## LARKFIELD & NEW HYTHE FOOTBALL CLUB

Larkfield & New Hythe Football Club were formed in 1961 and purchased its current ground in 1967.

In 2012 John Michel the Chairman of Larkfield & New Hythe FC and Adam Handy the Chairman of Larkfield FC Youth were instrumental in merging the two clubs for the mutual benefit of all the teams and the community. Larkfield FC who were established in 1976 have over 30 teams consisting of youth teams of both boys and girls between the age of 5 and 18, and also a Ladies team. This merger created a pathway for the youth players to play adult football and allowed the clubhouse facilities to be used by all.


The club was awarded the FA Charter Community standard status in 2015 and has an ethos to grow and support the club in the local Community whilst promoting the success of all the teams.

The men's first team were accepted into the Kent County League in 1996 and remained in Division 2 East for many seasons. A very strong team in 2016 just missed out on promotion but was successful in winning their first silverware in the Les Leckie Cup beating Rolvenden FC 3-2.

In 2020 the club was promoted to Division 1 of the Kent County League, and a new Sponsor, Committee and management team was put in place to push the Club for further promotion and ultimately into SCEFL. The plan was going very well with the team 7 points clear at the top of the league when Covid19 brought the season to an end. However, the club was undeterred and continued to upgrade the stadium to the level required for SCEFL Division 1 with new Floodlights, seated and covered standing.

Season 2021/22 and the club's hard work paid off with acceptance into the Southern Counties East Football League Division 1 at Step 6 of the non-league pyramid. In the first season the club had a tremendous effort finishing third in the league and reaching the playoff final, after beating Snodland in the first play-off game 1-0 in front of a then record crowd of 501. Unfortunately, the final was lost 2-1 aet to Sutton Athletic.

Season 2022/23 started well and for much of the time the 'Larks' were around top spot, but finally had to settle for a 5th placed finish and again the playoffs where they were defeated in the semifinal on penalties. The club had its best ever run in the FA Vase reaching the third round proper. Off the pitch improvements continued with a £100k clubhouse extension which was officially opened by MP Tracey Crouch in Feb 2023. Significant partner funding by the Football Stadia funds, KCC and Kent FA made this possible. Season 2023/24, and a new management team of Danny Lye and Michael Philips built a new squad.

which finally won us promotion to the Premiership at the third attempt. We had our highest position finishing second and once again the playoffs where we eventually beat Staplehurst Monarchs in the final 1-0 and with a new record crowd of 835.

Season 2024/25 the first in the Premiership and a good start meant for much of the season we were in the playoff positions, but a poor run towards the end meant we finished a credible 10th. Danny Lye stepped down in December and Micky Philips took on the reigns with Fraser Walker as his coach. Our first season ever in the FA Cup where we won through 2 pre-qualifying rounds to eventually get to the 1st qualifying round where we lost to step 3 Cray Wanderers after taking them to a replay. Finally our biggest win in the clubs history saw us win the Kent Senior Trophy 3-2 against Whitstable Town at the Gallagher.

At the end of 2023, the club signed a contract for a proposed new stadium 1km away from the current site with 3G main and training pitches, a new clubhouse and a 250 seater stand, all subject to successful planning permission for both sites which should be decided by the end of 2025.

Should we be successful today the next round is already drawn and it will be another home tie against either South Park (Reigate) or Newhaven on the 16th Aug.



Good afternoon and welcome to today's game.

Looking back at our opening game of the season last Saturday, there were plenty of positives to take, but also some clear reminders of the standards we must maintain if we want to achieve our goals this year. For the first 40 minutes, we were outstanding, we dominated the game, controlled possession, and fully deserved our 1-0 lead. That level of performance is exactly what I want to see from this group; fast, fearless, and disciplined football.

