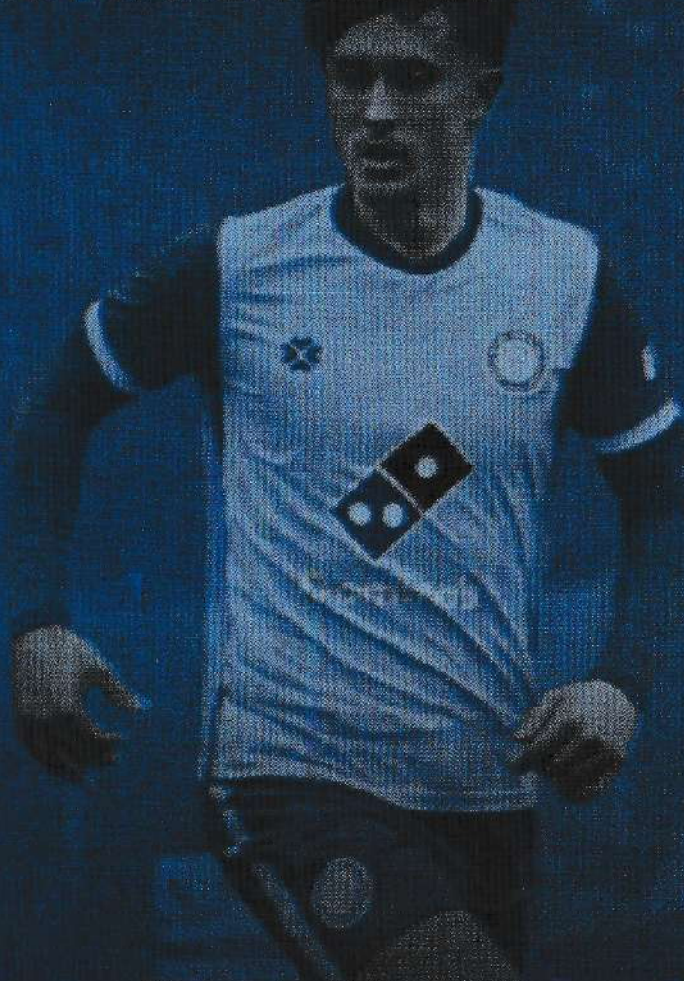

# DUGOUT DISPATCHES

## THE MANAGER'S PRE MATCH VIEW

GOOD AFTERNOON AND WELCOME TO THE EASY AS HGV STADIUM. A WARM WELCOME TO EVERYONE FROM MY FORMER CLUB EPSOM & EWELL, THEIR PLAYERS, STAFF AND SUPPORTERS, AND AS ALWAYS, WELCOME TO OUR SUPPORTERS.

We come into today's game off the back of a really strong week. Three wins against tough opposition in Badshot Lea, Chipstead and Tooting & Mitcham have given us real momentum at a crucial stage of the season. For a short time that put us into the top five, and although we've just slipped out again, we've got games in hand and everything still to play for.

That said, I'd always rather have the points on the board than be chasing, so the focus now is on continuing to pick up results and putting ourselves in the strongest possible position going into the final stretch.

We did exit the League Cup at the quarter-final stage on Tuesday night away at Wokingham, played in near darkness on a difficult pitch. In all honesty though, that may prove to be a blessing in disguise with the play-off push now the clear priority.

The squad is in a good place. We've added well in recent weeks, with Nick Boston and Sav Shah both coming in and making a positive impact straight away. We've rotated things slightly, which isn't something I tend to do too often, but it's worked and given us a bit of freshness at the right time.

The performances over the past week have shown real character. The win at Badshot Lea set the tone, and then to go to Chipstead on a Tuesday night, on a difficult pitch and in tough conditions, and get the result was very pleasing. We followed that up with an outstanding performance against Tooting & Mitcham, which was a top result against one of the strongest sides in the division.

We've got one more Tuesday night away game to come, which we'll be glad to get out of the way as availability is always a challenge midweek. After that, it's all about the final run-in. Six games to go, and everything to play for.

We'll need everyone with us for this final push, players, staff and supporters alike. Your backing makes a real difference, especially in tight games, and it certainly hasn't gone unnoticed over the past few weeks. The energy around the place has been excellent and it's something we want to keep building.

If we stay together, keep our standards high and approach each game with the same focus and intensity we've shown recently, we'll give ourselves every opportunity to finish the season strongly and achieve what we set out to do.

# COMBINED COUNTIES MATCH DAY PREVIEW

## WHAT TO LOOK OUT FOR: RESULTS THAT WILL BOOST THE BLUES

WITH COBHAM FC HAVING ALREADY WRAPPED UP THE TITLE, THE FOCUS NOW IS FIRMLY ON THE PLAY-OFF RACE, AND THIS WEEKEND'S FIXTURES COULD HAVE A BIG SAY IN HOW THAT SHAPES UP FOR US.

