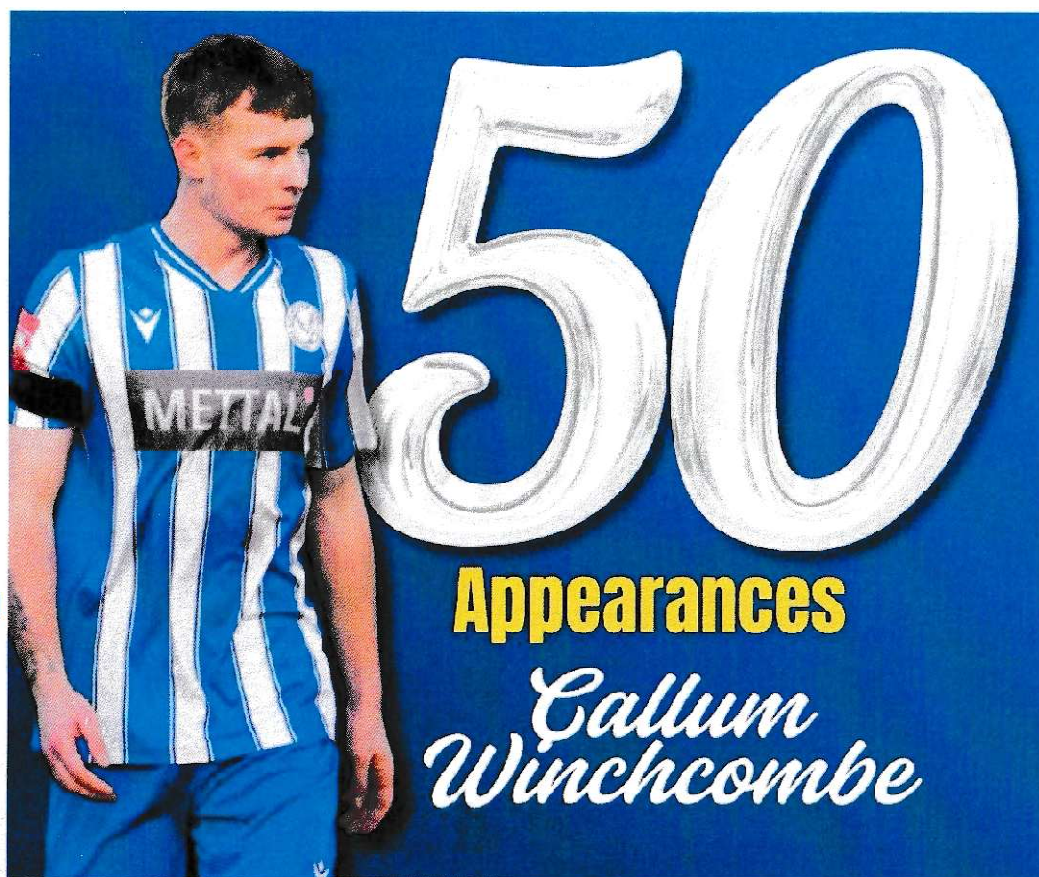
MATCH PREVIEW

- Epsom & Ewell are currently 14th in table with 30 points from 26 games. Thatcham are four points behind having played an extra game, and have a four point cushion above the relegation places.
- The Kingfishers have not played since the end of January due to fixture scheduling, while The Salts managed to play just their second game of 2026 in midweek. They were trailing to Sheerwater but took advantage of the visiting goalkeeper being sent off as Brendan Murphy-McVey and Obasanjo Akinniranye struck, only for Sheerwater to force a 2-2 draw in injury time.
- Back in October, Epsom & Ewell hammered Thatcham 4-0 in their first game as tenants at Chessington & Hook. Alongside Akinniranye, Luke Miller (2) and Ali Fofahan found the net. However, despite coming pretty close on Tuesday night, they have not managed a home win in any of their eight subsequent home league games. On the road though, they have recently won at Balham, Abbey Rangers and Sheerwater.
- Thatcham defeated Camberley 2-0 and Fleet 3-2 last month, but rivals such as Balham and Chipstead have picked up points this month to progress up the table. In midweek Thatcham travel to Redhill while E&E return to Berkshire to face Eversley & California.

CLUB DIARY

DEC 7 - Thatcham Town Football Club were deeply saddened to learn of the passing of Alan Lovegrove, a former Football Secretary and long-serving committee member.

DEC 13 - Town smashed Chipstead 6-0, registering their first win by more than a goal this season. An early red-carded for the Chips's player-coach Peter Wedgeworth handed Town an advantage and the goals started to flow. Mackenzie Creech rolled home the first, Curtis Angell headed in a second, then close-range finishes from Archie Denton and Dan Smith gave Town an unlikely four-goal lead at the break. With the game winding down, Harrison Armitage added a fifth from his first touch in a Thatcham shirt, and Luke Polding rounded off the scoring. The game was preceded by a minute's applause for Alan Lovegrove.

