

# From **THE SIDELINES**

## **MATCH REPORT CAMBERLEY TOWN 0 KNAPHILL 1**

Knaphill secured a hard-earned three points at Krooner Park as Michak Stanic-Stewart's second-half finish sealed a narrow victory over Camberley Town in the Combined Counties League Premier Division South.

Knaphill started on the front foot and controlled the opening 15 minutes. West was called into action early to deny Ross Murdoch as the visitors applied sustained early pressure.

Camberley responded and almost broke the deadlock when a cross from Stan Pickup found Jamie Hoppitt arriving at the far post, his header striking the foot of the post. Knaphill then felt they should have been ahead when a dangerous inswinging corner from Louis Collins was met by a Knaphill player, only for the effort to be cleared off the line by Hoppitt, with strong appeals for handball waved away by the referee.

As the half wore on, Knaphill lost their early rhythm and found it harder to create clear chances. The contest became more evenly balanced, with the physical nature of the game reflected in late first-half cautions for Connor Doona and Samuel Whitehead as both sides went into the break level.

Knaphill began the second half with renewed purpose. Rami Halloufi caused consistent problems down the right, while anything Camberley managed to clear was quickly dealt with by a firm and organised back four of Collins, King, Wensley and Stanic-Stewart, allowing the visitors to sustain pressure.

The breakthrough arrived on 58 minutes. A corner from Ross Cheek was headed on with West unable to hold the initial effort. Cheek reacted first to the loose ball, seeing his follow-up cleared off the line, before Stanic-Stewart arrived at the back post to smash the ball home.

Camberley made changes in response and attempted to force their way back into the contest, but Knaphill remained disciplined and well organised. Josh Hooks entered the referee's notebook for the hosts as the game continued to be played at a high intensity, while Harvey Keogh was largely untroubled throughout the second half.

Alfie Burton was introduced to make his Knaphill debut, while Thomas Harland-Goddard replaced Ross Cheek after a strong shift in midfield. Ben Mitchell also made an impact late on, holding the ball up well and winning valuable free-kicks higher up the pitch as Knaphill managed the closing stages. Cheek was cautioned late on as the visitors saw the game out.

# EPSOM & EWELL FC



The club was established in March 1918 as Epsom Juniors and played cricket during the summer of that year. At the end of the summer a football team was formed, joining the Surrey Junior League in 1919. Although they finished bottom of the table in their first season, they became founders of the Sutton & District League in 1920. Renamed Epsom Town in 1922, they were Premier Division Champions in 1922–23. The club subsequently transferred to the Southern Suburban League, which they won at the first attempt without losing a game. They then moved up to the Surrey Senior League. After finishing third in their first season in the league, the club won back-to-back league titles in 1925–26 and 1926–27, as well as winning the league's Charity Cup in 1926–27 with a 1–0 win over Egham.

After their success in the Surrey Senior League, Epsom moved up to the Premier Division of the London League in 1927, going on to win the division in 1927–28. They finished as runners-up in 1931–32 and 1932–33, also winning the Surrey Senior Shield in 1932–33 with a 5–0 win against Woking in the final held at Woking's Kingfield Stadium. They reached the first round of the FA Cup for the first time in their history in 1933–34, losing 4–2 at Leyton Orient. In 1934 the club was renamed Epsom, and they went on to finish as Premier Division runners-up again in 1934–35, 1936–37 and 1937–38. In 1949 the club joined the Corinthian League. They won the Surrey Senior Shield in 1954–55, beating Carshalton Athletic 1–0 in the final. The 1959–60 season saw the club win the league's Memorial Shield with a 2–0 win against Maidenhead United. In 1960 the club adopted its current name.

When the Corinthian League was disbanded in 1963, Epsom & Ewell joined Division One of the Athenian League alongside most of the other teams from the league. They were relegated to Division Two at the end of the 1964–65 season, having finished bottom of Division One. The club subsequently struggled in Division Two, finishing bottom in 1970–71 and 1971–72. In 1973 they dropped back into the Surrey Senior League. Their first season back in the league saw them finish as runners-up and win the League Cup. The following season, 1974–75, the club won the league and the League Cup, as well as reaching the final of the FA Vase, losing 2–1 to Hoddesdon Town at Wembley Stadium. The club were promoted back to Division Two of the Athenian League and were runners-up in their first season back in the division, resulting in promotion to Division One. In 1977 the club transferred to Division Two of the Isthmian League, which they won at the first attempt, earning promotion to Division One. In 1979–80 the club won the Southern Combination Challenge Cup, beating Hampton 7–2 in the final, which was played at Hampton's home ground.

