From the Bench



We welcome you all to Chalky Lane for the visit of SCR this Tuesday evening. We would like to thank those who made the trips to Guildford and Chipstead over the past week. As always, your support is hugely appreciated and has played a big part in helping us get points on the board. Recently, we have definitely seen an improvement in performances. Although that hasn't quite translated into results against Fleet and Redhill, the progress has come at the right time as we edge ourselves away from the drop zone.



Last Tuesday we travelled to Chipstead and, in tough conditions, came away with a point. On paper, a decent result, although having gone 1–0 up through a Dundo goal — I'm still not entirely sure how it went in or what part of his body he used — we would have hoped for more. Chipstead were then reduced to 10 men and you would expect only one outcome... unless you've seen us against 10 men this season. We conceded a poor goal, but in the grand scheme of things it was still a positive point.

On Saturday we made the trip to Guildford in what was a relegation six-pointer. The first 15 minutes were played in biblical weather, but that didn't stop us playing some really good football against one of the in-form teams of 2026. We created good moments and had Stefan to thank for a crucial clearance off the line. The message at half-time was to continue in the same way, and we came out to take the lead through a fantastic goal from Courtney, adding to his tally. We conceded another poor goal, but the lads showed real courage and determination to push on and win a penalty in the 94th minute. Ali stepped up and secured what could prove to be a vital three points.

There is still work to be done to ensure we are mathematically safe, but this is a big step in the right direction. Unfortunately, Naz — who has been outstanding — is likely to miss the rest of the season with what is believed to be a torn pec.

Our improved performances have coincided with greater consistency in selection, with most of the squad now available. We know tonight will be a tough test, with SCR coming off a fantastic win against Tadley.

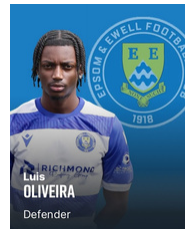

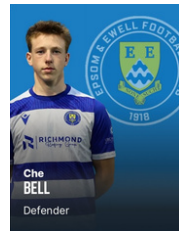

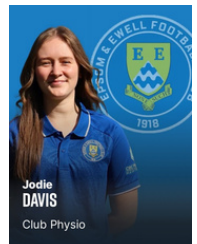

Founded in 1922 as the London & District Combination Football League, and renamed the Combined Counties Football League in 1978, the 2024-25 Cherry Red Combined CCL season will be the 47th in the history of the league. The league consists of four divisions for the second time, with a new Division Two being added to the Premier North, the Premier South and Division One. Division Two is intended largely for reserve and U23 sides, although it is also open to first teams.

Welcome to Sutton Common Rovers



Sutton Common Rovers Football Club was founded in 1978 by Alan Salmon, originally under the name Inrad FC. The club was initially formed as a local side playing in amateur and Sunday football, before gradually establishing itself within more formal league structures. Over time, the club underwent a number of name changes linked to sponsorship arrangements, becoming Centre 21 FC and later competing under variations such as SCR Plough, SCR Grapes and SCR Litten Tree, reflecting partnerships with local businesses.

For many years, Sutton Common Rovers developed steadily at grassroots level, but a more defined progression through the football pyramid began in the mid-2000s. In the 2006–07 season, the club competed in the Surrey South Eastern Combination, finishing third and signalling its ambition to move into higher levels of non-league football. Although an initial application to join the Combined Counties League was unsuccessful, the club continued to push forward.

The following season, 2007–08, proved to be a significant step as the club joined the Middlesex County League Premier Division. A strong campaign saw them finish third, earning promotion to the Combined Counties League, a key milestone in the club's development and entry into the National League System.

In 2008, the club adopted the name Mole Valley SCR, reflecting its geographical base at the time. Progress continued as the club quickly established itself within the Combined Counties structure. After narrowly missing promotion in their first season, Mole Valley SCR achieved success in 2009–10, winning the Combined Counties League Division One title. This triumph secured promotion to the Premier Division and marked the club's first appearance in the FA Cup, an important landmark for any non-league side.

The club faced challenges in adapting to Premier Division football and, following two seasons at that level, were relegated at the end of the 2011–12 campaign. However, Sutton Common Rovers responded impressively. In 2012–13, they mounted a strong promotion push, finishing second after an extended unbeaten run and securing an immediate return to the Premier Division. This resilience became a defining feature of the club's identity.