The most important job is our own. At home to Epsom & Ewell FC at the Easy As HGV Stadium, it's a must-win. With games in hand but sides around us picking up points, we need to keep putting results on the board and build momentum going into the final stretch. The pitch is in good condition and it's a ground where we've shown we can be strong.

The key fixture is Tadley Calleva FC v Abbey Rangers FC at Barlows Park. Both are directly in the play-off mix, so a draw is the ideal outcome, stopping either side from gaining ground. Tadley have been strong at home, so anything Abbey can take there would suit us.

Looking at the wider picture, teams currently occupying or pushing for the top five, including Tooting & Mitcham United FC, Knaphill FC and Redhill FC, are the ones we need to keep an eye on. Any dropped points from that group directly benefits us. Sheerwater FC probably have the best chance of taking something as they host Tooting on their 3G surface at Eastwood Leisure Centre, which can make it a tricky place to go.

Another massive one for us is Horley Town FC, who sit just above us. They face Corinthian-Casuals FC at The New Defence, and although Casuals are mid-table, they're capable of taking points off anyone, so we'll be hoping they can do us a favour there.



Redhill FC are also close enough to be a factor, so in their trip to Balham FC at Beechcroft Road, we'll be hoping they drop points and don't close in from below.

At this stage of the season, it's all about momentum. If we take care of our own result and a couple of these games fall the right way, it could be a very positive weekend for us in the push for the play-offs.

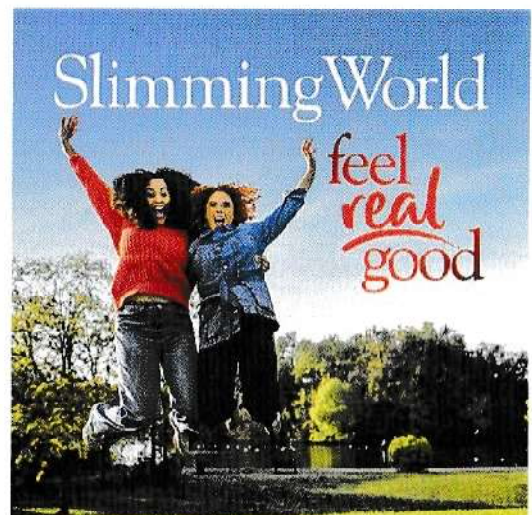

# THE NON-LEAGUE PYRAMID REPORT

## A NON-LEAGUE NEWS ROUND-UP FROM AROUND THE SOUTH

THERE HAS BEEN PLENTY HAPPENING ACROSS THE NON-LEAGUE GAME IN RECENT WEEKS, BOTH ON AND OFF THE PITCH.



At Step 2, the National League South continues to deliver drama. One of the standout stories has been at Torquay United, where former Premier League manager, and ex-Aldershot player, Neil Warrock stepped in briefly before the club moved quickly to appoint Jimmy Ball (son of Alan) as they look to maintain their play-off push. Elsewhere in the division, Dagenham & Redbridge have also made headlines with the appointment

of former England striker Andy Carroll as interim manager. The move follows a recent change in ownership structure and reflects the increasingly high-profile nature of clubs at this level, where investment and ambition continue to grow.

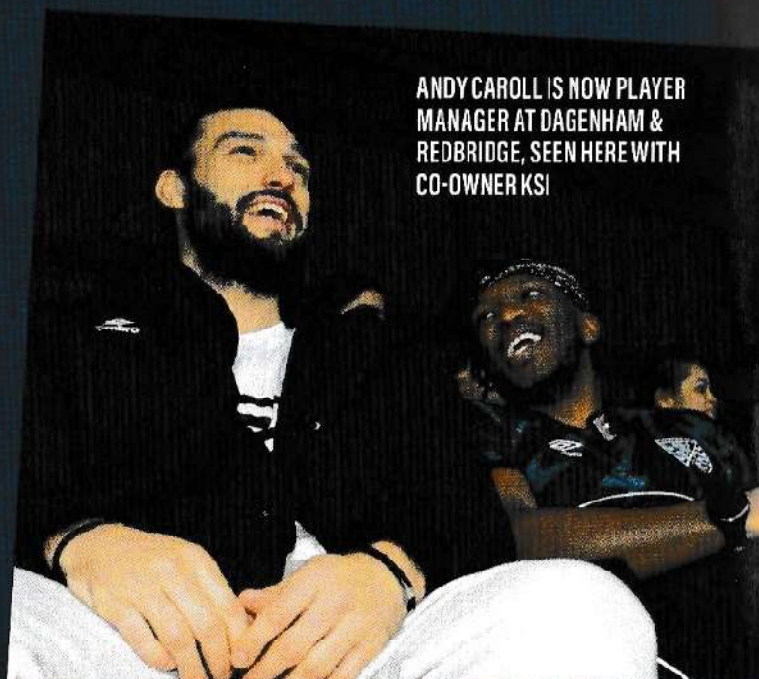
Off the pitch, innovation is also shaping the non-league landscape. The Isthmian League has announced plans to roll out 360-degree virtual tours of its clubs, allowing supporters to explore grounds digitally before visiting. It is a forward-thinking move that highlights how clubs and leagues are looking to improve accessibility and engagement with fans.