Epsom & Ewell remained in Division One until the end of the 1983–84 season, when they were promoted to the Premier Division after finishing as runners-up in Division Two. They finished bottom of the Premier Division in 1985–86, resulting in relegation back to Division One. The following season also ended in relegation, with the club placed in Division Two South for the 1987–88 season. League reorganisation in 1991 saw them moved to Division Three, where they remained until another round of reorganisation resulted in the club being placed in Division One South. However, they were relegated to Division Two at the end of the 2003–04 after finishing bottom of their division. In 2006 they were transferred to the Premier Division of the Combined Counties League when Division Two of the Isthmian League was scrapped. In 2012–13 the club won the Combined Counties League Premier Challenge Cup with a 3–0 win over South Park in the final at Cherrywood Road.

# MATCH REPORT

## KNAPHILL 1 SHEERWATER 0

Knaphill retained the Dave Taylor Shield with a hard-earned derby victory, surviving sustained pressure before Ross Murdoch's second-half penalty settled a fiercely contested league encounter.

The game sparked into life early. Inside the opening stages, Elliott York went in with a dangerously high boot as Harvey Keogh came to claim the ball. With York's leg raised at head height, the referee produced a yellow card on 12 minutes, setting the tone for a tense and physical afternoon.

The first half belonged largely to Sheerwater. They played on the front foot, moved the ball with intent, and forced Knaphill to defend for long spells. The hosts, however, stayed disciplined, with the back four holding their shape and protecting the penalty area. The clearest opening arrived on 35 minutes when Keogh misplaced a kick straight to York with the goal momentarily begging. York struck powerfully but caught the outside of his boot, sending the effort wide.

Keogh made amends just before the interval. Harvey Valter found space outside the area and wrapped a curling effort towards the top corner, only for Keogh to react superbly, producing a one-handed save to tip the ball over the bar and keep the scores level at half-time. Sheerwater picked up where they left off after the restart.

With Sheerwater on top, Knaphill responded decisively from the bench, making four changes in quick succession. Alfie Burton replaced Rami Halloufi, Thomas Harland-Goddard came on for Igor Souza, Aidan King replaced Joe Throp, and Ross Murdoch was introduced for Sekou Toure. Burton was introduced against his former club, while Murdoch's arrival allowed Knaphill to move to two up front alongside Ben Mitchell, giving the hosts a clearer outlet and greater presence higher up the pitch.

Sheerwater almost responded immediately on the counter. Valter carried the ball out of his own half before sliding a through pass into the path of Leeks, who drove towards goal. Under pressure from King and Louis Collins, Leeks was forced into a hurried strike, lifting his effort over the bar as Keogh rushed from his line.

Five minutes later, Sheerwater threatened again. A long ball over the top from Mikhail McLaughlin allowed York to beat the offside trap. Keogh raced from his area to get a crucial touch ahead of York, but the danger was not over. Leeks picked up the loose ball and struck towards goal, his effort bobbling awkwardly in front of Keogh. The goalkeeper got a hand to it but could only divert it backwards, where Dale Burnham was perfectly positioned on the line to clear. Sheerwater continued to apply pressure. A free kick from outside the area was floated in by Leeks, and Rahman Ajibola flicked it on towards the bottom corner. Keogh again reacted sharply, getting down superbly to turn the ball around the post, before Knaphill cleared the resulting danger.

Two minutes later, the breakthrough arrived. A long throw into the box from Michal Stanic Stewart caused problems in the Sheerwater area. Callum Mackie headed clear, but only as far as Lowery, who allowed the ball to bounce as he attempted to deal with it. The clearance went straight up into the air and struck Lowery's raised arm, and the referee immediately pointed to the spot.