A further key moment came at the end of the 2014–15 season, when the club re-established its identity within the London Borough of Sutton and adopted its current name, Sutton Common Rovers FC. Around this period, the club also recorded a notable milestone in the FA Cup, achieving its first-ever victory in the competition with a 3–2 win away at Chichester City.

Welcome to Sutton Common Rovers



The following seasons saw continued consolidation and growth. In 2015–16, Sutton Common Rovers enjoyed a strong run in the FA Vase, reaching the Fourth Round Proper and demonstrating their ability to compete at a higher level in national knockout competition. The club's progress was further underlined in 2016–17, when they secured their first major silverware by winning the Southern Combination Challenge Cup, defeating Camberley Town 4–1 in the final.

Momentum continued into the latter part of the decade. The 2017–18 season saw the club finish third in the Combined Counties Premier Division, narrowly missing out on promotion but establishing themselves as one of the stronger sides in the league. This was followed by the club's most successful campaign to date in 2018–19, when Sutton Common Rovers finished second in the league and also lifted the Combined Counties Premier Challenge Cup, adding another trophy to their honours list.

These achievements paved the way for the club's progression to Step 4 football, competing in the Isthmian League. This represented a significant step in the club's journey, reflecting years of steady development and ambition. Sutton Common Rovers continued to compete at this level for several seasons, facing stronger opposition and further raising the club's profile within non-league football.

More recently, the club returned to Step 5 following relegation, rejoining the Combined Counties Premier Division South for the 2025–26 season. Despite this setback, Sutton Common Rovers remain a well-established and respected club within the non-league pyramid, known for their steady progression, resilience, and strong community links.

From humble beginnings as a local amateur side to competing within the National League System, Sutton Common Rovers' history is one of gradual growth, perseverance and continued ambition — qualities that continue to define the club today.

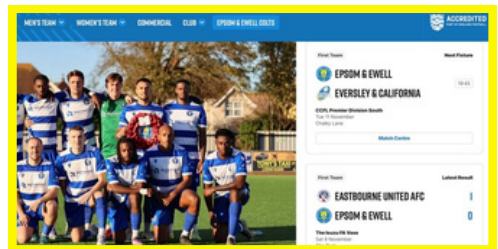

Well, what a weekend for non-league football, with attendances markedly up — particularly if you were lucky enough to be the home side. In our division there were 358 at Tooting and nearly 600 at Fleet Town. It just goes to demonstrate that grassroots football is very much alive and kicking. Now, something slightly controversial — would it not be a good suggestion that the recent multi-million-pound fine, or some of it, imposed on Chelsea could be redistributed to non-league clubs? That kind of funding could make a real difference in helping clubs grow and develop, particularly around their facilities. Just a thought.

Anyway, enough controversy and back to the action from last Saturday, where there were crucial results at both ends of the table. There is no better time to pick up three points than at this stage of the season, and teams involved in promotion and relegation battles will gladly take them however they are earned. Looking at the relegation picture, Guildford City's fate was sealed following their 2–1 home defeat to ourselves. They did, however, put up a valiant fight after a difficult start to the season. It will now be interesting to see which division they end up in.

As for who may join them, that remains very much in the balance. Camberley Town currently sit bottom with three games remaining, including a difficult trip to Tadley Calleva. I do feel for their manager, "Turks", who mentioned they were missing eight regular first-team players for their 0–0 draw against Chipstead last Saturday. Eversley & California also remain in the mix and face a tough run-in, including two fixtures against Redhill, starting at Kiln Brow next weekend. That will be no easy task, particularly with Redhill pushing for a play-off place. However, Redhill themselves have seen disruption following the midweek departure of manager Sam Morgan. From our perspective, we still need points to be mathematically safe, although our goal difference is significantly better than both Camberley and Eversley & California, which could prove important.