However, switching off for just a few minutes before half-time cost us. We conceded a soft goal, which was disappointing and frustrating, particularly because this was a pattern we saw too often last season, small lapses in concentration at key moments. It's these moments that can define a season, we've spoken openly about it as a group, and it's something we've already been working on in training focusing on defensive shape during transitions, maintaining communication at all times, and having the mental sharpness to close out halves and matches with authority.

In the second half, we allowed the opposition to gain confidence and, for the first 20 minutes after the break, we were second best, that's simply not good enough. But the biggest positive I take from the game is this: last season, we would have lost that match. This time, we dug in, stayed resilient, and got something from it. The fact the boys were devastated in the changing room after taking a point tells me everything about their standards and ambition this season.

We now turn our focus to the FA Cup and a fantastic challenge against Epsom & Ewell who have started their season outstandingly well. Playing in this competition is a privilege, and it demands that we approach the game with the right mentality from the first whistle to the last. Games are not won in 70 minutes they are won in 90 minutes plus added time and we have to show the character and discipline to see every moment through with the same intensity.

I expect us to be ruthless when we're on top, to stay switched on defensively at all times, and to react positively to setbacks when they come. It's about focus, resilience, and having the belief to finish the job when the opportunity is there. Last week's frustration showed us how fine the margins are, and I do not want to walk away from another game feeling like we've let those standards slip.

This FA Cup tie is another opportunity for us to show how much we've grown as a side, not just technically and tactically, but mentally. I know the boys are hungry to put things right, and I expect to see that hunger on full display today.

As always, thank you for your incredible support it means everything to the players and staff. Let's keep pushing the standards together and make this another game to remember



### **EPSOM & EWELL**

In the autumn 1918, Epsom Juniors F.C. came into being and played a handful of games from what is now known as Alexandra Recreation Ground. Competitive football followed as we entered the Surrey Junior League in 1919 and became founder members of the Sutton & District League in 1920.

A change of name in July 1922 to Epsom Town F.C. heralded the start of a very successful era. By now resident at the Horton Hospital Sports Ground, we were unfortunate to lose 2-1 after extra time at Dorking F.C.'s Pixham Lane ground to Caterham Mental Hospital in a replay of the Surrey Junior Cup Final. However, we won three other trophies that season, the Leatherhead Hospital Shield, the Sutton Hospital Cup, and the Epsom Hospital Cup. In addition, we also won the Sutton & District League, and under the forward-thinking of their visionary Chairman Hugh Bradley, we took the step into Intermediate Football, where we won the Southern Suburban League without losing a match. Senior football was granted as we were unanimously accepted into the Surrey Senior League for 1924/25, where we finished third.

In September 1925, the club relocated to the old Ewell F.C. ground at West Street, which was purchased through the generosity of our future President, Robert Bradshaw. In 1925/26, the Championship of the Surrey Senior League was attained, and the following season, we defeated Egham 1-0 at Egham in the League Charity Cup to complete a League and Cup "double". Election to the London League followed, and the title was claimed in the first attempt in 1927/28. Unfortunately, we were unable to repeat this, instead of finishing runners-up in 1931/32, 1932/33, 1934/35, 1936/37 and 1937/38. Cup Honours were limited, although, in 1929, Redhill defeated us 3-2 in front of 4,600 at Guildford in our first Surrey Senior Cup Final, having seen off Wimbledon 4-1 in the semi-final!

The thirties were a very successful era, and we won the Surrey Charity (Senior) Shield in 1933 with an impressive 5-0 win over Woking at Kingfield. However, the proudest moment of our pre-war history was an appearance in the First Round Proper of the F.A.Cup in 1933/34. Woking (after a replay), Nunhead, Tooting & Mitcham, Beddington Corner, and Leytonstone were defeated, and a crowd of 9,485 at the Lea Bridge Speedway Stadium witnessed a 4-2 loss against the hosts Clapton Orient. At the end of that season, we changed our name to Epsom F.C.

In 1960 we changed our name once again to Epsom & Ewell F.C. This was not because of any merger with Ewell & Stoneleigh as is often quoted, but was an attempt to increase support across the whole of the Borough.