DEC 20 - Thatcham suffered a setback, losing 2-0 to the division's bottom team Guildford City at the Spectrum Stadium. On a heavy pitch the Kingfishers struggled to impose themselves on the game, and fell behind when Alex McLean headed home from a wrongly awarded corner. In the second half Town keeper Maciej Wiczorek conceded a penalty, made amends by stopping the shot, but Kai Zini buried the rebound to seal the win.

DEC 27 - Town's only game over a quiet festive period ended in a 3-1 home defeat to local rivals Tadley Calleva. In a first-half of few chances the visitors were clinical with their opportunities as Brad Neal and Sheldon Wright gave Calleva a commanding lead. Callum Willmoth pulled one back from the spot following a foul on Curtis Angell, but Tadley soon restored their two goal advantage. Giant defender Andy Matthews made his first appearance having returned to the club from Fleet.

JAN 3 - Thatcham's away game at Redhill was called off due to a frozen pitch.

JAN 10 - The home fixture against Horley Town was postponed due to a frozen pitch.

JAN 17 - Cam Philbey's side earned three valuable points away to fellow strugglers Camberley Town. Curtis Angell scored both goals from close range, on 13 and 82 minutes. Thatcham came under relatively little threat with the hosts shooting themselves in the foot when dangerman Shane Qoloni was ordered off for two yellow cards.

CLUB DIARY (CONTINUED)

JAN 20 - The rearranged fixture at Redhill was abandoned on 56 minutes after torrential rain made the surface unplayable. The hosts had opened the scoring just seconds before the referee made the decision to end proceedings.

JAN 24 - Thatcham deservedly picked up the points in a five goal thriller at home to Fleet Town. Kye Williams gave the Kingfishers a first-half lead, then set up Dan Smith for a second early in the second period. However Fleet suddenly clawed themselves back in the game as Sam Bartlett converted two penalty kicks within five minutes. But it was Thatcham who won all three points when Charlie Knight slammed home a 25 yarder.

JAN 26 - The Youth Team defeated Chalfont St Peter 2-0 in their Berks & Bucks County Cup semi-final, and will take their place in the final next month.

JAN 31 - Town began strongly at Sheerwater, taking the lead through Charlie Knight. However Kye Williams was red carded shortly after the interval, and although Thatcham initially coped well with being a man down, The Sheers struck four times in the final 20 minutes to earn what on paper looked to be a convincing 4-1 win.

FEB 14 - Thatcham had no game scheduled for the second successive Saturday. Many teams suffered another postponements as the very wet start to the year continued.

Recent History...

Relegation in 2017/18 was not a great way to celebrate our Centenary! The attempts at bouncing straight back did not start particularly well and manager Neil Grant departed in October. He was replaced by Simon Funnell who took us to the Division One League Cup Final at Meadowbank. Unfortunately, the new season of 2019/20 started poorly and Funnell resigned at Christmas. Sam Morgan and Tim Moffatt then oversaw an undefeated league run that took us up to the abandonment of the season.

The 2020/21 season commenced with another ground move, this time to Leatherhead's Fetcham Grove ground, although another seasonal curtailment left us in Step Six, being transferred to the Southern Combination for the new season. In August 2021, Sam Morgan was relieved of his duties after a slow start to the season.

The 2022/23 season saw a complete change with Anthony Jupp and Liam Giles coming in as joint managers. After they stepped down Matt Chapman then led the Club to the Runners up spot. In the play off semi final we drew 1-1 with Selsey before going through in a nail biting penalty shoot out. In the final in front of almost 400 fans in our last game at Leatherhead F.C. we won 2-1 against Wick. We were promoted back to step five! We were also moved across the Non league Pyramid back into the Combined Counties League.

In 2023/24 the Club started a new ground share agreement with Cobham F.C. on their brand new 3G pitch. The Club appointed James Scott as manager but he left in October when the Club was bottom of the league with no wins. Warren Burton took over as the club's permanent manager in January.

The 2024/25 season saw the Club move again this time to King George's Fields, the home of Corinthian Casuals FC. After a terrible run of defeats towards the end of the season, Burton left the club, with Max Johnson and Craig Dundas taking over as temporary joint managers. They went on a great run lifting us out of the relegation zone and winning a cup when we defeated Abbey Rangers 1-0 nil in the final of The Southern Combination Challenge Cup.

The 25/26 Season saw the Club move back to Cobham FC and the joint managers were appointed full time. In October 2025 the Club moved again to Chessington & Hook United much nearer to Epsom, and hopefully we can build more support at this ground. Meanwhile, the search continues for a new ground back in the Borough.