At the top end, Tooting & Mitcham have likely secured their play-off place with a strong 3–0 victory over Badshot Lea. They can only realistically be caught by Fleet Town or Tadley Calleva, which looks unlikely. Tadley's 3–0 defeat at Sutton Common Rovers ended their 15-game unbeaten run, but they remain well placed and are expected to finish second, giving them the advantage of home ties in the play-offs. Fleet's match with Abbey Rangers this weekend is a huge one, while Horley Town's 2–1 defeat at Eversley & California, after leading, was another surprise result that adds further intrigue.

Finally, it would be remiss not to mention the one-year anniversary of the passing of Alex McKay, a much-respected and hard-working committee member. A true gentleman, he is sorely missed by everyone at the club.

The Salts were back in action for the fourth time in eight days, with another game looming on Tuesday, as they travelled to Calthorpe Park. The bright start was rewarded on 12 minutes when Courtney Swaby scored from a cross-come-shot that travelled across the box to give the Salts a deserved lead.

Fleet responded quickly. Charlie Postance equalised on 19 minutes, and just three minutes later Savio Shan completed the turnaround, leaving the Salts trailing despite their positive opening.

The second half began in disappointing fashion, with Fleet adding a third goal within a minute of the restart. However, Epsom & Ewell showed strong character and responded almost immediately. From a corner on 48 minutes, a goalmouth scramble saw substitute Zak Shabir head the ball back into the six-yard box, where Stefan Aiwone forced it home to reduce the deficit.

The Salts continued to press for an equaliser and maintained good attacking pressure throughout the half. Their efforts were nearly rewarded at the death, but a clear handball appeal in the Fleet penalty area from the final action of the game went unpunished by the referee, denying them a potential route back into the match.

In heavy rain and strong gusting wind — classic Surrey football weather, Epsom & Ewell will come away from this one knowing it could have been three points. Despite dominating long spells of the match, particularly in the first half, the Salts were unable to turn their superiority into a victory against a Chipstead side that finished with ten men and one barely able to walk after all their subs were used up.

Faebian Witter returned in goal, replacing the ill Kit Fletcher, in what was otherwise a settled team following Saturday's match. It was one of the few occasions this season where there had been minimal changes between games. The Salts started brightly and controlled much of the opening 45 minutes. The best chance of the half fell to Callum O'Keeffe, who found himself in a golden position but fired straight at the goalkeeper when either corner would likely have given Epsom the lead. Despite the pressure and territory, the game remained goalless at the break.

The breakthrough eventually came on 66 minutes when joint manager Craig Dundas bundled the ball home from Courtney Swaby's wind-assisted delivery into the box, giving the Salts a deserved lead. Shortly afterwards, Chipstead were reduced to ten men when substitute Pele Dunn was shown a red card almost immediately after coming on, following a high and late challenge.

With both the advantage and an extra man, the game appeared there to be closed out. However, a series of substitutions disrupted the Salts' rhythm rather than strengthening it with at one stage, four central defenders on the pitch. Chipstead sensed the shift in momentum and, against the run of play, found an equaliser in the 85th minute through Theo Crawford's header from a free kick outside of the box when he was left with too much space especially given his clear physical presence.

Spectator Code of Conduct

All spectators attending home matches are required to read and comply with this Code of Conduct, and to respect the same principles when attending our away fixtures at other clubs. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of this Code of Conduct, the rules and regulations of The Football Association and The Combined Counties League. The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate or necessary at their sole discretion. Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and, in extreme cases, heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

Entering and Leaving the Ground

If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late at night, and do not litter the area. Do not attempt to bring flares, fireworks or any other dangerous items into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and confiscate any prohibited items found. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. Do not attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground, or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

Within the Ground

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Do not obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Do not stand in seating areas or block access gangways or steps. Do not behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and do not bring the Club into disrepute.

The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban: being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving antisocially; threatening behaviour; use of obscene or abusive language; persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures; racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment; fighting; entering the field of play before, during or after the game; throwing any missile or object onto the field of play; and setting off any flare or firework.

Strictly Forbidden

The following are strictly forbidden and may result in immediate eviction and a ban for repeat offenders: the consumption of alcohol in bottles, cans or glasses in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground; climbing onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure; obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes; playing ball games in areas populated by ground visitors; only service animals are permitted at Chalky Lane and must be kept on a leash.
