From the Archives



Our first look back into the archives, takes us to the 1980-81 season.

On Tuesday 11th November 1980, we had a home evening match at West Street against the Metropolitan Police, then a serving police officer only team.

Going into the game in the Berger Isthmian League Division 1, the table was led by Bishop's Stortford with The Salts in 5th place. The Police team started the match down in 14th. The match itself looks like it was a thriller, ending 3-2 to the home side.

The league that season ended up being a two-horse race. Bishop's Stortford continued their early season form and won the title, with Billericay Town runners-up, with both going up to the Premier Division. Epsom & Ewell fell just short of the promotion places in 3rd. Metropolitan Police landed mid-table in 9th.

The drop zone was busy: Finchley (22nd) and Camberley Town (21st) went down to Division Two. Tilbury (20th) and Ware (19th) hovered just above, with Tilbury carrying a 3-point deduction.

In the wider league that season, Slough Town won the Premier Division, while structural movement at the top later saw Dagenham (no Redbridge yet in those days) and Enfield accepted into the Alliance Premier League - illustrating how fluid the non-league pyramid was before automatic promotion was formalised.

Welcome to Thatcham Town



Through the late 1970s and early 1980s, the club navigated challenges in the Hellenic structure, and then in 1981 sought a change by entering the Athenian League. The Athenian League later disbanded, pushing Thatcham into the London Spartan (or London Spartan) League for a period.

Move to Wessex League, Lancaster Close Upgrades & Transition

In 1986, Thatcham Town joined the newly formed Wessex League, continuing their rise through non-league tiers. The 1990s proved productive: under manager Jim Greenwood, the club set a then record of 33 league games unbeaten, and in 1995–96 clinched the Wessex League title by a narrow margin (pipping AFC Lymington) after a decisive final match 2–0 victory at Waterside. That title remains a high point in the club's competitive history.

During this era, the club also erected floodlights at Lancaster Close in January 1983, celebrated with a friendly against Fulham. Still, ground limitations and ambition pushed the club to seek a new home. Waterside Park Era

The club's major relocation came in the 1992–93 season, when they moved to Waterside Park, Crookham Hill, Thatcham. Over time, Waterside Park would adopt sponsorship naming: from The Stacatruc Stadium (from August 2019) to more recently The Methal Stadium at Waterside Park (since August 2023).

The new ground provided stability and room for further development of infrastructure and community facilities.

Climbing the Ladder and Cup Highlights

After success in the Wessex League, finishing as runners-up in 1998–99 and again in 2005–06, Thatcham leveraged ground grading to secure promotion to the Southern League Division One South & West in 2006. They remained in that southern division (or in variations like Division One Central) for eight seasons, with their best finish being 5th place in 2010–11 at Level 8 of the pyramid.

In cup competitions, Thatcham have had several notable runs. Their best FA Cup showing came in 1996–97, reaching the 4th Qualifying Round (after wins over Brockenhurst, Bemerton Heath Harlequins, Gloucester City and Bashley) before losing to Borehamwood. In the FA Trophy, they've reached the 2nd Qualifying Round (2008–09) as their best run.

However, the crowning moment came in 2018, when Thatcham lifted the FA Vase at Wembley. In the final on 20 May, they beat Stockton Town 1–0 via a first-half penalty by Shane Cooper-Clark — his 62nd goal of a prolific season. That season, they also won the Hellenic League Premier Division (on goal difference) and went on an unbeaten run of 40 matches in all competitions. The double of promotion plus national cup glory remains a peak.

After 2018, Thatcham re-entered the Southern League but later navigated structural changes. In 2021–22 they competed in the Isthmian League system. More recently, in the 2025–26 season, the club has been placed in the Combined Counties League Premier Division South, following a relegation from the Southern League. In the 2024–25 campaign, Thatcham were relegated after losing 1–0 at Didcot Town and finishing four points from safety — though they closed the season with a 2–0 win over Tavistock.


Identity, Community & Club Values

Through its long existence, Thatcham Town has prided itself on being deeply embedded in its community. The club frequently invests in youth development, local outreach, and facility improvements (for instance, plans to install an all-weather pitch at Waterside Park to boost year-round participation). Even when league levels have risen or fallen, the club has sought sustainable management, resisting overextension.

One to Watch



Callum Willmoth - Thatcham Town FC



A central midfielder with over 200 appearances across multiple spells at Waterside Park, Callum Willmoth brings a rare blend of experience, bite and composure that sets the tone for Thatcham's performances. The club's own profile notes his longstanding influence and leadership; recent posts have also celebrated him as a "Thatcham legend" and skipper—a nod to how deeply he's woven into the club's modern identity. On the pitch, Willmoth operates as the organiser-in-chief. Out of possession he screens diligently, reads passing lanes and snaps into tackles; in possession he keeps Thatcham ticking, receiving under pressure and playing forward early when transitions open. For a young squad bedding in at Step 5, his temperament is invaluable: he calms frantic passages, cajoles teammates into compactness, and isn't shy about demanding higher standards. That presence was visible during strong early-season spells and in numerous local match reports over recent seasons.

Technically, Willmoth's game is built on first touch and range. From the base of midfield, he'll drop between centre-backs to help play out, hit switches to release wide runners, or thread penetrative passes to the front line. He's also a threat at dead balls—corners and diagonals are usually delivered with pace and accuracy—and he times late bursts to the edge of the box to good effect. Even as younger legs buzz around him, his numbers continue to matter: independent stat trackers listing Thatcham's goalscorers have repeatedly had his name among contributors, underlining end product alongside control.