The 1970's saw new squad, including young striker Tommy Tuite, which won the League Cup, and the following season, 1974/75, achieved a second Surrey Senior League "double". However, the season would always be remembered for reaching the Final of the inaugural F.A. Vase, where 9,500 saw the Blues edged out 2-1 by Hoddesdon Town at Wembley Stadium. The Athenian League welcomed us back, and promotion was achieved in that first season. In 1976/77, we reached the Athenian League Cup Final, losing 1-0 at Chalfont St Peter.

By then, we knew that we had been invited to join the expanding Isthmian League for 1977/78 and were placed in the new Division Two. Our first match under floodlights took place against Met Police in August 1977, and the title was clinched the following April, securing a move to Division One. In 1979/80, we won the Southern Combination Cup 7-2 over Hampton on their pitch, where the opposition was blitzed by five goals from Tuite. The following season a new clubhouse opened at West Street, and we finally won the Surrey Senior Cup in 1981, defeating Woking 2-1 at Tooting & Mitcham, although we just missed out on promotion.

In 1993 a large chapter in our history ended as we left West Street and moved in as tenants of Banstead Athletic. In April of 2010, we terminated our seventeen-year ground-sharing agreement with Banstead Athletic and spent two unspectacular seasons at Merstham F.C. before relocating to High Road home of Chipstead F.C., for the 2012/13 season, where we would spend eight seasons.

The season brought significant playing success as a slow start was followed by a spectacular run of form, including a club record of 12 straight league wins, which put us at the top of the table for over a month before a tricky run-in resulted in a final position of fifth. However, any disappointment there was tempered by the club's first silverware since 1981 when we defeated South Park 3-0 at Farnborough to win the Combined Counties League Cup. On a sadder note, 2012/13 also marked one thousand games since we left West Street.

We carried our form into 2013/14 and led the league with eight straight wins, but we couldn't hold on and had to settle for third place, our highest league finish since 1984, but the following September, Lyndon Buckwell departed, and Glyn Mandeville and new Assistant Matt Smith steered the club to seventh place and improved this to fourth in 2015/16.

In the summer of 2016, our club visited France and played a friendly against our twin town Chantilly, which was where the England team had been based before their Euro 2016 campaign. The players were able to meet Roy Hodgson and Gary Neville and performed admirably as ambassadors for our town.

in 2016/17, we started the season with an incredible 9-2 win at newly-promoted Bedfont & despite trailing 2-0 at halftime, and went on to repeat our fourth-place finish in the League. In addition, we reached the League Cup Final but were defeated 4-1 by Westfield at Windsor FC.

Unfortunately, we also lost to Midhurst & Easebourne in the last minute by the same score line in the Division 1 League Cup Final a few days before our playoff clash.

Byatt departed in early May, being replaced by the long-serving Horley Town Manager Anthony Jupp and former Croydon Manager Liam Giles as Joint Managers, but Giles would return to Croydon in November.

We started the season well but gradually fell behind leaders Shoreham. With ten games to go, Juppy resigned, and his assistant, Matt Chapman, took over the reins for the remainder of the season, steering us to the runners-up position. This secured us home advantage against Selsey in the playoff semi-final. After a hard-fought 0–0 draw, we eventually won the game on penalties. Finishing as runners-up also gave us home advantage in the final, where we faced Wick. A 2–1 victory was enough to clinch promotion back to the Combined Counties League after five long years away.

Once again, the club found itself needing to move grounds, this time to groundshare with Cobham FC at The Reg Madgwick Stadium. In June 2023, James Scott was appointed as the new manager for the 2023/24 campaign. However, James departed the club in October 2023 due to personal reasons, and Steve Springett was appointed as interim manager.

After 15 games, Steve agreed to step down and was replaced by Warren Burton and Gwynn Berry, with one goal in mind: to keep the club in the Premier Division. Ultimately, we finished the season in 16th place.