There have also been more challenging stories. In the Isthmian South East Division, Sittingbourne have suffered a significant

financial setback after part of their stadium was dismantled due to a payment dispute, despite the club having paid for the structure in good faith. It underlines the financial pressures that many clubs at this level continue to face, even during successful seasons on the pitch.

Meanwhile, with Non-League Day approaching at the end of March, attention is also turning to one of the calendar's key moments. The annual event continues to grow in profile, encouraging supporters to attend local matches and celebrate everything that makes non-league football unique.

What ties all of this together is the evolving nature of the non-league game. From managerial changes and ownership developments to digital innovation and financial challenges, the landscape is constantly shifting. On the pitch, the margins remain fine, and with only weeks of the season left, every result will carry increasing significance. The run-in is well and truly underway.

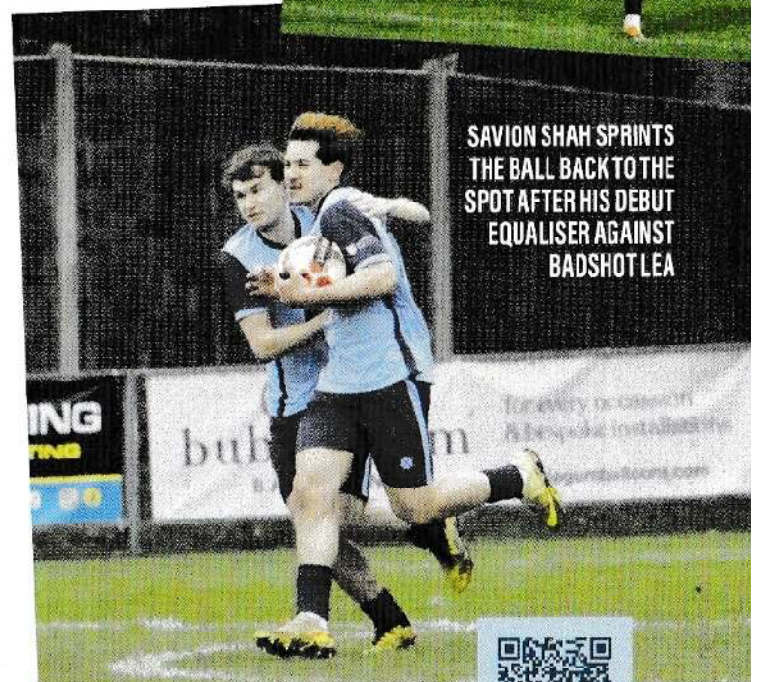

# WHO HAVE WE GOT TODAY?



## A POTTED HISTORY OF THE SALTS...

EPSOM & EWELL F.C. WAS FOUNDED IN 1918 AS EPSOM JUNIORS CRICKET CLUB, WITH A FOOTBALL TEAM FORMING LATER THAT YEAR. THE CLUB ENTERED COMPETITIVE FOOTBALL IN 1919 AND BECAME FOUNDER MEMBERS OF THE SUTTON & DISTRICT LEAGUE IN 1920.

Renamed Epsom Town in 1922, the club quickly entered a successful period, winning multiple local honours and progressing into intermediate and then senior football. By the mid-1920s, now based at West Street, the club had secured the Surrey Senior League title and went on to win the London League at the first attempt in 1927/28.

The interwar years were particularly successful, highlighted by an FA Cup First Round appearance in 1933/34, where a crowd of nearly 10,000 saw the club face Clapton Orient after an impressive qualifying run. League form remained strong throughout the decade, with several runners-up finishes and further cup success, including a dominant Surrey Charity Shield victory. Following the Second World War, the club reformed and resumed at West Street, competing in the Corinthian League and continuing to build its reputation with consistent performances and appearances in major cup finals. In 1960, the club adopted the name Epsom & Ewell F.C. in an effort to strengthen its identity and support across the wider borough.