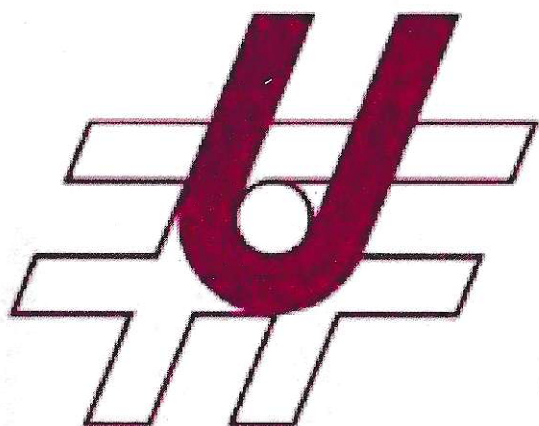
Thatcham Town's Youth Team are currently third in a very competitive Allied Counties North Division, having won 5 of their 8 league games to date.

THE UNTOLD GAME :

The latest in a collection of lesser known stories from the world of football

As conflict in Europe finally came to an end in 1945, the country celebrated. No more threat of bombs, no more difficult letters telling of lost loved ones, and in some small way, life could return to whatever kind of normal can emerge after seven years of total war. That included football which returned with two regional divisions and the FA Cup, and a number of friendlies to warm up supporters for the return of the Football League in 1946. Some such games saw Russian side Dynamo Moscow make the trip to London. Their first game at Stamford Bridge saw supporters crowding in, climbing onto the roof of one of the stands and crashing through. It was a sign of how popular the return of football was, and laid the groundwork for what was to follow.

Arsenal were the second of Dynamo's opponents in Britain, but Highbury had been requisitioned for the war. As such, they played at the home of arch-rivals Tottenham, White Hart Lane. Arsenal's ground wasn't the only thing that had been requisitioned though, with many first team players still in the service as the war with Japan continued, and the rebuilding of Europe began. The Gunners' side ended up as something of an invitational of some of the best players in English football at that time, including Stanley Matthews and Stan Mortensen, who would link up at Blackpool a few years later. For their part, Dynamo were also made up of players borrowed from other Soviet sides.

Anticipation was so high that the crowds outside the ground grew dangerous, and they opened the gates early to prevent a crush. By midday, 40,000 people were in the stadium. By kickoff, estimates were that 54,000 made their way to the game. The atmosphere was at fever pitch as fans were desperate to see Arsenal's XI, against a Russian team who were the first to tour in the UK. The tour was intended to show the close cooperation between the UK and the Soviet Union, but the stark differences between the sides could be felt in the boardroom. Samuel Hill-Wood, the Arsenal chairman (whose family would retain control throughout the century) was a politician and businessman, a model of democratic capitalism. Dynamo, on the other hand, were owned by Felix Dzerzhinsky, the head of the Soviet secret police. The success of the tour was seen as crucial.

About 30 minutes before kick off, a thick fog descended on North London. The definition of pea souper. This was in the era before London's air was cleaned up, when the fog mingled with the industrial smoke of the city and turned it a vague yellow. It was so thick that the players could barely see the pitch.



THE MOST EXCITING GAME PEOPLE NEVER SAW'

The teams wanted it called off, but the decision was made higher up that it would go ahead. And so the match kicked off with fans barely able to make out shadows in the mist. 54,000 fans in White Hart Lane saw almost nothing of the game they had been salivating over.

Dynamo took a first minute lead, but that was about the high point. Arsenal goalkeeper Wyn Hughes started getting rough treatment from the Dynamo forwards, taking a few hits to the head. But the worst came when he ran into the goalpost, unable to see them. He was so concussed he didn't know the score. Fortunately, QPR goalkeeper Harry Brown was in the stands, and hopped down to fill in. Arsenal came back into the game, but the fog made it impossible as the match grew more physical. The home side scored three goals but were denied a penalty. George Drury got sent off, but just slipped into the fog and continued playing, the referee unable to tell in the difficult decisions. Dynamo made a number of substitutions, but nobody was entirely sure that anyone came off the pitch. At some stage, they seem to have had 15 players on the pitch, from what little anyone could make out.

The added numbers paid off. Dynamo scored, and then equalised despite Vsevolod Bobrov being a long way offside. The officials simply couldn't tell. When Ronnie Rooke took the ball up the line, he was stopped by what was described as a rugby tackle by the Dynamo captain Semichastney. Rooke gave him a black eye in the scuffle that followed. Arsenal manager George Allison requested once more that the game be stopped, but the Dynamo officials insisted it be finished. The Russians scored once more, and it finished 4-3.

As a football match, it was a failure. What little football was on show between the fighting couldn't be seen by the crowd, who were desperate for some excitement. As a diplomatic exercise, it was ultimately futile too. International relations rely on a lot more than sport, but only a few months later Churchill gave a speech declaring that an 'Iron Curtain' had been drawn across Europe, ending the post-war friendliness between east and west and naming the beginning of the Cold War. It would last for half a century, and the football in the fog would be little more than a half-remembered footnote.

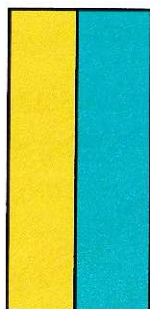