Intangibles round out the package. Willmoth's familiarity with the club's expectations (and the ground's dimensions) gives Thatcham tactical shortcuts—when to squeeze, when to sit, which channels to funnel opponents into. Younger midfielders and full-backs naturally gravitate to him for reference points during games. As a result, even on days when he isn't the headline act, he's usually the metronome everyone else plays to.

In short: if you're visiting Waterside Park, track the armband. Watch how Willmoth finds pockets to receive, checks his shoulders, angles his body to play forward, and snaps play back under control after transitions. It's the kind of performance that rarely trends on social media but almost always correlates with Thatcham looking like Thatcham. And that's exactly what you want from the Kingfishers' on-field compass.

Match report v Farnham Town

The Salts knew they faced a tough Surrey Senior Cup test at home to Farnham Town, and so it proved, suffering their heaviest defeat since the start of last season with a 1–5 loss to the side sitting third in the Non-League Premier Southern South. In front of 122 spectators, the only consolation was winning the second half 1–0, after trailing 0–5 at the break.



The game was effectively over before half time, with Farnham scoring three times in a ruthless seven-minute spell. Max Johnson was forced into several changes from Friday's win over Chipstead due to injuries and suspensions. Damien Cech returned in goal, Ayran Kugathas made his first start, Callum Wilson replaced Antonios Nazareth as captain, and Luke Miller came into midfield.

Farnham showed their quality from the start, dominating possession and territory. No.10 Liddle dictated play and, after 18 minutes, pounced on a loose ball to slot home. Epsom & Ewell's first half-chance came on 30 minutes when Emmanuel Limpo's cross won a corner, but Farnham immediately broke and Liddle finished another slick move to double the lead.

Cech produced an excellent save from Dean soon after, but Farnham's pressure was relentless. Evans had a goal ruled out for offside before finally tapping home on 40 minutes. Jackson made it four two minutes later, finishing after Cech's heroic stop, and Dean's powerful strike made it five before half time. Epsom's best chance of the half saw Miller volley over after a fine ball from Brendan Murphy-McVey.

Farnham continued to dominate after the restart, but Cech remained alert, saving well from Eagles. Epsom introduced Ryley Merrit, Obasanjo Akinniranye and Teddy Ralph on the hour, and began to find more joy going forward. On 74 minutes, their efforts were rewarded when Oba fed Ali Fofahan, who finished neatly to reduce the deficit.

The hosts grew in confidence and created more chances. Kionte and Merrit both went close, but Farnham's defence held firm. Despite continued pressure, Epsom couldn't add to their tally.

The game ended 1–5, a deserved win for Farnham, whose one-touch football and movement were superb throughout. Despite the heavy defeat, The Salts battled well, particularly in the second half, given the number of absentees.

Captain Adam Green and Luis Oliveira returned from suspension, but injuries again left the squad stretched. Playing into a fierce wind, The Salts started brightly with Luke Miller firing over on nine minutes. Yet five minutes later they trailed, as a missed tackle on the left allowed Tadley to deliver a pinpoint cross and a simple finish.

Parity was restored seven minutes later. Ali Fofahan released Miller on the right, and his cross found debutant Obasanjo Akinnirayne, who was hauled down for a penalty. Brendan Murphy McVey's cross was headed back across goal by Jason Brown, and Green's diving header looked destined for the net until a Tadley defender handled it on the line. He was sent off, but Green's second penalty was superbly saved. Keeper Faebian Witter was booked for a reckless clearance, and Toby Young headed over on the stroke of half-time, with Tadley's 10 men facing a tough second half.

As the wind dropped, the game grew ill-tempered. Three quick yellow cards for Tadley — including one for dissent, which reduced them to nine men for ten minutes — saw the referee lose control. Still, the hosts looked dangerous and their keeper produced a fine double save on 66 minutes to deny Luis and Ali.

More bookings followed for time-wasting and over-aggression, with The Salts chasing an equaliser when they should have been pushing for a winner. Only two substitutes were used as the visitors struggled to turn pressure into chances.

Late on, with players committed forward, Tadley almost sealed the game when a substitute missed unmarked in the box. Two further chances followed, the latter brilliantly saved by Witter. In stoppage time, three more bookings were issued — including Akinnirayne for a needless foul and Dundo, off the bench, for a late lunge.

Ultimately, The Salts will rue missed chances, a saved penalty, and failure to make their numerical advantage count.



Ground Regulations 2025-26



Spectator Code of Conduct

All spectators attending home matches are required to read and comply with this Code of Conduct, and to respect the same principles when attending our away fixtures at other clubs. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of this Code of Conduct, the rules and regulations of The Football Association and The Combined Counties League. The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate or necessary at their sole discretion. Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and, in extreme cases, heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

Entering and Leaving the Ground

If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately, do not block in others, and in particular do not block our neighbours' access to their houses. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late at night, and do not litter the area. Do not attempt to bring flares, fireworks or any other dangerous items into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and confiscate any prohibited items found. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. Do not attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground, or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

Within the Ground

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Do not obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Do not stand in seating areas or block access gangways or steps. Do not behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and do not bring the Club into disrepute.

The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban: being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving antisocially; threatening behaviour; use of obscene or abusive language; persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures; racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment; fighting; entering the field of play before, during or after the game; throwing any missile or object onto the field of play; and setting off any flare or firework.

Strictly Forbidden

The following are strictly forbidden and may result in immediate eviction and a ban for repeat offenders: the consumption of alcohol in bottles, cans or glasses in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground; climbing onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure; obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes; playing ball games in areas populated by ground visitors; allowing any animal to roam off the leash within the ground confines; and parking any vehicle that blocks emergency vehicle access.

The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of the offence and solely at the discretion of the Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through the Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