Gwynn left during the close season to pursue other interests, and Warren was appointed as the manager for the 2024–25 season, with the aim of finishing above 12th and away from relegation.

Warren wasted no time in strengthening his backroom staff. First, he brought in Simon Payne as his assistant and then added Max Johnson and finally the vastly experienced Craig Dundas from Sutton United Joint as a player-coach.

The 2024–25 season was indifferent, to say the least. We started poorly, losing our opening five league games. It wasn't until September that we secured our first league win, although we had picked up victories in both FA competitions.









JUST 75 days after Crystal Palace stunned Manchester City to lift the FA Cup at Wembley for the first time in their history, the world's most famous cup competition is back for its latest instalment.

Indeed, it seems almost unfathomable that, in the week the kids break up for their school holidays, the summer is all but over in the world of Non-League football with the 2025-26 campaign already up and running. Where did the time go?

The first name etched in the history books for the new campaign is Sherman Artmeladze. His goal after just two minutes of Soul Tower Hamlets' 5-2 Essex Senior League win at White Ensign last Friday night handed him the accolade as English football's first goalscorer of 2025-26.

It's very rare for The NLP to report on competitive football in the month of July, but it was great to sink our teeth into a bit of league action last Saturday with no fewer than ten Step 5 and 6 leagues kicking off and getting valuable minutes in the tank ahead of this week's potentially lucrative FA Cup opener.

Western League side Ivybridge Town, Westside, of Combined Counties League Division One, and Eastern Counties Leaguers Fakenham Town hit the ground running with seven-day openers, but star of the show was veteran former Notts County striker Craig Westcarr, who hit four goals in Sherwood Colliery's 5-1 opening-day victory at Gresley Rovers in United Counties League Premier North – still banging them in at the age of 40.

So, the perfect pre-cursor then to the big FA Cup curtain-raiser on Friday night with seven matches to whet the appetite for the weekend.

And it's one of those matches which throws up one of those quirky tales from which the FA Cup never fails to disappoint.

When NPL West side Bootle take on Midland Leaguers 1874 Northwich in a big battle of the north-west, it will prove to be a proud day for the Woolley family.

Bootle's attacking midfielder Joe Woolley is a player who loves to dribble and take on his man, but the chances are the man wearing 1874 Northwich colours trying to stop him making forward progress will be his older brother Matt. And that's not it, as Matt will be able to count on back-up in the form of middle sibling Jack, who completed a transfer from neighbours Winsford United to 1874 this summer. "I've mentioned to people at work that I'm playing in the FA Cup, and they loved it when I told them I'd be up against two of my brothers – it's an added reason for them to come and watch," Joe told The NLP.

And Matt added: "It's always weird when you come up against your close friends in a game, maybe more so if it's your brother because it's so rare.

"I don't think I've got the better of him yet either, although I do remember him turning up for Christmas dinner once with a big grin on his face after scoring against us for Kidsgrove the previous Saturday.

"Dad [Stewart] will just want us to play well no matter what the result is," added Matt, 1874's record appearance holder and the only player to have featured every season since the club's formation.

"Nobody would choose to play an FA Cup tie as their first competitive game and we'll probably start as underdogs, but we're hoping to catch Bootle cold and sneak through if we can."

This week, the FA Cup trophy paid a visit to Step 5 new boys Harwich & Parkeston, taking their place in the competition for the first time in six years on the club's 150th anniversary.

The Shrimpers have prestigious history in English football, having reached the FA Amateur Cup final in 1953 where they played at the old Wembley Stadium in front of a reported Non-League record crowd of 100,000 people.

Among those in attendance that day was Harwich club president Terry Francis whom, at the age of 87, was at the club's Royal Oak ground to see the FA Cup in all its glory.

"It's a great honour for the club to get the FA Cup here at the Oak," he told The NLP this week. "It's our 150th anniversary later this year so it ties in wonderfully."

So, another year, and another place in history at stake. Who will be the headline makers this time round? The FA Cup is back.






