




# From the Dugout




# City Chatter



## Guildford City Boys & Girls FC:

Regular supporters will be aware that the Senior club are now part of the Boys & Girls club. As part of this we formally welcome Chris Adams (pictured) back to the club. Chris is the Chairman of Guildford City Boys & Girls FC but has been unable to be actively involved in the senior set up here until now due to his coaching position at Sheerwater. However, Chris has now left Sheerwater, and he will initially be involved in team management with Carl.

**Player News:** We are disappointed that Charlie Robertson has left the club and signed for Knaphill. On the plus side we welcome defender Callum Hope. Callum was near ever present at Raynes Park Vale and he has more recently played for Ashford Town (Middx). We also welcome Daniel Emmanuel back from a lengthy injury. Daniel was one of the stars of our pre-season but who sadly was injured on the eve of the season. Another new face at the club is forward Bamidele Esan who comes to us highly recommended by our former player Darnell Jon-Peter.

## Southern Combination Cup Draw:

Following Wednesday's win against Godalming Town we are now drawn to play away at Camberley Town in the third round on a date yet to be decided.

**A History of Godalming Town FC:** To mark the 75th anniversary of the club author Jeff Brooks has written "A History of Godalming Town Football Club 1950-2025". The author has asked us to point out that the book has a chapter on the Godalming & Guildford incarnation 1992-2005 that might be of interest to City fans. ## Top Premier South Goalscorers: 15 goals

– Derrick Hayford (Cobham), Luis Hamblin (Badshot Lea), **12 goals** – Ryan Marklew (Cobham), **11 goals** – Eli Simpson (Cobham), **10 goals** - Arlie Desanges (Horley Town), Carl Oblitey (Chipstead), Kieran Rodgers (Tadley Calleva) and Henry Paxford (Eversley & California), **9 goals** – Adam Poynter (Alton), Max Oldham (Tooting & Mitcham United) and Harvey Valter (Sheerwater).



We were founded in March 1918 as Epsom Juniors Cricket Club and played throughout the summer. A change of name in July 1922 to Epsom Town F.C. heralded the start of a very successful era. Senior football was granted as we were unanimously accepted into the Surrey Senior League for 1924/25, where we finished third. In September 1925, the club relocated to the old Ewell F.C. ground at West Street, which was purchased through the generosity of our future President Robert Bradshaw.

In 1925/26 the Championship of the Surrey Senior League was attained, and the following season, we defeated Egham 1-0 at Egham in the League Charity Cup to complete a League and Cup "double".

In 1929 Redhill defeated us 3-2 in front of 4,600 at Guildford in our first Surrey Senior Cup Final, having seen off Wimbledon 4-1 in the semi-final! The thirties were a very successful era, and we won the Surrey Charity (Senior) Shield in 1933 with an impressive 5-0 win over Woking at Kingfield. However, the proudest moment of our pre-war history was an appearance in the First Round Proper of the FA Cup in 1933/34, when we lost 4-2 against Clapton Orient in front of a 9,485 crowd at the Lea Bridge Stadium. After the war, Epsom FC restarted, continuing in the London League and reclaimed West Street. In 1954 we reached the Surrey Senior Cup Final for the second time in our history, losing unluckily 2-0 to Corinthian Casuals in front of 6,159 at Selhurst Park.


In 1960 we changed our name once again to Epsom & Ewell F.C. But the sixties were full of poor results, and we were relegated in 1965. However, in 1973 we rejoined the Surrey Senior League. The new squad, including young striker Tommy Tuite, won the League Cup, and the following season, 1974/75 achieved a second Surrey Senior League "double". However, the season would always be remembered for reaching the Final of the inaugural FA Vase, where 9,500 saw

the Blues edged out 2-1 by Hoddesdon Town at Wembley Stadium. The Athenian League welcomed us back, and promotion was achieved in that first season. In 1976/77 we reached the Athenian League Cup Final, losing 1-0 at Chalfont St Peter. By then, we knew that we had been invited to join the expanding Isthmian League for 1977/78 and were placed in the new Division Two. In 1979/80 we won the Southern