The 1970s brought a significant resurgence both on and off the pitch. A new squad and renewed direction led to a Surrey Senior League double, followed by a memorable run to the inaugural FA Vase Final at Wembley in 1975, where the club narrowly lost in front of nearly 10,000 spectators. The success continued with a return to the Athenian League and subsequent invitation to join the expanding

Isthmian League. The club adapted quickly, winning Division Two at the first attempt and establishing itself at a higher level, eventually reaching the Premier Division. This period also delivered one of the club's standout achievements, lifting the Surrey Senior Cup in 1981, cementing its status within the non-league game.

After leaving West Street in 1993, the club entered a prolonged period of ground-sharing and transition, which brought challenges both on and off the pitch. Despite this, there were notable moments, including cup runs, promotions and competitive league finishes. The club spent time at several venues, including Banstead Athletic, Merstham and Chipstead, as it continued to search for stability and a long-term home.

In the 2000s and 2010s, Epsom & Ewell competed in the Combined Counties League, producing strong performances and regularly challenging near the top end of the table. A highlight of this period came in 2012/13, when the club won the Combined Counties League Cup, its first silverware in over three decades, following a strong run of form that also saw a club record sequence of league wins.

Recent seasons have brought further change, both in terms of management and location, with the club continuing its nomadic existence through groundshare agreements. However, there have been clear signs of progress on the pitch, including a return to Step 5 football, cup success and improved league performances. A strong finish to the 2024/25 season saw the club lift the Southern Combination Challenge Cup, providing further momentum.

Now competing once again in the Combined Counties League, the focus is on building consistency, strengthening ties with the local community and, crucially, securing a permanent home back within the Borough of Epsom & Ewell.

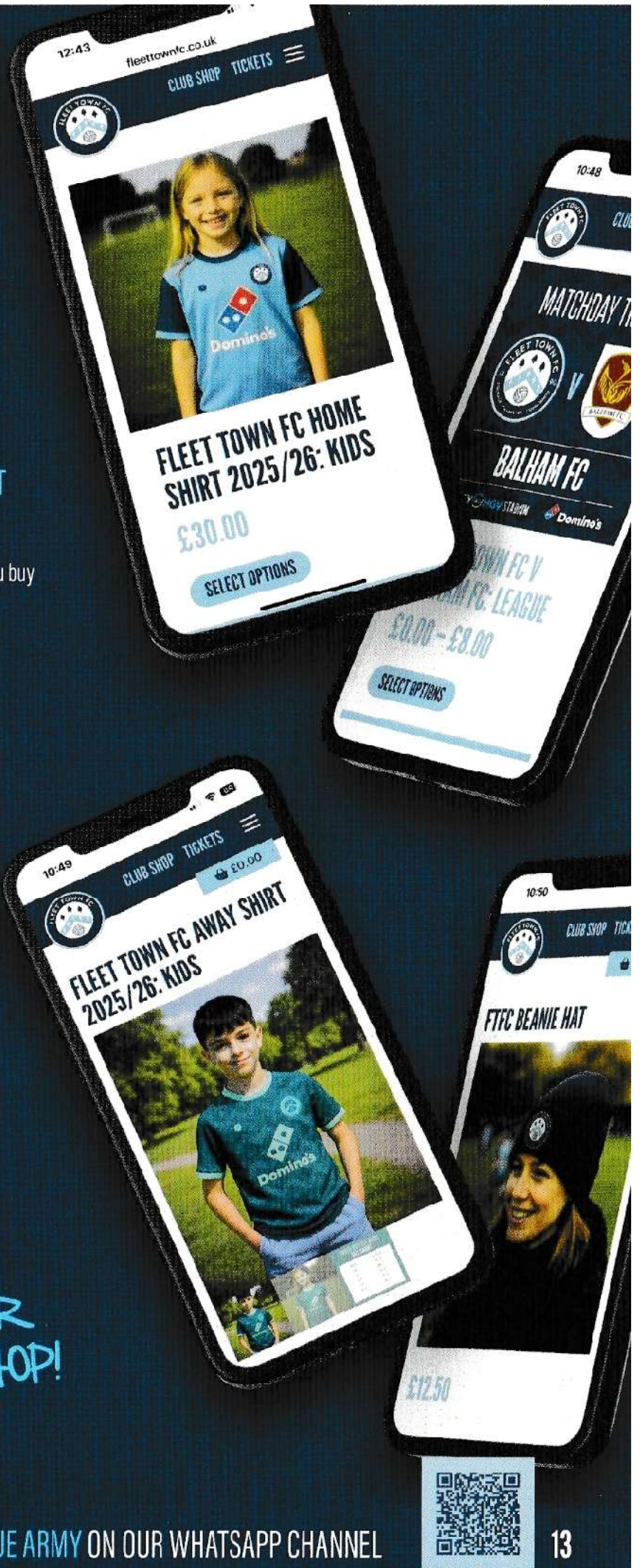