Ross Murdoch stepped up and struck the penalty firmly halfway up the left side of the goal, sending the goalkeeper the wrong way to give Knaphill the lead. Sheerwater were not finished. Three minutes later, a cross from Dan Boyden picked out Ajibola, whose header was directed towards the bottom left corner. Keogh got down sharply once more to make the save, before Burnham cleared the loose ball.

The visitors made late changes in search of an equaliser. The ball broke kindly for York inside the area and his shot flashed across the face of goal, with Burnham again alert to clear off the line. Acheampong then went close from close range, but Keogh was sharp at his near post to block the effort and deny Sheerwater once more.

Full credit to Sheerwater, who will feel frustrated not to have taken something from the game after creating so many openings. The ability to suffer and still deliver three points underlines why Knaphill remain second in the table going into the Christmas period.

# FLEET TOWN 1 - 1 KNAPHILL

## Knaphill left frustrated after stoppage-time equaliser at the Easy As HGV Stadium

The visitors started with intent and issued an early warning after 18 minutes. Collins floated a measured cross to the back post and Murdoch slid the ball past Gray, only for the assistant's flag to rule it out. Three minutes later, Harland-Goddard struck cleanly from the edge of the area, but Drinkwater dived in with a last-ditch block to deflect the effort over the bar.

Momentum was briefly checked midway through the half when Burnham was cautioned for a foul on 29 minutes, before Fleet's Avery followed him into the book shortly after for failing to stop his run and following through on Keogh after the goalkeeper had already claimed the ball.

A key moment arrived on 34 minutes when Louis Collins was shown a sin bin, forcing Knaphill to defend with ten men for ten minutes. Fleet enjoyed their strongest spell during this period and went close three minutes later as Postance met a cross with a firm header, forcing Keogh into an acrobatic fingertip save onto the bar.

As pressure built, King was cautioned for kicking the ball away after the whistle, before Fraser entered the book for a strong tackle from behind. Taylor was also booked as a feisty first half drew to a close.

Despite the disruption, Knaphill finished the half strongly and were rewarded in stoppage time. From a corner, King showed quick thinking under pressure to flick the ball back to the edge of the area, where Throp took one touch before whipping a superb strike into the net to give the visitors a deserved lead at the break.

The second half saw Knaphill continue to look dangerous on the counter. On 50 minutes, they broke quickly from a Fleet corner as King picked out Murdoch, who carried the ball powerfully into the Fleet half before sliding Halloufi through the middle. Clean through, he lifted his effort high over the bar. Six minutes later, Halloufi again drove forward, cutting in from the right before pulling the ball back to Murdoch, whose effort flew just over the bar.

Fleet responded a minute later when Avery struck powerfully from the edge of the area, with Wensley's deflection sending the ball onto the post. Throp was cautioned just after the hour mark for a late, mistimed challenge in midfield as the game became increasingly fractured.

On 68 minutes, Drinkwater drove into the Knaphill half before releasing Bartlett down the left. He weaved inside and fired towards the bottom corner, but Keogh reacted sharply to tip the effort around the post.

Knaphill came agonisingly close to extending their lead on 72 minutes. Collins whipped in a free kick from the left and Wensley rose superbly at the back post to beat Gray, only to see his header crash against the bar. The rebound fell to Murdoch, but Avery was on the line to block the follow-up and clear.

Knaphill looked to freshen things up as Burton was introduced to provide a more direct attacking outlet down the left. Harland-Goddard, who had put in a strong shift, was later withdrawn after covering significant ground in midfield.

Burke was booked during a scrappy spell late on, before Fleet were briefly reduced to ten men on 86 minutes when Kandi was sent to the sin bin. Knaphill were unable to capitalise and were made to pay in the closing moments.

In the second minute of added time, Fleet were awarded a free kick on the edge of the area following a clash involving King. Taylor rolled the ball to the side of the wall for the run of Bartlett, catching Knaphill expecting the shot. Bartlett squared across goal and Karczewski bundled the ball in at the back post to level the contest.

Fleet nearly snatched a winner moments later when Postance headed a corner towards the bottom corner, but Keogh got down well and bravely claimed the ball amid a crowd of players.