Combination Cup 7-2 over Hampton on their pitch, where the opposition was blitzed by five goals from Tuite. The following season we finally won the Surrey Senior Cup in 1981, defeating Woking 2-1 at Tooting & Mitcham, although we just missed out on promotion. In 1983/84 we clinched a spot in the Premier Division as runners-up, although this time we missed out in the Surrey Senior Cup, defeated 4-0 by Sutton United in the Final at Imber Court. In 1993 a large chapter in our

history ended as we left West Street and moved in as tenants of Banstead Athletic. In April of 2010, we terminated our seventeen-year ground-sharing agreement with Banstead Athletic and spent two unspectacular seasons at Merstham F.C. before relocating to Chipstead F.C. for the 2012/13 season, where we would spend eight seasons. In 1981 we defeated South Park 3-0 at Farnborough to win the Combined Counties League Cup.

The 2020/21 season commenced with another ground move, this time to Leatherhead's Fetcham Grove ground. 2022/23 season saw us reach the play-off semi-final where we beat Selsey on penalties. In the final in front of almost 400 fans at Leatherhead FC we won 2-1 against Wick. Back in the CCL at Step 5 for 2023/24 we started a new ground share with Cobham FC, then for one year at Corinthian Casuals, then for 2025/26 at Chessington & Hook. Meanwhile, the search continues for a new ground back in the Borough....

# Match Review



There was a joint sigh of relief at full-time when Guildford finally claimed their first victory in 24 matches. It was a fully deserved win as well, although the loss of the Chipstead goalkeeper to a red card after only 15 minutes didn't harm City's cause. Daniel Fosu under hit a shooting chance early on and it was against the run of play when Chipstead took the lead through Tyrone Selormey who rounded the keeper to score with ease. Guildford weren't deterred and three minutes later the scores were again level. Daniel Fosu did well and the loose ball fell to **Kai Zini** who calmly slotted home. The same two players combined on 15 minutes in a move that culminated in the Chipstead keeper Mo Otuyo being shown a red card. Zini had chased a through ball giving Daniel Fosu a shooting chance which was saved by the diving Otuyo albeit just outside his penalty area. On 29 minutes City went ahead. Fosu had a shot blocked and the loose ball fell to **Kai Zini** who fired into the roof of the net. The visitors had a couple of long-range efforts that didn't threaten the goal, whilst Alex McLean's shot was blocked by stand-in goalkeeper Kamran Campbell onto the crossbar.

Guildford opened the second period brightly and should have scored through the otherwise impressive Callum Hope. A ball was played across the box after fine build up but Hope shot wide of the target. Five minutes into the half Guildford won a rare penalty. Naison O'Neill went down in a heap in the box and man of the moment Kai Zini stepped up to complete his hat-trick. Just ten players or not Chipstead weren't content to just play the game out and they came strongly into the game. A corner zipped right through the six-yard box without a touch, and Marvin Wood saved well low down at his near post. In the late stages Chipstead fired a number of challenging crosses into the box that a bruised Drake, Woolliscroft and Wood dealt with well. Going forward Kai Zini made a good arcing run that led to him shooting wide, whilst Marvin Wood couldn't hold a cross, but Tre Woolliscroft cleared excellently off the line. If there were any nerves they were settled on 88 minutes. From a



City corner the ball ricocheted around the six-yard box before falling to **Tre Woolliscroft** who netted from 15 yards.


Guildford City (1) 3

With probably their best performance of the season Guildford City beat off the challenge from neighbours Godalming Town to advance to the third round of the Southern Combination Cup. Right from the off City looked a rejuvenated side following their win at the weekend. Enjoying a lot of the ball Guildford's early efforts on goal were from long range that didn't especially threaten the visitor's goal. As the half developed Godalming themselves came more into the game without creating a significant chance on goal. The home side's passing though was impressive and on 38 minutes City took the lead. Josh Adjei's pace allowed him to win a ball in a threatening position. His pass to Kallum Peart saw the striker run into the box where he went down under a challenge for a penalty. Up stepped man of the moment Kai Zini to convert from the spot. Minutes later Zini nearly added a second when he dribbled deep into the box only to lose control with the goalkeeper advancing on him.



