanjo Akinniranye came on for Dundas eight minutes later as we continued to press. Our reward arrived on 63 minutes when Robinson broke down the right and delivered a cross for Akinniranye, who showed great composure to slot the ball home between two defenders.

Balham responded with changes of their own, while Callum O'Keeffe replaced Ralph on 74 minutes. Late drama arrived on 87 minutes when Robinson was sent off for an alleged elbow following consultation between referee and assistant. The decision appeared harsh, a view shared by both Robinson and the Balham player involved.

Despite playing out lengthy added time with ten men, we held firm to secure a valuable three points. The win moves us onto 28 points, with our league position unchanged but momentum very much restored.

Ground Regulations 2025-26



Spectator Code of Conduct

All spectators attending home matches are required to read and comply with this Code of Conduct, and to respect the same principles when attending our away fixtures at other clubs. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of this Code of Conduct, the rules and regulations of The Football Association and The Combined Counties League. The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate or necessary at their sole discretion. Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and, in extreme cases, heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

Entering and Leaving the Ground

If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late at night, and do not litter the area. Do not attempt to bring flares, fireworks or any other dangerous items into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and confiscate any prohibited items found. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. Do not attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground, or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

Within the Ground

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Do not obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Do not stand in seating areas or block access gangways or steps. Do not behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and do not bring the Club into disrepute.

The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban: being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving antisocially; threatening behaviour; use of obscene or abusive language; persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures; racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment; fighting; entering the field of play before, during or after the game; throwing any missile or object onto the field of play; and setting off any flare or firework.

Strictly Forbidden

The following are strictly forbidden and may result in immediate eviction and a ban for repeat offenders: the consumption of alcohol in bottles, cans or glasses in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground; climbing onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure; obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes; playing ball games in areas populated by ground visitors; only service animals are permitted at Chalky Lane and must be kept on a leash. Vehicles must ensure they do not block emergency vehicle access.

The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of the offence and solely at the discretion of the Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through the Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
